TENDERS INVITED.

RIGHT TO OPEN TODDY SHOPS IN KUALA LUMPUR DISTRICT.

Tenders will be received at the Chinese Secretariat, Kuala Lumpur, up to 10 o'clock in the forenoon on the 1st July, 1914, for the right, subject to the limitations of "The Excise Enactments Amendment Enactment, 1912," to open a toddy shop for the sale of toddy for consumption on the premises only in each of the localities described below for the period from the 15th July, 1914, to the 15th October, 1914, both inclusive.

2. One licence only will be issued in each of the following localities :

Fourth mile, Ampang Road;

Bukit Bintang Road.

3. Tenders must be sent in sealed envelopes, marked on the outside "Toddy Shop Tender," and each tender must be accompanied by a bank deposit receipt for \$100 in favour of the Government of Selangor. In the event of an accepted tenderer failing within ten days of acceptance of his tender to sign his contract, such deposit will be forfeited to the State. The deposits of unsuccessful tenderers will be returned.

4. Each tender must state the monthly amount the tenderer is prepared to offer for the right to the licence, and must specify the premises in respect of which the licence is desired.

The licensee must sell toddy by retail at a price not exceeding eight cents per 5. reputed quart, and must make his own arrangements with the owners of coconut trees from which the toddy is drawn and with any landholder on whose land the house, shop or other place approved by the Resident for a toddy shop may be situated.

6. The successful tenderer will be required to deposit with the State Treasurer, Kuala Lumpur, cash equal to twice the amount tendered per month for the right.

The monthly rent offered for the licence must be paid monthly to the State Treasurer, Kuala Lumpur, on the first of each month, beginning on the 1st August and ending on the 1st October, 1914. 7.

8. The fee imposed by Rule of \$1.50 for every month or part of a month in respect of the licence must be paid in advance to the Chairman, Inland Districts Licensing Board (Protector of Chinese).

10. The Government does not bind itself to accept the highest or any tender.
