UNDER the powers vested in him by section 14 of the “Land Enactment, 1897,” the Resident, with the approval of the Resident-General, hereby notifies that rule 27 of the “Land Rules, 1899,” published as a supplement to the Negri Sembilan *Gazette* of the 14th April, 1899, has been amended by the addition of the words “Subject to any special instructions by the Resident, given with the sanction of the Resident-General,” before the words “The rents and fees chargeable under the Enactment shall be as follows:—”

UNDER the power conferred by section 14 of the “Land Enactment, 1897,” the Resident, with the approval of the Resident-General, hereby rescinds the rule relating to survey fees, published in the *Gazette* of 2nd August, 1901, Notification No. 202, in so far as the same relates to mining lands.

STATE OF NEGRI SEMBILAN.

“MINING ENACTMENT, 1899.”

Rule under section 113 (i.) of the above-mentioned Enactment, made by the Resident, with the approval of the Resident-General, on the 30th day of December, 1902, and published in the *Gazette*, on the 2nd day of January, 1903.

Subject to any special instructions by the Resident, given with the sanction of the Resident-General in exceptional cases, the quit-rent payable under section 12 (i.) of the above Enactment shall, until further notice, be at the rate of \$1 per acre or part of an acre, and shall be payable in advance without demand on the 1st day of January in each year at the Land Office of the district in which the land is situated.

Rent on land alienated within the current year shall be payable at the above rate, in advance, on the day of alienation if alienated on or prior to the 30th day of September.

If alienated subsequent to the 30th day of September, rent shall be payable at the rate of 50 cents per acre for the current year.

No. 10.—RESERVATION OF LAND FOR A PUBLIC PURPOSE.—In exercise of the powers vested in him by section 6 of the “Land Enactment, 1897,” the Resident directs that all the land contained in lots Nos. 72 and 71 in the mukim of Si Rusa, and more particularly described in the schedules below, shall be reserved for a public purpose—that is, for Government Forest Reserves.

The reserves shall be called the “Tanjong Tanah Merah Forest Reserve” and the “Teluk Kemang Forest Reserve,” respectively.

The eighth meeting was held on 2nd December, 1902.

PRESENT: The Acting District Officer (Chairman), Mr. R. Engler, the Apothecary, the Chief Overseer and Raja Kadir.

ABSENT: The Harbour Master, Mr. J. McClymont, Mr. Q. McClymont, Sheikh Abdulrahman and Mr. Low Kong Yew.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and confirmed.

The Chairman informed the Board that he had submitted, for the consideration of Government, the resolution of the Board with regard to licensing every person carrying on the trade of a farrier. He read the reply received from the Government, and after some discussion the matter was allowed to drop.

A plan showing certain additions to a shop-house in course of erection by Muttiah Chetty was considered and approved by the Board.

The Chairman read the notice calling for tenders for services for 1903. Tenders to be sent in by 10th December, 1902.

The meeting then adjourned.

The ninth meeting was held on 16th December, 1902.

PRESENT: The Acting District Officer (Chairman), the Acting Harbour Master, Mr. Q. McClymont, Sheikh Abdulrahman, Mr. Low Kong Yew, the Apothecary and Raja Kadir.

ABSENT: Mr. J. McClymont, Mr. R. Engler and the Chief Overseer.

The Chairman explained to the Board that at the previous meeting, held on 2nd December, the question of certain additions to a house to be built by Muttiah Chetty was discussed, and a plan put in by Muttiah Chetty duly approved.

The Chairman next brought before the Board the tenders for services for 1903. For the sole right to sell pork in the market 15 tenders were put in, and after some discussion five names were selected. The Chairman was authorised to make further enquiries and decide on the most suitable man to hold the contract.

The Chairman informed the Board that three tenders had been put in for lighting town lamps, and, on the proposal of the Chairman seconded by Mr. Q. McClymont, that of Haji Said, the present contractor, was accepted. The rate tendered was \$2 a lamp a month.

The only tender for scavenging put in was not considered worth accepting.

The meeting then adjourned.
