## SPECIFICATION.

Length moulded, 72 ft. Depth, 7 ft.  
Beam moulded, 13 ft., 6 ins. Mean draught, 5 ft. 9 ins.  
Keel and Keelson of ballow wood in long lengths.  
Frames of ballow, spaced apart.  
Side stringers of ballow, in long lengths, two on each side.  
Stern and Rudder Posts of ballow, to be connected together and to keel with brass plates.  
Rudder of ballow, gudgeons and pintles of cast brass.  
Stem of ballow.  
Frames, Beams and Ceiling of ballow.  
Planking of best teak planks to be fastened to beams with galvanised spikes, each streak to have several through clinching bolts near butts.  
Decks of teak planks to be fastened to beams with galvanised spikes.  
Sheathing of 16-oz. Muntz metal over a layer of felt and tar and fastened with composition nails.  
Engines, compound surface condensing.  
Boiler, cylindrical, multitubular, of steel, equal to a pressure of 120 lbs. to the square inch. Speed, 10 knots an hour.  
Bunkers, one on each side of boiler.  
Engine-room Skylight of teak with brass mountings.  
Cabin of sunk type, forward of boiler and tank. Size about 10 ft. in length, fitted with teak bunks, 2 patent lavatories, sideboard, etc. Bunks to be fitted with cushions.  
Crew space abaft of engine room.  
Bulkheads of chengi wood 2" thick from beams to bottom, three in number—one abaft chain locker, one at fore end of boiler, and one abaft engine room.  
Deck Fittings, such as Bollards, etc., of cast iron and well bolted to deck.  
Companions of teak with windows made to open.  
Steering Gear and Compass, to be fitted on deck, before or abaft the cabin as may hereafter be decided.  
Tanks, one large tank before the boiler to be fitted with filling tube and hand pump on deck.  
Hand Windlass, fitted forward with double removable handles (not a worm capstan).  
Awnings, Stanchions and Ridges: awnings to be of best quality canvas and fitted with screens, stanchions of wrought iron, ridges of teak.  
Bulwarks and Posts, of teak planks secured to teak posts.  
Anchors and Chains, two bowers and one stream; 45 fathoms of  $\frac{9}{16}$  chain to the two bowers and 30 fathoms to the stream.  
Chain Locker and Store-room to be fitted in fore part of ship.  
Wing Houses, of teak, fitted aft on either side, one to contain European w.c. and bathroom and the other galleys.  
Meat Safe, to be fitted where most convenient.  
Native w.c., to be fitted with canvas screen and hung over the side where most convenient.  
Boat, one teak boat to be slung to davits over the stern.  
Anchor Davit to be fitted forward.

Lamps, Flags, etc. : side lamps, mast head and anchor lamps, 2 cabin lamps, 3 engine-room lamps, 1 tombowling lamp, 1 ruby lamp, 3 life belts, 3 life buoys, a non-reply telegraph and a 3" mooring rope, to be supplied.

Draught marks in 4" brass letters.

Ventilation, two galvanised iron ventilators placed over stoke hold also iron grating.

## ORDINANCE NO. XXXV. OF 1902.

## AN ORDINANCE FURTHER TO AMEND THE PENAL CODE.

F. A. SWETTENHAM,

[28th November, 1902.]

*Governor and Commander-in-Chief.*

It is hereby enacted by the Governor of the Straits Settlements with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof as follows:—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as “The Penal Code Amendment Ordinance No. II 1902”. It shall be read and construed as one with the Penal Code and any copy of the Penal Code printed after the commencement of the Ordinance may be printed with the amendments alterations and omissions made and required by this Ordinance.

Short title.

2. Section 356 of the Penal Code as amended by “The Penal Code Amendment Ordinance 1902” is further amended by omitting the words “or with all” after the words “or with whipping.”

3. Section 392 of the Penal Code as amended by “The Penal Code Amendment Ordinance 1902” is further amended by omitting the words “and to whipping” after the words “liable to fine” and by inserting after the words “sunset and sunrise” the words “he shall also be liable to whipping and.”
