No. 3466.—The following Circular despatch from the Right Honourable the Secretary of State for the Colonies is published for general information :

CIRCULAR.

DOWNING STREET,

25th September, 1916.

SIR,—You are aware that His Majesty's Government have under consideration the commercial and industrial policy to be adopted after the War, and the measures to be taken to avoid any recurrence of the dangers to which the Empire has been exposed by the growth of German trade and influence within it.

2. The measures to be taken during the period of reconstruction and afterwards have recently been discussed by the Allied Governments, and I invite your attention to the "Recommendations of the Economic Conference of the Allies," of which you have already received a copy. A further copy is enclosed herewith for convenience of reference.

3. A Committee has been appointed to consider the commercial and industrial policy of the United Kingdom after the War, with special reference to the conclusions of the Conference. I enclose a copy of the terms of reference and a list of the members.

4. This Committee will consider the questions before them primarily from the point of view of the United Kingdom, and, as stated by the Prime Minister in the House of Commons on the 24th July last, its appointment is a step preliminary to the convening of a Conference representative of the United Kingdom, the Dominions, and India. At such Conference it will devolve on the Secretary of State for the Colonies to secure consideration of any special circumstances affecting the interests of any particular Colony or Protectorate. I should therefore be glad to receive from you a considered statement of the views of your Government on the Recommendations of the Conference and on the questions submitted to the Committee, so far as the circumstances of the Colony or Protectorate under your Government appear to you to call for special attention in connexion with them.

5. You will no doubt wish to consult representative persons and bodies before replying to this despatch, which you are at liberty to make public.

RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE ECONOMIC CONFERENCE OF  
THE ALLIES HELD AT PARIS ON JUNE 14, 15, 16  
AND 17, 1916.

TRANSLATION.

I.

The representatives of the Allied Governments have met at Paris under the presidency of M. Clémentel, Minister of Commerce, on June 14, 15, 16 and 17, 1916, for the purpose of fulfilling the mandate given to them by the Paris Conference of March 28, 1916, of giving practical expression to their solidarity of views and interests, and of proposing to their respective Governments the appropriate measures for realising this solidarity.

II.

They declare that after forcing upon them the military contest in spite of all their efforts to avoid the conflict, the Empires of Central Europe are to-day preparing, in concert with their Allies, for a contest on the economic plane, which will not only survive the re-establishment of peace, but will at that moment attain its full scope and intensity.

III.

They cannot therefore conceal from themselves that the agreements which are being prepared for this purpose between their enemies have the obvious object of establishing the domination of the latter over the production and the markets of the whole world and of imposing on other countries an intolerable yoke.

In face of so grave a peril the Representatives of the Allied Governments consider that it has become their duty, on grounds of necessary and legitimate defence, to adopt and realise from now onward all the measures requisite on the one hand to secure for themselves and for the whole of the markets of neutral countries full economic independence and respect for sound commercial practice, and on the other hand to facilitate the organisation on a permanent basis of their economic alliance.

For this purpose the Representatives of the Allied Governments have decided to submit for the approval of those Governments the following resolutions :

A.

MEASURES FOR THE WAR PERIOD.

I.

The laws and regulations prohibiting trading with the enemy shall be brought into accord.

For this purpose :

A.—The Allies will prohibit their own subjects and citizens and all persons residing in their territories from carrying on any trade with :

1. The inhabitants of enemy countries whatever their nationality.
2. Enemy subjects wherever resident.
3. Persons, firms and companies whose business is controlled wholly or partially by enemy subjects or is subject to enemy influence and whose names are included in a special list.



B.—They will prohibit the importation into their territories of all goods originating in or coming from enemy countries.

C.—They will devise means of establishing a system enabling contracts entered into with enemy subjects and injurious to national interests to be cancelled unconditionally.

## II.

Business undertakings owned or operated by enemy subjects in the territories of the Allies will all be sequestered or placed under control; measures will be taken for the purpose of winding up some of these undertakings and of realising their assets, the proceeds of such realisation remaining sequestered or under control.

## III.

In addition to the export prohibitions which are necessitated by the internal situation of each of the Allied countries, the Allies will complete the measures already taken for the restriction of enemy supplies, both in the mother countries and in the Dominions, Colonies and Protectorates:

1. By unifying the lists of contraband and of export prohibition, and particularly by prohibiting the export of all commodities declared absolute or conditional contraband;
2. By making the grant of licences for export to neutral countries from which export to enemy territories might take place conditional upon the existence in such countries of control organisations approved by the Allies; or, in the absence of such organisations, upon special guarantees such as the limitation of the quantities exported, supervision by Allied consular officers, etc.

## B.

### TRANSITORY MEASURES FOR THE PERIOD OF COMMERCIAL, INDUSTRIAL, AGRICULTURAL AND MARITIME RECONSTRUCTION OF THE ALLIED COUNTRIES.

## I.

The Allies declare their common determination to ensure the re-establishment of the countries suffering from acts of destruction, spoliation and unjust requisition, and decide to join in devising means to secure the restoration to those countries, as a prior claim, of their raw materials, industrial and agricultural plant, stock and mercantile fleet, or to assist them to re-equip themselves in these respects.

## II.

Whereas the War has put an end to all the treaties of commerce between the Allies and the Enemy Powers, and whereas it is of essential importance that, during the period of economic reconstruction which will follow the cessation of hostilities, the liberty of none of the Allies should be hampered by any claim put forward by the Enemy Powers to most-favoured-nation treatment, the Allies agree that the benefit of this treatment shall not be granted to those Powers during a number of years to be fixed by mutual agreement among themselves.

During this number of years the Allies undertake to assure to each other so far as possible compensatory outlets for trade in case consequences detrimental to their commerce result from the application of the undertaking referred to in the preceding paragraph.



## III.

The Allies declare themselves agreed to conserve for the Allied countries, before all others, their natural resources during the whole period of commercial, industrial, agricultural and maritime reconstruction, and for this purpose they undertake to establish special arrangements to facilitate the interchange of these resources.

## IV.

In order to defend their commerce, their industry, their agriculture and their navigation against economic aggression resulting from dumping or any other mode of unfair competition the Allies decide to fix by agreement a period of time during which the commerce of the enemy powers shall be submitted to special treatment and the goods originating in their countries shall be subjected either to prohibitions or to a special régime of an effective character.

The Allies will determine by agreement through diplomatic channels the special conditions to be imposed during the above-mentioned period on the ships of the enemy powers.

## V.

The Allies will devise the measures to be taken jointly or severally for preventing enemy subjects from exercising, in their territories, certain industries or professions which concern national defence or economic independence.

## C.

PERMANENT MEASURES OF MUTUAL ASSISTANCE AND COLLABORATION  
AMONG THE ALLIES.

## I.

The Allies decide to take the necessary steps without delay to render themselves independent of the enemy countries in so far as regards the raw materials and manufactured articles essential to the normal development of their economic activities.

These steps should be directed to assuring the independence of the Allies not only so far as concerns their sources of supply, but also as regards their financial, commercial and maritime organisation.

The Allies will adopt the methods which seem to them most suitable for the carrying out of this resolution, according to the nature of the commodities and having regard to the principles which govern their economic policy.

They may, for example, have recourse either to enterprises subsidised, directed or controlled by the Governments themselves, or to the grant of financial assistance for the encouragement of scientific and technical research and the development of national industries and resources; to customs duties or prohibitions of a temporary or permanent character; or to a combination of these different methods.

Whatever may be the methods adopted, the object aimed at by the Allies is to increase production within their territories as a whole to a sufficient extent to enable them to maintain and develop their economic position and independence in relation to enemy countries.

## II.

In order to permit the interchange of their products, the Allies undertake to adopt measures for facilitating their mutual trade relations both by the establishment of direct and rapid land and sea transport services at low rates, and by the extension and improvement of postal, telegraphic and other communications.



## III.

The Allies undertake to convene a meeting of technical delegates to draw up measures for the assimilation, so far as may be possible, of their laws governing patents, indications of origin and trade marks.

In regard to patents, trade marks and literary and artistic copyright which have come into existence during the war in enemy countries, the Allies will adopt, so far as possible, an identical procedure, to be applied as soon as hostilities cease.

This procedure will be elaborated by the technical delegates of the Allies.

## D.

Whereas for the purposes of their common defence against the enemy the Allied Powers have agreed to adopt a common economic policy, on the lines laid down in the Resolutions which have been passed, and whereas it is recognised that the effectiveness of this policy depends absolutely upon these Resolutions being put into operation forthwith, the Representatives of the Allied Governments undertake to recommend their respective Governments to take without delay all the measures, whether temporary or permanent, requisite for giving full and complete effect to this policy forthwith, and to communicate to each other the decisions arrived at to attain that object.

## COMMERCIAL AND INDUSTRIAL POLICY COMMITTEE.

The Prime Minister has appointed a Committee "to consider the commercial and industrial policy to be adopted after the War, with special reference to the conclusions reached at the Economic Conference of the Allies, and to the following questions:

- (a) What industries are essential to the future safety of the nation; and what steps should be taken to maintain or establish them.
- (b) What steps should be taken to recover home and foreign trade lost during the War, and to secure new markets.
- (c) To what extent and by what means the resources of the Empire should, and can, be developed.
- (d) To what extent and by what means the sources of supply within the Empire can be prevented from falling under foreign control."

**No. 3467.**—The following Treaty of Commerce and Navigation between the United Kingdom and Honduras is published for general information :

Notice of adhesion having been duly given the Treaty is under Article XXII applicable to the Federated Malay States as from the 11th May, 1916 :

*Signed at Guatemala, May 5, 1910.*

*[Ratifications exchanged at Guatemala, June 21, 1915.]*

HIS MAJESTY THE KING of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and of the British Dominions beyond the Seas, Emperor of India, and His Excellency the President of the Republic of Honduras, being desirous of further facilitating and extending the commercial relations already existing between their respective countries, have determined to conclude a Treaty of Commerce and Navigation with this object, and have appointed as their Plenipotentiaries, that is to say :

HIS MAJESTY THE KING of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, LIONEL EDWARD GRESLEY CARDEN, Esquire, His Majesty's Minister Resident and Consul-General in Central America ; and

His Excellency the President of the Republic of Honduras, Doctor MANUEL FRANCISCO BARAHONA, Honduran Charge d'Affaires, in Guatemala ;

Who, after having communicated to each other their respective full powers, found in good and due form, have agreed upon the following Articles :

ARTICLE I.

There shall be between the territories of the two Contracting Parties reciprocal freedom of commerce and navigation.

The subjects or citizens of each of the two Contracting Parties shall have liberty freely to come, with their ships and cargoes, to all places and ports in the territories of the other, to which native subjects or citizens are, or may be permitted to come, and shall enjoy the same rights, privileges, liberties, favours, immunities and exemptions in matters of commerce and navigation as are or may be enjoyed by native subjects or citizens.

The subjects or citizens of each of the Contracting Parties shall not be subject in respect of their persons or property, or in respect of their commerce or industry, to any taxes, whether general or local, or to imposts or obligations of any kind whatever, other or greater than those which are or may be imposed upon native subjects or citizens or subjects or citizens of the most favoured nation.



## ARTICLE II.

The Contracting Parties agree that in all matters relating to commerce, navigation, and industry, any privilege, favour, or immunity which either Contracting Party has actually granted or may hereafter grant to the subjects or citizens of any other foreign State, shall be extended immediately and unconditionally to the subjects or citizens of the other, it being their intention that the commerce, navigation, and industry of each country shall be placed in all respects on the footing of the most favoured nation.

## ARTICLE III.

The subjects or citizens of each of the Contracting Parties in the territories of the other shall be at full liberty to acquire and possess every description of property, movable and immovable, which the laws of the country permit, or shall permit the subjects or citizens of any other foreign country to acquire and possess. They may dispose of the same by sale, exchange, gift, marriage, testament, or in any other manner or acquire the same by inheritance, under the same conditions which are or shall be established with regard to native subjects or citizens. They shall not be subjected in any of the cases mentioned to any taxes, imposts or charges of whatever denomination other or higher than those which are or shall be applicable to native subjects or citizens.

The subjects or citizens of each of the Contracting Parties, shall also be permitted, on compliance with the laws of the country, freely to export the proceeds of the sale of their property and their goods in general without being subjected, as foreigners, to other or higher duties than those to which subjects or citizens of the country would be liable under similar circumstances.

## ARTICLE IV.

The subjects or citizens of each of the Contracting Parties :

1. Shall have full liberty with their families to enter, leave, travel, or reside in any part of the territories of the other Contracting Party.
2. They shall be exempted from all compulsory military service whatever, whether in the army, navy, national guard or militia.
3. They shall be equally exempted from all judicial functions whatever, other than those imposed by the laws relating to juries, as well as from all extraordinary war contributions, forced loans, and every species of military requisitions or service.
4. In all other matters affecting their persons or property, any privilege, favour or immunity which either Contracting Party has actually granted, or may hereafter grant to the subjects or citizens of any other foreign State, shall be extended immediately and unconditionally to the subjects or citizens of the other.

## ARTICLE V.

The dwellings, manufactories, warehouses and shops of the subjects or citizens of each of the Contracting Parties in the territories of the other and all premises appertaining thereto destined for purposes of residence or commerce, shall be respected.

It shall not be allowed to make a search of, or a domiciliary visit to such dwellings and premises or to examine or inspect books, papers or accounts, except under the conditions and with the forms prescribed by the laws for subjects or citizens of the country or of the most favoured nation.

The subjects or citizens of each of the two Contracting Parties in the territories of the other shall have free access to the Courts of Justice for the prosecution and defence of their rights without other conditions, restrictions, or taxes beyond those imposed on native subjects or citizens.



## ARTICLE VI.

The articles, the produce or manufacture of one of the Contracting Parties, imported into the territories of the other, from whatever place arriving, shall not be subjected to other or higher duties or charges than those paid on the like articles, the produce or manufacture of any other foreign country. Nor shall any prohibition or restriction be maintained or imposed on the importation of any article, the produce or manufacture of either of the Contracting Parties into the territories of the other, from whatever place arriving which shall not equally extend to the importation of the like articles being the produce or manufacture of any other foreign country.

The only exceptions to this general rule shall be in the case of sanitary or other prohibitions occasioned by the necessity of securing the safety of persons, or of cattle, or of plants useful to agriculture and of the measures applicable in either of the two countries to articles enjoying a direct or indirect bounty in the other.

## ARTICLE VII.

The articles, the produce or manufacture of one of the Contracting Parties, exported to the territories of the other, shall not be subjected to other or higher charges than those paid for the like articles exported to another foreign country. Nor shall any prohibition be imposed on the exportation of any article from the territories of either of the two Contracting Parties to the territories of the other which shall not equally extend to the exportation of the like article to any other foreign country.

## ARTICLE VIII.

Merchandise of all kinds, the produce or manufacture of one of the Contracting Parties, passing in transit through the territories of the other, shall be reciprocally free from all transit duties, whether they pass direct, or whether during transit they are unloaded, warehoused and reloaded. But if the goods remain for more than three days in the bonded warehouses of one of the Contracting Parties, they shall be liable to the payment of the usual warehousing charges, which shall, in no case, exceed the charges payable by subjects or citizens of the country in which the warehouse is situated. Similarly, subjects or citizens of each of the Contracting Parties shall enjoy the same treatment in regard to warehousing accommodation as is accorded to national subjects or citizens.

## ARTICLE IX.

The stipulations of the present Treaty, with regard to the mutual accord of the treatment of the most favoured nation, apply unconditionally to the treatment of commercial travellers and their samples. The Chambers of Commerce, as well as such other Trade Associations and other recognized Commercial Associations in the Contracting States as may be authorized in this behalf, shall be mutually accepted as competent authorities for issuing any certificates that may be required for commercial travellers.

## ARTICLE X.

No internal duties levied for the benefit of the State, local authorities, or corporations which affect, or may affect the production, manufacture, or consumption of any article in the territories of either of the Contracting Parties shall for any reason be a higher or more burdensome charge on articles the produce or manufacture of the other than on similar articles of native origin.



The produce or manufacture of either of the Contracting Parties imported into the territories of the other, and intended for warehousing or transit, shall not be subjected to any internal duty, unless they are placed on the market for consumption, the only charge leviable on them being that for warehousing.

ARTICLE XI.

Each of the Contracting Parties shall permit the importation or exportation on the vessels of the other of all merchandize which may be legally imported or exported; and such vessels and their cargoes shall enjoy the same privileges and shall not be subjected to any other or higher duties or charges than national vessels and their cargoes.

ARTICLE XII.

The provisions of this Treaty relating to the mutual concession of national treatment in matters of navigation do not apply to the coasting trade, in respect of which the subjects or citizens and vessels of the Contracting Parties shall enjoy most-favoured-nation treatment.

British and Honduranean vessels may, nevertheless, proceed from one port to another, either for the purpose of discharging the whole or part of their cargoes brought from abroad, or of taking on board the whole or part of their cargoes for a foreign destination.

ARTICLE XIII.

In all that regards the stationing, loading and unloading of vessels in the ports, docks, roadsteads and harbours of the territories of the Contracting Parties, no privilege shall be granted to national vessels which shall not be equally granted to vessels of the other country; the intention of the Contracting Parties being that, in this respect also, their vessels shall be treated on the footing of perfect equality, the two Governments, however, reserving the right to grant special privileges to their national vessels when engaged in rendering mail or other Government service.

ARTICLE XIV.

No duties of tonnage, harbour, pilotage, lighthouse, quarantine, or other analogous duties of whatever nature or under whatever denomination, levied in the name or for the profit of the Government, private individuals, corporations, or establishments of any kind, shall be imposed in the ports of the territories of either of the Contracting Parties upon the vessels of the other country which shall not equally and under the same conditions be imposed in the like cases on national vessels in general. Such equality of treatment shall apply to the respective vessels from whatever port or place they may arrive and whatever may be their destination.

ARTICLE XV.

Any vessel of either of the Contracting Parties which may be compelled, by stress of weather or by accident, to take shelter in a port of the other, shall be at liberty to refit therein, to procure all necessary stores and to put to sea again, without paying any dues other than such as would be payable in a similar case by a national vessel. In case, however, the master of a merchant vessel should be under the necessity of disposing of a part of his merchandize in order to defray his expenses he shall be bound to conform to the Regulations and Tariffs of the place to which he may have come.

If any vessel of one of the Contracting Parties should run aground or be wrecked upon the coasts of the other, such vessel and all parts thereof and all furniture and appurtenances belonging thereunto, and all goods and merchandize saved therefrom, including any which may have been cast into the sea, or the proceeds thereof, if sold, as well as all papers



found on board such stranded or wrecked vessel shall be given up to the owners or their agents when claimed by them. If there are no such owners or agents on the spot, then the same shall be delivered to the British or Honduran Consular officer in whose district the wreck or stranding may have taken place, upon being claimed by him within the period fixed by the laws of the country, and such Consular officers, owners or agents shall pay only the expenses incurred in the preservation of the property, together with the salvage or other expenses which would have been payable in the like case of a wreck of a national vessel.

The Contracting Parties agree, moreover, that merchandize saved shall not be subjected to the payment of any customs duty unless cleared for internal consumption.

In the case either of a vessel being driven in by stress of weather, run aground, or wrecked, the respective Consular officers shall, if the owner or master or other agent of the owner is not present or is present, and requires it, be authorized to interpose in order to afford the necessary assistance to their fellow-country-men.

#### ARTICLE XVI.

All vessels which, according to British law, are to be deemed British vessels, and all vessels which, according to Honduran law, are to be deemed Honduran vessels, shall, for the purposes of this Treaty, be deemed British or Honduran vessels, respectively.

#### ARTICLE XVII.

It shall be free to each of the High Contracting Parties to appoint Consuls-General, Consuls, Vice-Consuls, and Consular Agents to reside in the towns and ports of the dominions and possessions of the other. Such Consuls-General, Consuls, Vice-Consuls, and Consular Agents however, shall not enter upon their functions until after they shall have been approved and admitted in the usual form by the Government to which they are sent. They shall enjoy all the faculties, privileges, exemptions and immunities of every kind which are or shall be granted to Consuls of the most favoured nation.

#### ARTICLE XVIII.

The Consuls and Consular Agents of each of the Contracting Parties, residing in the territories of the other, shall receive from the local authorities such assistance as can by law be given to them for the recovery of deserters from the vessels of their respective countries.

Provided that this stipulation shall not apply to subjects or citizens of the State in whose territory the desertion takes place.

#### ARTICLE XIX.

The subjects or citizens of each of the Contracting Parties shall have, in the territories of the other, the same rights as native subjects or citizens in regard to patents for inventions, trade-marks, and designs, upon the fulfilment of the formalities prescribed by law.

#### ARTICLE XX.

All goods bearing marks or descriptions which state or manifestly suggest that the goods are the produce or manufacture of one of the Contracting States shall, if such statement or suggestion be false, be seized on importation into either of the two States. The seizure may also be effected in the State where the false indication of origin has been applied, or in that into which the goods bearing the false indication may have been imported.



The seizure shall be effected either at the request of the proper Government Department or of an interested party whether an individual or a Society in conformity with the domestic legislation of each State, but the authorities are not bound to effect the seizure of goods in transit.

The Tribunals of each country shall decide what appellations, on account of their generic character, do not fall within the provisions of the present Article.

ARTICLE XXI.

Any controversies which may arise respecting the interpretation or the execution of the present Treaty or the consequence of any violation thereof, shall be submitted, when the means of settling them directly by amicable agreement are exhausted, to the decision of Commissions of Arbitration, and the result of such arbitration shall be binding upon both Governments.

The members of such Commissions shall be selected by the two Governments by common consent, failing which, each of the two Parties shall nominate an Arbitrator, or an equal number of Arbitrators, and the Arbitrators thus appointed shall select an Umpire.

The procedure of the arbitration shall in each case be determined by the two Contracting Parties, failing which the Commission of Arbitration shall be itself entitled to determine it beforehand.

ARTICLE XXII.

The stipulations of the present Treaty shall not be applicable to any of His Britannic Majesty's Colonies, Possessions or Protectorates beyond the seas, unless notice of adhesion shall have been given on behalf of any such Colony, Possession, or Protectorate by His Britannic Majesty's Representative in Central America, before the expiration of one year from the date of the exchange of the ratifications of the present Treaty.

Nevertheless, the goods produced or manufactured in any of His Britannic Majesty's Colonies, Possessions, and Protectorates, shall enjoy in Honduras complete and unconditional most-favoured-nation treatment, so long as such Colony, Possession or Protectorate shall accord to goods the produce or manufacture of Honduras treatment as favourable as it gives to the produce or manufacture of any other foreign country.

ARTICLE XXIII.

The stipulations contained in this Treaty providing for the mutual accord of the treatment of the most favoured nation shall not be held to be applicable to the special concessions which Honduras may have accorded or may in future accord to other Central American Republics.

ARTICLE XXIV.

The present Treaty shall be ratified and the ratifications shall be exchanged at Guatemala as soon as possible. It shall come into force immediately upon ratification and shall be binding during ten years from the day of its coming into force. In case neither of the Contracting Parties shall have given notice to the other, twelve months before the expiration of the said period of ten years, of the intention to terminate the present Treaty it shall remain in force until the expiration of one year from the day on which either of the Contracting Parties shall have denounced it.

As regards, however, the British Colonies, Possessions, and Protectorates which may have adhered to the present Treaty, in virtue of Article XXII, either of the Contracting Parties shall have the right to terminate it, separately, at any time, on giving twelve months' notice to that effect.



It is understood that the stipulations of the present Article and of Article XXII, referring to British Colonies, Possessions or Protectorates, apply, also, to the Island of Cyprus.

In witness whereof, the respective Plenipotentiaries have signed the present Treaty and have affixed thereto their seals.

**THE FOREIGN MARRIAGES ORDER IN COUNCIL, 1913.**

*At the Court at Windsor Castle, the 22nd day of November, 1913.*

PRESENT,

THE KING'S MOST EXCELLENT MAJESTY.

WHEREAS by "The Foreign Marriage Act, 1892," His Majesty the King in Council is authorized to make Regulations for the purposes therein specified :

And whereas the provisions of Section 1 of "The Rules Publication Act, 1893," have been complied with in respect of the Regulations hereinafter set forth :

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers conferred by "The Foreign Marriage Act, 1892," or otherwise enabling Him in this behalf, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows :

1. (1) Where a marriage according to the local law of a foreign country is valid by English law, then before the marriage is solemnized in that country under the Foreign Marriage Act the marriage officer must be satisfied either—

- (a) That both the parties are British subjects ; or
- (b) If only one of the parties is a British subject, that the other is not a subject or citizen of the country ; or
- (c) If one of the parties is a British subject and the other a subject or citizen of the country, that sufficient facilities do not exist for the solemnization of the marriage in the foreign country in accordance with the law of that country ; or
- (d) If the man about to be married is a British subject and the woman a subject or citizen of the country, that no objection will be taken by the authorities of the country to the solemnization of the marriage under the Foreign Marriage Act.

(2) If a marriage officer, by reason of anything in this article, refuses to solemnize or allow to be solemnized in his presence the marriage of any person requiring such marriage to be solemnized, that person shall have the same right of appeal to a Secretary of State as is given by section 5 of the Foreign Marriage Act.



2. In the case of any marriage under the Foreign Marriage Act, if it appears to the marriage officer that the woman about to be married is a British subject, and that the man is a foreigner, he must be satisfied—

- (a) That the marriage will be recognized by the law of the country to which the foreigner belongs; or
- (b) That some other marriage ceremony, in addition to that under the Foreign Marriage Act, has taken place, or is about to take place, between the parties, and that such other ceremony is recognized by the law of the country to which the foreigner belongs; or
- (c) That the leave of the Secretary of State has been obtained.

3. For the purpose of the Foreign Marriage Act and these Regulations, the house in which a British Ambassador resides in the foreign country to the Government of which he is accredited, or which is occupied by him in that country for the purposes of his embassy, shall be deemed to be the official house of such Ambassador, and is in these Regulations referred to as the embassy house, and every place within the precincts or curtilage of any such house, and any church or chapel annexed to such house, or for the time being used with the consent of the Government to which the Ambassador is accredited as the chapel thereof, shall be deemed to form part of the embassy house.

For the purpose of marriages in an embassy house, the expression "office," when used with respect to the place where any act or thing shall or may be done, shall be construed to refer to such part of the embassy house as the Ambassador may from time to time appoint as being sufficiently accessible to the public.

4. The person before and by whom a marriage under the Foreign Marriage Act may be solemnized and registered in an embassy house in a foreign country shall either be the Ambassador or any member of the diplomatic service not below the rank of secretary, who is attached to the embassy, and who is from time to time appointed for the purpose in writing by the Ambassador; and for the purpose of marriages solemnized in such embassy house, such Ambassador or member of the diplomatic service shall, without any marriage warrant, be a marriage officer.

5. Where a marriage can be solemnized at a British consulate in a foreign country, the leave of the Ambassador shall be obtained before the marriage is solemnized in the embassy house in that country.

6. For the purpose of marriages to be solemnized by or before a consular officer who is a marriage officer, every place within the curtilage or precincts of the house in which such officer is for the time being resident, or of the building which is for the time being used for the purpose of his office, shall be part of the official house of such marriage officer, and every place to which the public have ordinary access in such official house shall be deemed to be part of the office of such marriage officer.

7. (1) The modifications contained in articles 8 to 17 of these Regulations of the requirements of the Foreign Marriage Act as to residence and notice shall have effect in cases where both parties have not dwelt within the district of the marriage officer by or before whom the intended marriage is to be solemnized.

(2) Where the provisions of these Regulations as to residence and notice have been complied with, or where the permission of the Secretary of State has been given, the marriage may be solemnized under the said Act in the official house of a marriage officer.



8. Where one party only has resided for a period of not less than one week within the district of the marriage officer by or before whom the intended marriage is to be solemnized, notice shall be given by that party to such marriage officer. The notice shall state the particulars, and be in the form given in Form No. 1 of the Schedule to this Order.

9. If the non-resident party has dwelt in a place in the United Kingdom, notice shall be given by that party in like manner and on payment of the like fee as if that party were about to be married in that place, and in England or Ireland shall be given to the Superintendent Registrar or Registrar, and in Scotland shall be given by proclamation of banns; and the Superintendent Registrar or Registrar shall deal with the notice and give a certificate for marriage in like manner and on payment of the like fee as in the case of a marriage in his district: and the Session Clerk of the parish in which the banns were proclaimed in Scotland shall, in like manner and on payment of the like fee as in the case of a marriage in his district, give a certificate of proclamation of such banns.

10. If the non-resident party has dwelt in any part of His Majesty's dominions outside the British Islands, notice shall be given by that party—

(a) In accordance with any law of that part of His Majesty's dominions or, in the case of India, of the Governor-General of India in Council, as the case may be, giving effect to these Regulations, or to any repealed or future Order in Council under the Foreign Marriage Act; or

(b) In like manner as if the party were about to be married in that place;

and a certificate by a marriage registrar or other like officer, of the giving of such notice, shall be obtained by such party, subject always to the law in force permitting of such notice being given and to the said officer being empowered to issue such certificate.

11. A law enacted by the Governor-General of India in Council or by the Parliament or Legislature of any part of His Majesty's dominions outside the British Islands other than British India shall be deemed to give effect to these Regulations or to any repealed or future Order in Council under the Foreign Marriage Act if it makes provision (in whatever terms expressed) as follows:

(1) That a notice of a marriage intended to be solemnized under the Foreign Marriage Act may be given by one of the parties intending such marriage who has had his or her usual place of abode for a period of not less than one week immediately preceding in some place in India or in such part of His Majesty's dominions (as the case may be) to such marriage registrar or other officer as may be designated by the law in this behalf;

(2) That such notice shall be published either by proclamation of banns or in such other manner as the law may provide; and

(3) That such marriage registrar or other officer, unless he is aware of any impediment or objection which should obstruct the solemnization of the marriage, shall, on payment of such fee, if any, as the law may provide, give a certificate that the said notice has been so given and published as aforesaid.

12. If the non-resident party has dwelt in the district of a marriage officer in a foreign country, notice shall be given by that party and entered and posted up by the marriage officer in the manner and during the period



provided by the Foreign Marriage Act, in like manner as if the marriage were to be solemnized by or before such marriage officer, and such marriage officer shall, on payment of the proper fee, give a certificate that the notice has been so given and posted up, and that he is unaware of any impediment which should obstruct the solemnization of the marriage.

13. If the place in a foreign country at which the non-resident party has dwelt is not within the district of a marriage officer, the notice to be given by that party may be given to any person authorized by the Secretary of State to receive such notices; and such person may receive, enter, and post up such notice and give a certificate that the notice has been so given and posted up and that he is unaware of any impediment, as if he were a marriage officer.

14. Where neither party has resided for a period of not less than one week within the district of the marriage officer by or before whom the intended marriage is to be solemnized and (a) the marriage cannot conveniently be solemnized under the Foreign Marriage Act at the place where either of the parties has had his or her usual place of abode, or (b) the permission of the Secretary of State has been obtained, notice shall be given by each of the parties in the place where he or she has had his or her usual place of abode for a period of not less than one week immediately preceding the giving of such notice in the manner provided by articles 9-13 of these Regulations and a certificate of the giving of such notice shall be obtained, and one of the parties shall give or transmit to the marriage officer by or before whom the marriage is to be solemnized a notice stating the particulars and in the form given in Form No. 1 of the Schedule to these Regulations, and the marriage officer, if satisfied that the marriage cannot conveniently be solemnized under the Foreign Marriage Act at the place where either of the parties has had his or her usual place of abode or that the permission of the Secretary of State has been obtained, may accept the notice as if both parties had been resident within his district.

15. Where the Secretary of State is satisfied that for some good cause a party to an intended marriage has not been able to comply with the requirements of these Regulations as to notice, and is satisfied that the intended marriage is not clandestine, and that adequate notice has been given, he may give permission for the intended marriage to be solemnized.

16. In cases falling under articles 8 to 15 of these Regulations the oath, affirmation or declaration under section 7 of the Foreign Marriage Act shall in addition to the matters specified in sub-sections (a) and (c) of that section state the place where each of the parties has had his or her usual place of abode, and the notice, if any, which has been given in that place, or to the marriage officer.

17. At or before the time when a non-resident party appears before the marriage officer and makes the oath under section 7 of the Foreign Marriage Act, he or she shall, unless the marriage is solemnized with the permission of the Secretary of State, give or transmit to the marriage officer the certificate that the notice prescribed by these Regulations has been given at the place where such party has had his or her usual place of abode.

18. (1) A marriage solemnized in accordance with the local law of a foreign country shall not be registered under section 18 of the Foreign Marriage Act, except by a consular officer, who is a marriage officer, or is for the time being authorized by the Secretary of State to register such marriages.



(2) A consular officer shall not be required to satisfy himself by personal attendance that a marriage has been duly solemnized in accordance with the local law unless the marriage is solemnized at the place where he is appointed to reside, or unless the proper fee has been previously paid to him.

(3) The consular officer shall forthwith, after he has by personal attendance satisfied himself as to the solemnization of the marriage, register the marriage in duplicate in books furnished to him for the purpose by the Registrar-General through a Secretary of State separate from any register books provided for marriages solemnized by him, and shall register the same in accordance with section 9 of the Foreign Marriage Act, save that if the person by whom the marriage has been solemnized declines to sign the same, the consular officer shall enter the name of that person, and the fact that he declines to sign the same.

(4) The consular officer shall transmit copies and the certificate and the book when filled in manner provided by section 10 of the Foreign Marriage Act.

19. (1) A Secretary of State, by a written authority under section 11 of the Foreign Marriage Act, may authorize a person to act in the place of a High Commissioner or Resident mentioned in that section, outside of His Majesty's dominions.

(2) If a Secretary of State gives such authority, or, in pursuance of the said section, authorizes any High Commissioner, Resident, or other officer outside His Majesty's dominions, not being an Ambassador or a consular officer, to be a marriage officer, then, for the purpose of marriages solemnized and registered by or before any High Commissioner, Resident, or officer, or person so authorized, expressions in the Foreign Marriage Act shall be construed as follows :

(a) Expressions referring to the district of a marriage officer shall be construed to refer to the district for which such High Commissioner, Resident, officer, or person is authorized to act for the purpose of the Foreign Marriage Act ;

(b) The expression "official house of a marriage officer" shall be construed to refer to the building or part of a building or place specified in the document by which he is authorized to act ;

(c) The expression "office," when used with respect to the place at which any act or thing shall or may be done, shall be construed to refer to such portion of the building, part, or place so specified as is ordinarily accessible to the public.

20. (1) Marriages, under the Foreign Marriage Act, on board one of His Majesty's vessels may be solemnized by or before a commanding officer of such rank and of such vessel as is for the time being authorized for that purpose by or in pursuance of any Admiralty instructions ; and for the purpose of any such marriages a commanding officer so authorized shall, without any written warrant, be a marriage officer, and for the purpose of such marriages expressions in the Foreign Marriage Act shall be construed as follows :

(a) Expressions referring to a district of a marriage officer shall be construed to refer to such parts of the foreign station to which the commanding officer is attached as may be specified in that behalf by Admiralty instructions.

(b) The expression "official house of a marriage officer" shall be construed to refer to the vessel of the said commanding officer.

(c) The expression "office," when used with respect to the place where any act or thing shall or may be done, shall be construed to refer to the part of the ship on which public notices are affixed.



(2) The commanding officer, before he solemnizes a marriage, shall be satisfied that, at the port or place where the marriage is solemnized, sufficient facilities do not exist for the solemnization of the marriage on land, either in accordance with the local law of the country or in accordance with the Foreign Marriage Act.

(3) The requirements of the Foreign Marriage Act as to residence and notice shall be modified as follows, namely, not less than three weeks' notice of the intended marriage must have been given in such public manner, or to such relatives or friends of the parties, as satisfies the commanding officer that as much notice of the intended marriage has been given as would be given if the marriage took place in England, and that the marriage is not clandestine.

21. The forms in the Schedule to this Order, or forms to the like effect, shall be used in all cases to which they are applicable.

22. In these Regulations the expression "Ambassador" includes Minister and chargé d'affaires; "embassy" includes legation; "consular officer" includes a consul-general, consul, vice-consul, pro-consul, consular-agent, and any person for the time being authorized to discharge the duties of consul-general, consul, vice-consul, or consular-agent; "British Islands," "British India," and "India" have the same respective meanings as are given to these expressions by section 18 of the Interpretation Act, 1889.

Other expressions have the same meaning as in the Foreign Marriage Act.

23. This Order shall come into operation on the twenty-third day of March, 1914, and from and after that day "The Foreign Marriages Order in Council, 1892," "The Foreign Marriages Order in Council, 1895," and "The Foreign Marriages Order in Council, 1903," are repealed.

Provided that (a) any notice of an intended marriage, any caveat, any consent, or any permission of the Secretary of State, given under one of the above Orders shall be deemed to be good under these Regulations; (b) any proceedings taken with reference to a marriage, any register book kept, and any warrant or authority issued in pursuance of any of the above Orders shall have effect as if taken, kept, or issued under these Regulations.

24. This Order may be cited as "The Foreign Marriages Order in Council, 1913."

And the Right Honourable Sir Edward Grey, Baronet, K.G., the Right Honourable Lewis Harcourt, and the Most Honourable the Marquess of Crewe, K.G., three of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, and the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein as to them may respectively appertain.

### ENACTMENT No. 20 OF 1915.

An Enactment to provide for the receipt in the Federated Malay States of certain notices of marriage under the Foreign Marriage Act, 1892, of the United Kingdom.

**W**HEREAS by regulations contained in an Order made by His Britannic Majesty in Council under the provisions of "The Foreign Marriage Act, 1892," of the United Kingdom and entitled "The Foreign Marriages Order in Council, 1913," provision is made for the procedure to be followed in cases where a marriage is intended to be solemnized under the said Act but the requirements of section 2 of the said Act in respect of the residence of both of the parties have not been complied with:

AND WHEREAS by article 13 of the said Order in Council it is provided that if the place in a foreign country at which the non-resident party has dwelt is not within the district of a marriage officer, the notice to be given by that party may be given to any person authorized by the Secretary of State to receive such notices; and such person may receive, enter, and post up such notice and give a certificate that the notice has been so given and posted up and that he is unaware of any impediment, as if he were a marriage officer:

AND WHEREAS the Federated Malay States are not within the district of a marriage officer, within the meaning of the said article 13, and it is expedient to provide for the appointment of a person to receive in the Federated Malay States such notices as are referred to in the said article 13 and to deal with them in the manner thereby authorized:

It is hereby enacted by the Rulers of the Federated Malay States in Council as follows:

Short title and commencement.

**1.** This Enactment may be cited as "The Foreign Marriage Notice Enactment, 1915," and shall come into force on the publication thereof in the *Gazette*.

Appointment of an officer to receive notices of marriage, and his duties.

**2.** (i) Subject to the provisions of section 3, the Chief Secretary to Government may from time to time by notification in the *Gazette* appoint any public officer serving in the Federated Malay States to be the proper person to receive any such notice as is by article 13 of "The Foreign Marriages Order in Council, 1913," authorized to be given by a party to a marriage intended to be solemnized under "The Foreign Marriage Act, 1892," in a place outside the Federated Malay States when the place at which such party has dwelt is situate in the Federated Malay States.

(ii) The notice to be given shall be signed by the party intending marriage who gives the notice and shall state the name, surname, profession, condition and residence of each of the parties and whether each of the parties is or is not a minor.

(iii) An officer appointed under sub-section (i) shall on receiving any such notice as aforesaid file the same and keep it with the archives of his office and shall also, on payment of the prescribed fee, forthwith enter in a book of notices to be kept by him for the purpose, and post up in some conspicuous place in his office, a true copy of such notice and shall keep the same so posted up during fourteen consecutive days before the marriage is solemnized.

(iv) The said book and copy shall be open at all reasonable times, without fee, to the inspection of any person.

(v) An officer appointed under sub-section (i) to whom such notice as aforesaid has been given shall on payment of the prescribed fee give a certificate that the notice has been so given and posted up and that he is unaware of any impediment which should obstruct the solemnization of the marriage.

3. No officer shall be appointed under section 2 without the sanction of one of His Britannic Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, and such sanction so given to any appointment shall be notified in the *Gazette* when the appointment is published. Sanction of Secretary of State.

4. The Chief Secretary to Government may by notification in the *Gazette* prescribe the fees to be taken under this Enactment and the mode of disposal thereof. Fees.

(i) From and after the commencement of this Enactment it shall be lawful for the Inspector of Schools or for the Assistant Inspector of Schools to cause a notice to be served on the parent or person having the actual custody of any male Malay child between the ages of seven and fourteen years requiring such child to attend the Government vernacular school specified in the notice, and on receipt of such notice such parent or person shall be lawfully responsible for the regular attendance of such child at the school specified.

"Regular  
attendance."

(ii) "Regular attendance" shall mean attendance throughout the hours for which the school is open for the attendance of pupils for not less than fifty per centum of the school days in any calendar month.

Exemptions.

3. (i) No child shall be compelled to attend any school which shall be distant more than two miles from his usual place of residence measured according to the nearest road or path.

(ii) No child who has passed the highest standard in any Government vernacular school shall be compelled to attend any school.

Penalty.

4. Any person lawfully responsible for the attendance at school of any child shall on proof before the Court of a Magistrate that such child has not attended school on at least fifty per centum of the school days in any calendar month and in the absence of any reasonable excuse for such non-attendance be liable to a fine not exceeding five dollars or in default of payment to simple imprisonment for a term not exceeding fourteen days.

**PRESENT:** Mr. A. S. Jelf (*Chairman*), the Health Officer (Dr. J. T. Clarke), the Chief Police Officer (Mr. H. M. Hatchell), the Chief Assistant District Officer (Mr. M. D. Daly), the Protector of Chinese (Mr. W. T. Chapman), the Executive Engineer, Kinta (Mr. E. L. Bennett), the Assistant Architect (Mr. T. Steele), Mr. H. J. Cooper, Mr. R. P. Brash, Towkay Teh Lay Seng, and Towkay Soo Ah Yong.

**ABSENT:** The Deputy Superintendent of Revenue Surveys, Mr. A. N. Kenion, Dr. K. T. Khong, Dato Sri Adika Raja, and V. Sengal Rayen Naidu (on leave).

1. The minutes of the last meeting are taken as read and confirmed, copies having been circulated to members and the approval of the Resident noted.

The rainfall was 11.20 inches with a maximum in one day of 3.02 inches, and the temperature varied from 93° to 70°.

4. The Chairman made a statement on the subject of the sporadic occurrence of plague in Ipoh. The first case, which occurred in June, had come from India and had been through the usual quarantine, the disease developing long after the accepted period of incubation. Four cases altogether occurred in June, one in August, and four during the current month. All but one were fatal. A "spot" map was exhibited, showing the infected locality. The Chairman stated that a reward had been offered for the destruction of rats, but that this produced no results, and an official rat-catcher had now been appointed. A Sanitary Inspector had been detailed to work with the Health Officer, and the work of the Sanitary Inspectors temporarily re-arranged to facilitate concentration on the infected locality. Poison had been laid wholesale, and a general cleansing of the houses ordered under the Quarantine and Prevention of Disease Enactment. The Chinese Chamber of Commerce had also been communicated with on the subject of rat destruction.

5. A list of plans dealt with since the last meeting is laid on the table.

6. A statement of Public Works Department expenditure within Sanitary Board areas of Kinta for the first eight months of the year is read to members.

8. The Chairman reports that the lease of the Tamil Settlement expires at the end of the current year, and that the Government have decided to take over the land rather than grant a new lease. There was no intention to disturb the inhabitants more than was necessary to introduce drainage and certain essential reforms, and the Chairman invites members to visit the locality and favour him with advice as to the steps to be taken.

On the motion of the Health Officer, a sub-committee was appointed to consider the whole question, consisting of the Chairman, the Health Officer, the Chief Assistant District Officer, the Executive Engineer, Kinta, and Mr. H. J. Cooper. It was resolved to invite the assistance of the Deputy Controller of Labour.

9. An application from the Muhammadan community of Menglembu for exemption from assessment on the Mosque at that place is recommended.

10. Applications from Mr. Eu Tong Sen (Kampar) and Mohamed Husin (Ipoh) for water supplies are received.

11. A letter from Towkay Soo Ah Yong, urging an extension of the water supply to Kampar, has the unanimous support of the Board, and the Chairman is requested to forward it to Government.

12. The Chairman is empowered by the Board to serve notices on the owners of 31-47, Leech Street, Ipoh, to compel certain alterations.

13. The Chairman informs the Board that a vote has been asked for in 1917 to complete the "Tarco" process in the streets of Ipoh, but that the matter is not considered sufficiently urgent to justify a special vote now.

14. The question of the supply of electric light and power to Ipoh is reported as having reached His Excellency the High Commissioner. Mr. Cooper informs the Board that he has furnished the Perak Unofficial Members of the Federal Council with copies of the correspondence, and that they have undertaken to bring the matter up at the next meeting of the Federal Council.

15. The Board concur with the Chairman that the number of street stalls in Leech Street, Ipoh, should be reduced as and when opportunity offers.

6. An application by the owners of 29, Main Road, Ampang, for exemption from assessment on the ground that it is being used as a Chinese school, is considered. The Protector of Chinese has written advising that the application be refused on the ground that the house is partly used by a political society, but the Chinese unofficial members support the application stating that the school does a great deal of good and is old established. The other members present concurring, it is decided to recommend exemption.

7. In regard to the proposal for the supply of electric light and power to Ipoh, a letter from the Chief Secretary to Government is read to the effect that His Excellency the High Commissioner desires the Chairman of the Board to be informed that the Resident considers that the present arrangement for town lighting is satisfactory. If, however, any company will put forward proposals for electric lighting, such proposals will receive consideration.

8. The Chairman explained to Towkay Teh Lay Seng the reasons leading to the prosecution on one Fong Yu for selling bad fish in the Ipoh market, as a result of which Fong Yu was fined \$100.

9. The Chairman informs the Board that a suggestion has been made to amend rule 2 of the Rules made under the Theatres Enactment, so as to enable the Licensing Officer to extend the time of the performance of Chinese theatrical companies until 6 a.m., and invites an expression of opinion from the Chinese unofficial members.

Dr. Khong, Towkay Soo Ah Yong and Towkay Teh Lay Seng express the opinion, in more or less identical terms, that such extension should only be granted on certain specified dates which should be decided on and published beforehand. They urge that such dates should be as few as possible, but do not desire the total prohibition of extensions.

10. The Board gives a general approval to the alteration and reconstruction of Messrs. Whiteaway Laidlaw's premises in Station Road. The Health Officer, however, formally dissents on the ground that a three-storey building such as is proposed is unsuitable to the locality and too high in proportion to the width of the street, thereby contravening the by-laws. The other members are unable to agree with the Health Officer.

11. The Board approves the alteration in plan necessary for the conversion of the cinema theatre in Hume Street (proposed by Mr. J. A. Russell) to an ordinary Chinese theatre.



12. In reply to Towkay Soo Ah Yong's application for an extension of the water supply of Kampar, the Chairman reports that nothing can be done in this direction at present.

Energetic action was being continued in distributing rat poison, and in serving notices on houses to clean and disinfect. The outbreak had been confined to the old town. One case had recently occurred at Pulai, and an extensive destruction of houses was contemplated, to be replaced by temporary buildings erected by the Government.

15. An application for sub-division into town lots of certain agricultural land at the newly declared village and Sanitary Board area of Malim Nawar was approved.

16. The Chairman's memorandum, *re* the Vehicles Department, was reported as having been forwarded to Government.

17. The Board then adjourned *sine die*.

**ABSENT:** The Chairman (Mr. C. F. J. Green), the Protector of Chinese (Mr. L. H. Clayton), the Chief Police Officer (Major A. McD. Graham), Mr. E. Macfadyen, Mr. A. K. E. Hampshire, Mr. K. T. Parimanam Pillay, and Towkay Choo Kia Peng.

1. Minutes of the previous meeting, having been circulated among the members, were taken as read, and were confirmed.

2. Drainage, Government Quarters and Bungalows: A sub-committee, consisting of the Chairman, Executive Engineer, Town, Collector of Land Revenue and Assistant Government Architect, was appointed to consider the drainage question referred to by the Resident in Secretariat correspondence 4523/16.

3. Extension of Back Lanes: Plans and estimates submitted by the Executive Engineer, Town, for the extension of back lanes at Java Street, McArthur Street, Ampang Street, Sultan Street and Gombak Lane were approved.

4. Meter Rent: The Chairman was requested to inform the Director of St. John's Institution, in reply to his application for a reduction of water meter rent, that the charges for such instruments are fixed by rule 15 (i) of the Rules under the Waterworks Enactment, and the Board have no power to modify them.

5. Plan: Plan of proposed dwelling-houses for erection on lot 134, section 57, was not approved as the Board considered the type of building was not suitable for the locality.



6. Health Report: The Health Officer's report on the health of Kuala Lumpur for the month of August, 1916, was submitted:

- (1) The population for the month of August, 1916, is estimated at 61,646.
- (2) Births: During the month, 97 births were notified, giving an uncorrected birth-rate of 18.88 per mille.
- (3) Deaths: The total number of deaths registered as having occurred within the Sanitary Board limits was 221, giving a crude death-rate of 43.02 per mille. The number of deaths among the resident population was 135, giving a corrected death-rate of 26.28 per mille. The corrected death-rate for the corresponding month of 1915 was 26.34. There were 31 deaths of infants under the age of one year. The infantile mortality figure (deaths under one year of age) per 1,000 births was 319.59.

- (5) Notifiable Diseases: Two cases of chicken-pox, one case of measles, one case of enteric and one case of small-pox were notified.
- (6) The total rainfall recorded at the General Hospital for the month was 176.4 m.m. The greatest fall for the 24 hours ending 6 p.m. was 33.4 m.m. on the 28th. There was no recorded fall for 14 days. The mean temperature for the month was: 9 a.m., 78.09 degrees; 3 p.m., 81.45 degrees; and 9 p.m., 78.51 degrees. The maximum temperature was 86 degrees on the 3rd and 7th, and the lowest was 74 degrees on the 11th, 16th and 20th.
- (7) Forty-seven samples of milk were forwarded to the Government Chemist for analysis during the month, four of which were found to be adulterated.

7. Formal Matters: The following formal matters were laid on the table and formally approved:

- (a) Water supplies as per register;
- (b) Plans as per register;
- (c) List of notices and applications for prosecution.

8. Shop-house Designs: Two designs of houses for erection in High Street were submitted by the Assistant Government Architect. The Board considered that marked A the most suitable.

9. Road Reserves: The consideration of a petition from residents in the neighbourhood of Imbi Road for the making up of road reserves was held over, pending the report of the sub-committee appointed to consider the question of arterial roads in that locality.

10. Mr. H. N. Ferrers, referring to the storage of engines and old iron outside Chan Sow Lin's Engineering Works at Ampang Road, asked for information as to the powers of the Board to enforce people to maintain their premises in a tidy condition. The Chairman pointed out that the by-laws provided for the clearance of undergrowth and rubbish, but with regard to the removal of engines, etc., he would report later.

Each tender must be accompanied by a Bank or Treasury receipt for a cash deposit of \$100 as a guarantee of good faith, otherwise it will not be considered. If any tenderer withdraws his offer after his tender has been accepted, his deposit will be forfeited to the State. The deposits of unsuccessful tenderers will be returned.

5. The monthly amount offered for the exclusive right must be stated in the tender. This amount will be payable to the District Officer (or Protector of Chinese) in advance on the first day of each month.

6. A cash deposit equal to three months' rent will be required as security.

7. A separate tender must be made for each shop.

8. The fee imposed by the rules of \$1.50 for every month or part of a month in respect of each licence must be paid monthly in advance.

9. No licence will be issued in respect of any premises that have not been approved by the Licensing Authority.

10. Successful tenderers must make their own arrangements with the owners of the coconut trees from which toddy is to be drawn and with the landholders on whose land the shops may be situated.



11. N.B.—Licences will be subject to the conditions of the proposed Enactment to further amend "The Excise Enactment, 1915," a draft of which was published in the Federated Malay States Government Gazette of the 30th October, 1916, and to the following special conditions:

1. Every licensee shall at all times exhibit in a conspicuous place outside the licensed premises the words "Licensed to sell toddy by retail."
  2. No licensee shall sell toddy except upon premises which fulfil the following conditions—namely,
    - (a) the premises shall contain no internal partitions;
    - (b) the floor of the premises shall be constructed of such impervious material as may be approved by the Licensing Board; and
    - (c) in cases in which the licence has been issued subject to the condition that the premises shall include a compound as well as a toddy shop no building shall be erected within such compound other than a house for the accommodation of a watchman.
  3. Every licensee shall cause the licensed premises to be closed between the hours of 8 p.m. and 10 a.m.
  4. The licensee shall keep the licensed premises clean and in good repair.
  5. No licensee shall permit any musical or other entertainment to be given upon the licensed premises without the sanction in writing of the Chief Police Officer first obtained.
  6. No licensee shall supply or permit to be supplied any toddy to any drunken person.
  7. No licensee shall permit any prostitute to enter upon the licensed premises.
  8. No licensee shall sleep or allow any other person to sleep upon the licensed premises.
  9. No licensee shall sell or expose for sale or allow to be sold or exposed for sale upon the licensed premises any article other than toddy.
  10. No licensee shall allow any liquid other than toddy or water to be upon the licensed premises.
  11. No licensee shall have in his possession, whether upon the licensed premises or elsewhere, any toddy with which there has been mixed any extraneous alcohol, anything containing alcohol or any noxious or objectionable substance.
  12. Every licensee shall at all times keep upon the licensed premises an ample supply of wholesome water for the cleaning of utensils employed thereon.
  13. No licensee shall store or permit to be stored any toddy in any place other than upon premises licensed as a toddy shop.
  14. No licensee shall use or permit to be used for the transport or storage of toddy any vessel which is not composed of earthenware possessing a glazed inner surface or which does not fulfil such other requirements as the Chief Officer of Excise may from time to time prescribe.
  15. No licensee shall store or permit to be stored any toddy in any vessel which is not of such standard shape and dimensions as the Chief Officer of Excise shall have approved.
  16. No licensee shall serve or permit to be served for consumption upon the premises any toddy otherwise than in a vessel the dimensions of which are not smaller at the mouth than at the base.
  17. Every licensee shall keep upon the licensed premises a printed account book with pages numbered consecutively which shall be in a form to be provided by the Licensing Authority. Every such account book shall be written up in ink daily, and a true copy of the contents thereof shall be submitted monthly by the licensee to the Chairman of the Licensing Board not later than the fifth day of the month following that in respect of which the account is rendered.
  18. Every licensee shall produce on demand for the inspection of any member of the Licensing Board or of any Officer of Excise the account book kept by him under the provisions of the preceding rule.
  19. Every licensee shall keep upon the licensed premises an inspection note-book with pages numbered consecutively for the entry therein by members of the Licensing Board and by Officers of Excise of their remarks and shall produce the same upon demand to any such member or officer.
