No. 3602.—The following Circular despatch from the Right Honourable the Secretary of State for the Colonies is published for general information:

CIRCULAR.

DOWNING STREET,
29th September, 1916.

SIR,—With reference to my telegram of the 12th of September, I have the honour to inform you that the arrangement under which refunds have in the past been given by the Army Council to candidates for Army Commissions who have possessed special military and other qualifications and who have proceeded to the United Kingdom at their own expense has been modified as follows:

- (1) Candidates for commissions except for the Royal Army Medical Corps and Army Veterinary Corps, and for certain branches of the Royal Engineers, must pass through the ranks of Cadet Units, and no refunds will be considered in the case of any candidate passing through a Cadet Unit who embarks after 30th September, 1916.
- (2) Cases of candidates with special military qualifications embarking on or before that date will be considered on their merits, but no guarantee of refund can be given beforehand, and to candidates passing through Cadet Units it will not exceed the cost of a Government 2nd Class passage.
- (3) In no case is refund of passage granted to those who are not given commissions.

2. All candidates are strongly advised to communicate with the local Military Authorities or the War Office before coming to this country.

3. For any candidates nominated under War Office instructions conveyance will continue to be provided, as at present.

"THE EXCISE ENACTMENT, 1915."

AMENDMENT OF LICENCE FEES.

No. 3603.—In exercise of the powers on them severally conferred by section 30 (c) of "The Excise Enactment, 1915," and with the approval of the Chief Secretary, the Residents of Perak, Selangor, Negri Sembilan and Pahang, each in respect of the State whereof he is Resident, cancel, with effect from the 1st day of January, 1917, the fees prescribed by Nos. 32, 37 and 42 of the Rules made by them under The Excise Enactments, 1908 (Perak, Selangor and Negri Sembilan), 1909 (Pahang), which were published as *Perak Government Gazette* Notification No. 1004 of the 28th December, 1908, *Selangor Government Gazette* Notification No. 826 of the 31st December, 1908, *Negri Sembilan Government Gazette* Notification No. 622 of the 31st December, 1908, and *Pahang Government Gazette* Notification No. 41 of the 1st March, 1909, and amended in respect of rules 32 and 42 by Notifications Nos. 3146 and 1142, published in the *Federated Malay States Government Gazette* on the 23rd October, 1914, and 24th June, 1910, respectively, and substitute as from the date aforesaid the following fees:

No. 3605.—For the period from the 24th to 30th November, 1916, inclusive, the value of the highest grade of rubber is fixed at two shillings and seven pence three-quarter penny per lb., and the duty on cultivated rubber on which export duty is leviable on an *ad valorem* basis in accordance with the Rules under the Customs Duties Enactment, will be assessed on a price of \$135 per pikul for all grades.

"THE MALAY RESERVATIONS ENACTMENT, 1913."

No. 3606.—In exercise of the powers vested in him by section 3 (i) of "The Malay Reservations Enactment, 1913," the Resident of Negri Sembilan, with the approval of the Ruler of the State in Council, declares the land described in the schedule hereunder to be a Malay Reservation.

Dated at Seremban, this 7th day of November, 1916.

SCHEDULE.
