"THE OPIUM AND CHANDU ENACTMENT, 1910."
RETAIL PRICE OF CHANDU.

No. 3607.—In exercise of the powers vested in them severally by section 23 of "The Opium and Chandu Enactment, 1910," the Residents of Perak, Selangor, Negri Sembilan and Pahang, each for the State whereof he is Resident, with the approval of the Chief Secretary to Government, have, with effect from the publication hereof in the *Gazette*, rescinded rule 17 of the Rules under the said Enactment and published as Notification No. 2099 in the *Gazette* of the 27th June, 1916, and have made the following rule, which is to be read in the place of the said rule 17, with effect from the 23rd November, 1916:

17. The maximum price at which Government chandu may be sold shall be as follows:

For a 3-hun packet	\$.33
" 3-chi pot	3.25
" 1-tahil pot	10.50

"THE PUBLIC EMERGENCY ENACTMENT, 1914."

No. 3608.—In exercise of the powers vested in him by "The Public Emergency Enactment, 1914," the High Commissioner rescinds Notification No. 560, published in the *Gazette* of the 12th February, 1916, whereby the exportation from the Federated Malay States to Netherlands India of rice from French Indo-China was prohibited, and prohibits as from the date of this notification the exportation from the Federated Malay States to the Netherlands East Indies of rice, commonly known as Saigon rice, whether the same has been grown or milled in French Indo-China or elsewhere.
