"THE PUBLIC EMERGENCY ENACTMENT, 1914."

No. 3740.—Whereas, by Notification No. 3458, published in the Gazette on the 30th October, 1916, and made under section 2B of "The Public Emergency Enactment, 1914," as amended by "The Public Emergency Enactment, 1914, Amendment Enactment, 1914, the exportation of certain articles therein referred to from the Federated Malay States to certain destinations was prohibited:

AND WHEREAS the said notification was amended and added to by Notification No. 3462 of the 3rd November, 1916:

AND WHEREAS it is expedient that the said notification of the 30th October, 1916, should be further amended and added to:

Now IT IS HEREBY NOTIFIED that, in virtue and exercise of the powers in that behalf conferred on him by the Enactments above recited, the High Commissioner further amends the said notification of the 30th October, 1916, by making the following amendments in and additions to the Schedule to the same:

(1) That the following headings are deleted:

- (B) Feathers and down, except wing and tail feathers of the ostrich;
- (A) Flax fabric, suitable for aircraft;
- (A) Iron and steel plates and sheets; Linen manufactures, the following:
  - (B) Canvas;
  - (B) Canvas hose;
  - (B) Drills, woven;
  - (A) Ducks, woven;
  - (B) Linen piece goods woven from bleached yarns, but not bleached in the piece;
  - (B) Linen thread;
  - (B) Linen yarn;
  - (B) Union cloths containing cotton in the proportion of 25 per cent. or upwards;

Metals and ores, the following:

- (A) Steel, and steel articles containing chrome, cobalt, nickel or vanadium;
- (x) Steel flats, rounds, and squares (except carbon steel for tools and steel for mining purposes);
- (B) Provisions and victuals which may be used as food for man and the raw materials thereof, all, not otherwise prohibited, including:

Fruit, fruit preserves, and nuts used as fruit; Poultry and game;

- (B) Rubber, the following varieties, viz.: Borneo, Guayule,
  Jelutong, Palembang, Pontianac, and all other substances
  containing caoutchouc; and Gutta-percha and balata;
  and goods made wholly or partly of such rubber, guttapercha or balata;
- (2) That the following headings are added:

Chemicals, etc., the following:

- (A) Molybdic acid and its salts;
- (B) Feathers and down, except ornamental feathers;
- (A) Gauze manufactured of copper or its alloys;
- (B) Hemp braid;

Linen manufactures, the following:

- (B) Canvas hose;
- (A) Cloth unbleached woven from bleached or unbleached flax yarns, whether the cloth or yarn is pure or mixed with any other material,
  - (i) being of a weight per square yard exceeding 8 ounces, or
  - (ii) if of a weight per square yard of 8 ounces or less, aggregating 96 threads or more per inch warp and weft combined;
- (B) Cloth woven from bleached or unbleached flax yarns not otherwise specifically prohibited whether the cloth or yarn is pure or mixed with any other material;
- (B) Linen thread;
- (B) Linen yarn;
- (B) Matches;

Metals and ores, the following:

- (A) Steel articles containing chrome, cobalt, nickel or vanadium;
- (A) Steel flats, rounds, and other sections, with the following exceptions:
  - (i) When made from crucible cast steel;
  - (ii) Carbon steel for tools not manufactured in the United Kingdom by the Siemens or Bessemer processes;

provided such crucible or carbon steel does not contain more than 5 per cent. of chrome, cobalt, nickel or vanadium; (A) Iron and steel plates and sheets except when made from crucible cast steel or from carbon steel not manufactured in the United Kingdom by the Siemens or Bessemer processes; provided such crucible or carbon steel does not contain more than 5 per cent. of chrome, cobalt, nickel or vanadium;

Provisions and victuals which may be used as food for man, the following:

- (A) Jam;
- (A) Venison;
- (B) Provisions and victuals which may be used as food for man and the raw materials thereof, all, not otherwise prohibited, including:

Fruit, fruit preserves (other than jam) and nuts used

as fruit;

Poultry and game (except venison);

Sauces and condiments (except table salt) not otherwise prohibited;

Vegetables canned;

- (B) Rubber, the following varieties, viz.: Borneo, Guayule, Jelutong, Palembang, Pontianac, and all other substances containing caoutchouc; and gutta-percha and balata; and goods made wholly or partly of such rubber, gutta-percha or balata (except rubber hose covered with steel
- (A) Rubber hose covered with steel wire;
- (A) Valves, gas, steam and water;

Woods, the following:

- (A) Rock elm;
- (A) Wood-screws, made of brass, iron, or steel.

# 'THE TRADING WITH THE ENEMY ENACTMENT, 1914, AMENDMENT ENACTMENT, 1916."

No. 3742.—Contraband of War.—In continuation of Notifications Nos. 3057, 921, 1796 and 2660, published in the Gazette on the 22nd October, 1915, 13th March, 1916, 1st June, 1916, and 18th August, 1916, respectively, the following Proclamation by His Britannic Majesty, being an amendment to the list of articles to be treated as contraband of war, is published for general information and guidance:

## BY THE KING.

A PROCLAMATION MAKING CERTAIN ADDITIONS TO AND AMENDMENTS IN THE LIST OF ARTICLES TO BE TREATED AS CONTRABAND OF WAR.

# GEORGE, R. I.

Whereas on the 14th day of October, 1915, We did issue Our Royal Proclamation specifying the articles which it was Our intention to treat as contraband during the continuance of hostilities, or until We did give further public notice:

AND WHEREAS, on the 27th day of January, 1916, the 12th day of April, 1916, and the 27th day of June, 1916, We did, by Our Royal Proclamations of those dates, make certain additions to and modifications in the said list of articles to be treated as contraband:

AND WHEREAS it is expedient to make certain further additions to the said list:

Now, THEREFORE, We do hereby declare, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, that during the continuance of the war or until We do give further public notice, the following articles will be treated as absolute contraband, in addition to those set out in Our Royal Proclamations aforementioned:

Insulating materials, raw and manufactured.

Fatty acids.

Cadmium, cadmium alloys, and cadmium ore.

Albumen

And We do hereby further declare that as from this date the following amendments shall be made in Schedule 1 of Our Royal Proclamation of the 14th day of October, 1915, aforementioned:

For item 6, "paraffin wax," there shall be substituted "waxes of all kinds."

And We do hereby further declare that the following article shall as from this date be treated as conditional contraband in addition to those set out in Our Royal Proclamations aforementined:

Yeast.

No. 3743.—The United Kingdom Importation Restrictions.—In continuation of Notifications Nos. 1518, 1592, 1789, 2101, 2404, 2670, 3009 and 3178, published in the Gazette on the 8th, 16th and 27th May, 30th June, 22nd July, 25th August, 21st September, and 17th November, 1916, respectively, the following Proclamation by His Britannic Majesty is published for general information:

BY THE KING.

A PROCLAMATION RELATING TO THE IMPORTATION OF CERTAIN ARTICLES INTO THE UNITED KINGDOM.

GEORGE, R. I.

Whereas by section forty-three of the Customs Consolidation Act, 1876, it is provided that the importation of arms, ammunition, gunpowder, or any other goods may be prohibited by Proclamation:

And whereas by various Proclamations entitled Prohibition of Import Proclamations the importation of certain goods has been prohibited accordingly:

AND WHEREAS it is expedient that the importation into the United Kingdom of certain other goods should be prohibited, and the existing prohibition imposed on the importation of certain goods removed:

Now, THEREFORE, We, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, in pursuance of the said Act and of all other powers enabling Us in that behalf, do hereby proclaim, direct and ordain as follows:

(1) As from and after the date hereof, subject as hereinafter provided, the importation into the United Kingdom of the following goods is hereby prohibited—viz.:

Aluminium powder.

Birds, live, other than poultry and game.

Bone, horn, ivory and celluloid, manufactures of.

Cotton hosiery.

Provided always, and it is hereby declared, that this prohibition shall not apply to any such goods which are imported under licence given by or on behalf of the Board of Trade, and subject to the provisions and conditions of such licence.

(2) As from and after the date hereof the prohibition imposed by the Prohibition of Import (No. 8) Proclamation, 1916, on the importation of the following goods shall be removed, and the said Proclamation amended accordingly—viz.:

Oranges.

This Proclamation may be cited as the Prohibition of Import (No. 10) Proclamation, 1916.

# GOD SAVE THE KING!

No. 3744.—The United Kingdom Importation Restrictions.—It is hereby notified for general information that a Proclamation by His Britannic Majesty has been issued on the 16th November, 1916, prohibiting the importation into the United Kingdom of jewellery and all manufactures of gold and silver other than watches and watch cases.
