"THE PUBLIC EMERGENCY ENACTMENT, 1917."

**No. 591.**—WHEREAS by section 5 of "The Public Emergency Enactment, 1917," it is enacted that the High Commissioner may, by notification in the *Gazette*, prohibit the importation into, or the exportation from, the Federated Malay States, either absolutely or from or to any country, territory or place without the Federated Malay States in such notification to be specified, of any animal or thing, and any animal or thing to which such prohibition as aforesaid relates shall be deemed for the purposes of the Customs Regulations Enactments, 1907, to be prohibited things:

NOW THEREFORE, His Excellency, in virtue and exercise of the powers aforesaid, prohibits the exportation of the things mentioned in the schedule hereto as follows:

1. The exportation of the articles mentioned in Schedule A is prohibited to all ports and destinations abroad other than ports and destinations in the United Kingdom, British Possessions, Protectorates and Protected States.

2. Any person who exports or attempts to export any article in contravention of these regulations or aids and abets any other person in exporting or attempting to export any article in contravention of these regulations shall be guilty of an offence against these regulations, and if such person is a Company, every Director or officer of the Company shall also be guilty of an offence against these regulations unless he proves that the contravention took place without his knowledge or consent.

3. Any person guilty of an offence against these regulations shall be liable on conviction before a Police Court to a fine not exceeding \$800 or to imprisonment of either description for a term which may extend to six months or to both such fine and imprisonment.

4. Nothing in these regulations shall apply to the exportation of any article in accordance with the conditions and restrictions of a licence issued by order of the High Commissioner.

5. The regulations published as Notification No. 4555 in the Supplement (dated 17th November, 1919) to the *Federated Malay States Government Gazette* of 7th November, 1919, are hereby cancelled.

"THE QUARANTINE AND PREVENTION OF DISEASE ENACTMENT, 1903."

ORDERS UNDER RULE 56 AND 56A OF THE RULES UNDER.

**No. 592.**—In pursuance of the powers conferred on him by rules 56 and 56A of the rules under "The Quarantine and Prevention of Disease Enactment, 1903," the Resident of Perak hereby prescribes the following ports and places—namely, Teluk Anson, Port Weld, Padang Simpang Perak, Padang Lapang Ninerang, Padang Deradap, Padang Sepor, Selama, and Parit Buntar, to be ports and places by which alone cattle may be imported into the State, and appoints Port Weld to be a place for the detrainment of cattle imported into the State by train from any place situate elsewhere than in the Federated Malay States, in Malacca or in the Dindings, and orders that, until further notice, all cattle imported from Malacca and the Dindings shall, on arrival in the State, undergo quarantine for a period not exceeding ten days from the date of arrival at the quarantine station provided by Government.

*Exception.*—Cattle intended for slaughter for human food in the Ipoh abattoirs may be imported by train, or taken directly from Port Weld and Teluk Anson by train to the abattoirs, without undergoing quarantine. Such animals shall be slaughtered within 24 hours of their arrival at the abattoirs.

Notification No. 353, published in the *Federated Malay States Gazette* of 22nd January, 1920, is hereby cancelled.

**No. 593.**—THE FOOD CONTROL REGULATIONS, 1918.—

In exercise of the powers conferred upon him by regulation 6 of the Food Control Regulations, 1918, the Food Controller hereby orders as follows:

Any person who sells padi in the State of Perak, outside the district of Krian, shall together with the intending purchaser before such sale is completed appear before the District Officer or Penghulu of the district or mukim in which the padi is situated and sign an entry in a book to be kept for that purpose recording the names and addresses of vendor and purchaser and the quantity of padi sold and the price paid.
