"THE LABOUR CODE, 1912."

No. 594.—In exercise of the powers vested in him by section 204 of "The Labour Code, 1912," the Controller of Labour, with the approval of the Chief Secretary to Government, hereby prescribes a rate of sixty cents *per diem* as the rate at which a resident manager shall pay the expenses of the maintenance and treatment of a labourer in a Government hospital.

Notification No. 3145, dated the 6th December, 1912, is hereby cancelled.

"THE QUARANTINE AND PREVENTION OF DISEASE ENACTMENT, 1903."

No. 595.—Rinderpest having ceased to exist among cattle in Negri Sembilan, the Resident of Pahang hereby rescinds Notification No. 4547 of 13th November, 1919.

No. 596.—THE FOOD CONTROL REGULATIONS, 1918.—

ORDER BY THE FOOD CONTROLLER.

In exercise of the powers vested in him by regulation 6 of the Food Control Regulations, 1918, the Food Controller makes the following Order, which shall have effect from the date of publication of this notification in the *Gazette*:

1. (i) This Order may be cited as the Permit (Household) Order, 1920.  
(ii) In this Order "Permit" means a Permit issued by authority of a Deputy Food Controller authorizing a person named therein to buy a specified quantity of rice per week from a specified licensed retail dealer; and "household" includes domestic servants, motor-car drivers, grooms and gardeners employed in or in connection with the domestic services of any house.
2. No person shall
  - (a) hold at one time more than one Permit;
  - (b) use the Permit of another person except with the consent of and for and on behalf of that person;
  - (c) deface a Permit or alter anything thereon.
3. No person who holds a Permit or is a member of a household in respect of which a Permit is held shall apply for or attempt to obtain any additional Permit.
4. Every holder of a Permit
  - (a) who changes his place of residence, or
  - (b) whose household becomes reduced in number, shall forthwith surrender his Permit at the office of issue.
5. No person shall by means of a Permit
  - (a) buy or attempt to buy rice in excess of the quantity authorized by such Permit to be bought, or
  - (b) buy or attempt to buy within any period rice in excess of the quantity authorized by the Permit to be bought within such period.
6. No holder of a Permit shall give or lend his Permit to any person; provided that nothing herein shall debar the holder of a Permit from delivering his Permit to a member of his household to use on his behalf.
7. Nothing in this Order applies to anything done by or by the authority of the Food Controller or a Deputy Food Controller.

No. 597.—THE FOOD CONTROL REGULATIONS, 1918.—

In exercise of the powers conferred upon him by regulation 6 of the Food Control Regulations, 1918, and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf the Food Controller hereby orders as follows:

1. No person shall directly or indirectly sell by retail or offer for sale by retail the brand of milk hereinafter mentioned at a price exceeding the amount stated:

Nestle's unsweetened condensed	Per case.	Per tin.
...	\$16.80	35 cents.

2. Provided that where the above-mentioned brand of milk is sold or offered for sale in the States of Perak, Selangor, Negri Sembilan and Pahang in any shop or place not situate within the Sanitary Board or village limits of any town or village having a railway station, the price at which such brand is permitted to be sold or offered for sale may be increased by one cent per tin.

3. For the purposes of this Order the words "case" and "tin" shall bear the meanings assigned to them respectively by Notification No. 955, published in the *Gazette* on 5th March, 1919.

4. (i) This Order may be cited as the Price of Milk Order No. 1 of 1920.  
(ii) This Order shall apply generally throughout the Federated Malay States.  
(iii) This Order shall come into force on publication thereof in the *Gazette*.  
(iv) The Price of Milk Order No. 1 of 1919, published as Notification No. 955 in the *Gazette* on 5th March, 1919, is hereby cancelled in so far as it relates to Nestle's unsweetened condensed milk.



**No. 598.—PRICE OF RUBBER.—**

With reference to Notification No. 28, published in the *Federated Malay States Government Gazette* of the 3rd January, 1919, it is hereby notified that the price of first grade rubber for the period 6th February to 12th February, 1920, inclusive, is one dollar and ten and a half cents per pound, equivalent to \$147.3 per pikul.
