TENDERS INVITED.

SUPPLY OF REQUISITES TO MEDICAL INSTITUTIONS, PAHANG.

Separate tenders are invited for the supply of hospital requisites at the under-mentioned stations for the period of nine months from the 1st April, 1920:

Medical Institutions at Kuala Lipis, Raub and Bentong.

The terms of contract can be ascertained from the Medical Officer in Charge, Pahang, and also from the Medical Officer in each hospital.

With each tender a receipt from the local Treasury, showing a money deposit of \$20, must be sent. Should any person decline to enter into the contract after he has tendered and his tender accepted, such deposit will be forfeited.

All deposits will be returned upon the acceptance of tenders having been decided.

Tenders which are not made out on the proper printed forms, or which are sent unaccompanied by a Treasury receipt showing the money deposit required, will not be considered.

Tenders, marked on the cover "Tender for supply of requisites to Medical Institutions," should be addressed under sealed covers to the Honourable the British Resident, Pahang, and sent to this office not later than noon on the 31st March, 1920.

Samples of all articles should be supplied to Medical Officer in Charge, Pahang, Raub, when called for.
