No. 1169.—The following Admiralty Fleet Orders regarding the award of British War Medal and the "Victory Medal" are published for general information:

M.O. 3973.—BRITISH WAR MEDAL.

(C.W. 26721.—10/12/1919.)

His Majesty the King has been graciously pleased to approve the issue of a Medal to record the bringing of the War to a successful conclusion, and the arduous services rendered by His Majesty's Forces.

1. The Medal will be in silver.
2. The riband will be orange (watered) in the centre with stripes of white and black on each side and with borders of Royal blue.
3. Provided the claims are approved by the Admiralty, the medal will be granted to those of the under-mentioned classes who performed 28 days' mobilised service, or lost their lives in active operations before completing that period, between the 5th August, 1914, and 11th November, 1918, both dates inclusive.
 - (a) Officers, Warrant Officers, Petty Officers, Non-Commissioned Officers and Men of the Royal Navy, Royal Marines, Royal Naval Air Service, Royal Indian Marine, Royal Naval Reserve (including Trawler and Fishery Sections), Royal Naval Volunteer Reserve, and Dominion and Colonial Naval Forces.
 - (b) Mercantile Marine Officers and men serving in His Majesty's Commissioned Ships and Auxiliaries under Special Naval Engagements (T.124 and its variants, including T.299).
 - (c) Officers and enrolled members of the Women's Royal Naval Service who proceeded and served overseas.
 - (d) Members of Queen Alexandra's Royal Naval Nursing Service and Royal Naval Nursing Service Reserve, and recognised official nursing organisations, who served in a hospital ship at sea or proceeded overseas and served in a Naval Hospital abroad.
 - (e) Canteen Staffs who have served in a ship of war at sea.
 - (f) Non-nursing members of medical units, *e.g.*, dispensers, storekeepers, clerks, wardmaids, etc., who served in a Hospital Ship at sea or proceeded overseas and served in a Naval Hospital abroad.
4. Desertion or dismissal with disgrace since the date of the qualifying service forfeits the decoration.
5. The decorations earned by Officers and men deceased will be issued to their legatees or next-of-kin entitled to receive them.
6. A further announcement as to the issue of the medals and riband will be made in due course, and no applications should be made pending such notification.

M.O. 3974.—"VICTORY MEDAL"—AWARD.

(C.W. 35482.—10/12/1919.)

His Majesty the King having been pleased to recognise by the grant of a distinctive medal the services rendered by His Majesty's Forces in operations of war since the 5th August, 1914, the following regulations for the award of the medal as regards the Navy are issued for information:

1. The medal, which will be designated the "Victory Medal," will be similar in design to that issued by the other Allied and Associated Powers for corresponding services, and will obviate the interchange of Allied Commemorative War Medals. It will be in bronze and will be attached to the riband by a ring. No clasp will be issued with it.
2. The riband will be red in the centre, with green and violet on each side shaded to form the colours of two rainbows.

3. Provided the claims are approved by the Admiralty, the medal will be granted to the under-mentioned classes who were mobilised and rendered approved service either (i) at sea between midnight the 4-5th August, 1914, and midnight 11-12th November, 1918, or (ii) on the establishment of a unit *within a theatre of military operations*:

- (a) All Officers and men of the R.N., R.M., R.N.A.S., R.I.M., R.N.R., R.N.V.R., R.N.A.S.B.R., and Dominion and Colonial Naval Forces. Trained pilots and observers and men of the R.N.A.S. employed in actual flying from Naval Air Stations at home on overseas patrols will be eligible.
- (b) Mercantile Marine Officers and men serving under special Naval engagements (Form T. 124 and its variants, including T. 299) in H.M. Ships of War and Commissioned Fleet Auxiliaries.
- (c) Members of Queen Alexandra's Royal Naval Nursing Service, and Royal Naval Nursing Service Reserve.
- (d) Officers and enrolled members of the W.R.N.S.
- (e) Canteen Staffs who served in a Ship of War at sea.

4. The following services are not approved as qualifying:

- (a) Service in Depot Ships, except those which go to sea; Boom Defence Vessels, Examination Vessels, and other craft employed on harbour service.
- (b) Service at Shore Bases and Depôts, except those within theatres of active military operations.
- (c) Services of a temporary and special nature at sea, or in theatres of military operations, *e.g.*, casual inspections and enquiries, purchase of material, trials, passage, etc.
- (d) Service at sea, subsequent to midnight 11-12th November, 1918, except in certain specified cases, with regard to which a further announcement will be made.

5. Desertion or dismissal with disgrace since the date of the qualifying service forfeits the decoration.

6. The decorations earned by Officers and men deceased will be issued to their legatees or next-of-kin entitled to receive them.

7. A further announcement as to the issue of the riband will be made in due course, and no application should be made pending such notification.

8. For the purposes of this Order the definition of "theatres of military operations" is as in Appendix A.

APPENDIX A.

For the purpose of this order, "theatres of Military Operations" are defined as under:

1. *Western European Theatre*.—To include all operations in
 - (a) France and Belgium, between midnight 4-5th August, 1914, and midnight 11-12th November, 1918.
 - (b) Italy, between midnight 17-18th April, 1917, and midnight 4-5th November, 1918.
2. *Balkan Theatre*.—To include all operations in
 - (a) Greek Macedonia, Serbia, Bulgaria and European Turkey, between midnight 4-5th October, 1915, and midnight 11-12th November, 1918.
 - (b) Gallipoli and islands of Aegean Sea, between midnight 24-25th April, 1915, and midnight 9-10th January, 1916.
Officers and men of the Plymouth and Chatham Battalions, R.M.L.I., who took part in the landing at Seddul Bahr and Kum Kale on the 4th March, 1915, are eligible.
3. *Russian Theatre*.—To include all operations in Russia since midnight 4-5th August, 1914.
4. *Egyptian Theatre*.—To include all operations
 - (a) In Egypt, between midnight 4-5th November, 1914, and midnight 18-19th March, 1916, but excluding operations for which the Sultan's Sudan Medal has been awarded.
 - (b) Conducted by the Egyptian Expeditionary Force, between midnight 18-19th March, 1916, and midnight 31st October-1st November, 1918, but excluding operations for which the Sultan's Sudan Medal has been awarded.
5. *African Theatre*.—To include all operations as set forth below but excluding local military operations against native tribes or rebels for which the African G.S. Medal is awarded—
 - (a) In British, German, and Portuguese East Africa, Nyasaland and Northern Rhodesia, between midnight 19-20th August, 1914, and midnight 25-26th November, 1918.
 - (b) In German South-West Africa and on the adjacent borders of the Union of South Africa, between midnight 19-20th August, 1914, and midnight 9-10th July, 1915.
 - (c) In Kamerun and on Eastern and Northern Frontiers of Nigeria, between midnight 23rd-24th August, 1914, and midnight 18-19th February, 1916.
 - (d) In Nigeria, between midnight 4-5th January, 1917, and midnight 15-16th May, 1917.
 - (e) In Togoland, between midnight 6-7th August, 1914, and midnight 26-27th August, 1914.
6. *Asiatic Theatre*.—To include all operations
 - (a) In Hedjaz, between midnight 4-5th November, 1914, and midnight 13-14th January, 1919.
 - (b) In Mesopotamia, from midnight 5-6th November, 1914.
 - (c) In Persia and in the Persian Gulf, from midnight 5-6th November, 1914.
 - (d) In trans-Caspia, from midnight 18-19th July, 1918.
 - (e) At Shaik Said (South-West Arabia), on 10th and 11th November, 1914, and at Perim on 14th and 15th June, 1915.
 - (f) Conducted by the Aden Field Force, between midnight 2nd-3rd July, 1915, and midnight 13-14th January, 1919.
 - (g) In the Frontier regions of India, carried out by forces which actually took the field between 5th August, 1914, and the 31st October, 1918.
 - (h) At Tsing-Tau, between midnight 22nd-23rd September, 1914, and midnight 7-8th November, 1914.
7. *Australasian Theatre*.—To include all operations against the German Pacific Dependencies as follows:
 - (a) New Britain, from midnight 10-11th September, 1914, to midnight 21st-22nd September, 1914.
 - (b) New Ireland, from midnight 15-16th September, 1914, to midnight 18-19th October, 1914.
 - (c) Kaiser Wilhelm-Land, on 24th September, 1914.
 - (d) Admiralty Islands, on 21st November, 1914.
 - (e) Nauru, on 6th November, 1914.
 - (f) German Samoa, on 29th August, 1914.

No. 1328.—In exercise of the powers vested in him by section 3 (iii) of "The Sanitary Boards Enactment, 1916," the Resident of Perak, with the approval of the Chief Secretary to Government, hereby appoints Mr. W. J. B. Ashby, Financial Assistant, Public Works Department, Perak, as Secretary, Sanitary Board, Kinta, for the purposes of the said Enactment, with effect from the 9th July, 1919.

"THE SOCIETIES ENACTMENT, 1913."

No. 1329.—It is hereby notified that "Sam Sing Koong," Gambang, Kuantan, has, by order of the Resident of Pahang, been registered under section 4, sub-section (vi), of "The Societies Enactment, 1913."

"THE VEHICLES ENACTMENT, 1912."

No. 1330.—THE following rules have been made by the Resident of Negri Sembilan under section 42 of "The Vehicles Enactment, 1912," with effect from the 1st January, 1920, in substitution for the rules published as Notification No. 318 of 31st January, 1913, and Notification No. 2182 of the 7th July, 1916:

1. Every cart or other vehicle when used for the conveyance of loose material such as stone, gravel, sand, bricks, billets of firewood and the like along a public road shall be closed at the front, back and sides in such a way that the material cannot fall on the roadway. The tail board shall be not less than 2½ feet high and shall fit securely into grooves in the sides of the cart. In the case of any two-wheeled cart the load of such material carried loose shall not exceed 54 cubic feet by measurement.

2. (i) No cart drawn by one bullock shall carry a load exceeding seven pikuls.

(ii) No cart drawn by two bullocks shall carry a load exceeding fifteen pikuls.

(iii) No cart drawn by four bullocks shall carry a load exceeding thirty pikuls.

(iv) No hand-cart shall be loaded so that the load exceeds five pikuls per man engaged in pulling or pushing the cart. No puller or pusher shall proceed at more than a slow walking pace.

(v) All carts except hand-carts shall be fitted with a brake sufficient by itself to hold the cart and load on a gradient of one foot in fifteen.

3. No timber or other material may be conveyed in any vehicle along a public road, unless it is properly secured so as not to trail upon, or otherwise damage, the road, or become a danger to the traffic.

4. No load over 16 feet in length may be conveyed along a public road in a two-wheeled vehicle.

5. No vehicle may be loaded so that the contents project over the sides of the wheels.

6. No driver of any licensed vehicle shall conceal or cover in any way, so as not to be plainly visible, the number of plate or plates of his cart when on any public road.

7. The yoke of a cart shall not exceed the gauge of the wheels.

8. Any person committing a breach of any of these rules will be liable on conviction to a fine not exceeding twenty-five dollars.

"THE VEHICLES ENACTMENT, 1912"—(cont.).

9. The following taxes and fees shall be payable on registration annually:

No. 1351.—SANITARY BOARD, KUALA LUMPUR.—

Minutes of an ordinary meeting of the Sanitary Board, Kuala Lumpur, held at the Sanitary Board Office on Thursday, the 22nd January, 1920, at 9.30 a.m.

PRESENT: Mr. F. E. Taylor (*Chairman*), the Health Officer (Dr. A. R. Wellington), the Protector of Chinese (Mr. W. T. Chapman), the Assistant Government Architect (Major W. S. Huxley), Mr. R. M. Skinner, Mr. R. Madge, Towkay Choo Kia Peng, and Haji Mohamed Taib.

ABSENT: The Chief Police Officer (Mr. H. M. Hatchell), the Superintendent, Revenue Surveys (Mr. H. R. Shaw), the Executive Engineer, Town (Mr. J. A. Swift), the Collector of Land Revenue (Mr. G. Hemmant), Towkay Khoo Keng Hooi, and Dr. E. T. MacIntyre.

1. Minutes of the previous meeting, having been circulated among the members, are taken as read, and confirmed.

2. Temporary Building: An application to erect a temporary shed on State land near Java Street Bridge for the storage of material for the building of Messrs. Whiteaway, Laidlaw's premises is approved.
3. River Walls: Referring to item No. 4 of minutes of meeting held on 3rd December, 1919, the Chairman informs the Board that the State Engineer considers that the river improvements below town should be carried out before the river walls in the town are extended. It is decided to refer the matter again to the State Engineer as to whether he would have any objection to an extension of the river wall at Malay Street for about 200 feet in order to obtain a wider road.
4. By-law: The Board agrees to recommend the following amendment to Sanitary Board by-law 91 relating to hawkers:
- After the word hawk in second line add "or expose for sale" and after "meat" in the same line add the word "fruit". For the word "about" in the third line substitute the word "in".
 - After the word "hawking" add the words "or sale", after the word "meat" add the words "or fruit".
5. Railway Bridge near Central Station: A letter from the General Manager, Railways, is read notifying action to be taken to reduce the height of the brick pillars at the base of the bridge near the railway station as suggested by the Board.
6. Butcher's Shops: The Board, in view of the favourable report on the two shops now carrying on business in High Street and Petaling Street, decides to make it known that it is prepared to receive applications for additional butcher's shops in suitable parts of Kuala Lumpur town.
7. Firewood Storage: An application by the British Asiatic Company to store firewood on vacant land belonging to the Singapore Cold Storage Company at the back of McArthur Street is approved.
8. Iron Foundry: An application to establish an iron foundry at Bukit Bintang Road is not approved, it being considered unsuitable for that locality.
9. Plan: Plan for Messrs. Whiteaway, Laidlaw & Co.'s premises for erection on lots 62-65, section 6, Java Street, is, subject to the exclusion of the septic tank, and instructions to be issued with regard to the alignment with adjoining buildings, approved.
10. Health Report: The Health Officer's report on the health of Kuala Lumpur for the month of December, 1919, is submitted:
- The population for the middle of November, 1919, is estimated at 66,916.
 - Births: During the month, 120 births were notified, giving uncorrected birth-rate of 21.52 per mille.
 - Deaths: The total number of deaths registered as having occurred within the Sanitary Board limits was 189, giving a crude death-rate of 33.89 per mille. The number of deaths among the resident population was 132, giving a corrected death-rate of 23.67 per mille. The corrected death-rate for the corresponding month of 1918 was 33.63 per mille. There were 30 deaths of infants under the age of one year. The infantile mortality figure (deaths under one year of age per 1,000 births) was 250.

The mean temperatures for the month were: 9 a.m., 80.97 degrees; 3 p.m., 83.83 degrees; 9 p.m., 76.23 degrees. The maximum temperature was 90 degrees on the 1st, 4th, 15th, 17th, 18th, 19th, 20th, 21st and 24th, and the lowest was 70 degrees on the 3rd, 10th, 16th, 18th, 21st, 22nd and 27th.
 - Ten samples of milk were sent to the Government Chemist for analysis during the month, one of which was found to be adulterated.
