#### "THE QUARANTINE AND PREVENTION OF DISEASE ENACTMENT, 1903."

No. 4077.—Contagious pleuro-pneumonia among goats having ceased to exist at Ipoh, the Resident of Perak hereby rescinds Notification No. 878, published in the *Federated Malay States Government Gazette* of the 10th February, 1922, regulating the movement of goats at Teluk Kruin in the mukim of Ulu Kinta.

No. 4078.—Rinderpest having ceased to exist at Batu Arang, Selangor, the Resident of Perak hereby rescinds Notification No. 2783, published in the *Federated Malay States Government Gazette* of the 5th May, 1922, prohibiting the importation of cattle from Selangor into Perak.

#### "THE RAILWAYS ENACTMENT, 1912."

No. 4079.—In exercise of the powers vested by section 27 of "The Railways Enactment, 1912," and with the approval of the Chief Secretary

Enactment, 1912," and with the approval of the Chief Secretary to Government, the Railway Administration hereby amends the rules published in the *Gazette* as Notification No. 5782 of the 26th November, 1921, as amended by Notification No. 1540 of the 10th day of March, 1922, with effect from 1st August, 1922, as follows:

Rule 28(a): Delete "Malay States Guides" in the 2nd line and "Federated Malay States" and "Straits Settlements" in the 2nd, 3rd and 8th lines.

#### No. 4080.-PRICE OF RUBBER.-

With reference to Notification No. 5778, published in the *Federated Malay States Government Gazette* of the 24th November, 1921, it is hereby notified that the price of rubber for the assessment of duty for the period 7th July to 13th July, 1922, inclusive, is twenty-five and a half cents per pound, this being two cents below the highest price obtained for first grade rubber at the Singapore auction during the week ending 29th June, 1922.
