No. 5329.—PRICE OF RUBBER.—

With reference to Notification No. 5778, published in the Federated Malay States Government Gazette of the 24th November, 1921, it is hereby notified that the price of rubber for the assessment of duty for the period 1st September to 7th September, 1922, inclusive, is twenty-two and one-fourth cents per pound, this being two cents below the highest price obtained for first grade rubber at the Singapore auction during the week ending 24th August, 1922.

CLEARING THE FLOOD CHANNEL OF KLANG RIVER.

Tenders will be received at the office of the State Engineer, Selangor, Kuala Lumpur, up to noon of the 4th September, 1922, for the work of clearing the flood channel of the Klang River for the second time. The work will be divided into three sections and tenders should be made for each section, namely:

1st section, 2nd mile bridge to Petaling bridge;

Petaling bridge to Sungei Way;

Sungei Way to 100 chains below Puchong bridge. 2nd ,,

The work will include cutting down to earth level, collecting and burning all grass, reeds, blukar and vegetation

over a width of five chains and should be completed within six weeks. Plans and specifications may be seen and all particulars obtained at the office of the Executive Engineer, District, at P.W.D. office, Kuala Lumpur, any working day between the hours of 9 a.m. and 3.30 p.m. (Saturdays 8 a.m. and 12 noon).
