"THE PASSPORT ENACTMENT, 1920."

No. 7325.—In exercise of the powers vested in him by section 2 of "The Passport Enactment, 1920," the Chief Secretary to Government hereby makes the following Regulations:

1. Applications for Passports must be made in the form printed in the schedule to these Regulations, and inclosed in a cover addressed to "The Passport Office, Federal Secretariat, Kuala Lumpur."

2. Applications should reach the Passport Office at least two clear days before the Passport is required. The Passport may be sent by post. Postage stamps and cheques will not be received in payment.

3. Passports are granted only to persons actually resident in the Federated Malay States, who are

- (1) natural-born British subjects; or
- (2) the wives and widows of such persons; or
- (3) naturalized in the United Kingdom, in the British Colonies, or in India.

A married woman is deemed to be a subject of the State of which her husband is for the time being a subject.

4. Passports are granted:

(1) In the case of natural-born British subjects, upon the production of a Declaration by the applicant in the form printed in the schedule to these Regulations, verified by a Declaration made by a member or official of any Banking Firm established in the Federated Malay States or by any Magistrate, Justice of the Peace, Minister of Religion, Registered Medical Practitioner, Advocate and Solicitor of the Supreme Court, or other person approved by the Chief Secretary, and resident in the Federated Malay States. The applicant's Certificate of Birth and other evidence may also be required.

(2) In the case of children under the age of 16 years requiring a separate Passport, upon production of a Declaration made by the child's parent or guardian, in the form, to be obtained upon application to the Federal Secretariat.

(3) In the case of naturalized persons upon the production of the Certificate of Naturalization and such other evidence as the Chief Secretary may direct.

5. Naturalized British subjects must make application in person to the Administrative Head of the District in which they reside and must attach their Certificate of Naturalization to their Declaration.

Naturalized British subjects will be described as such in their Passports, which will be issued subject to the necessary qualifications.

6. Passports are not available beyond two years from the date of issue. They may be renewed for four further periods of two years each, after which fresh Passports must be obtained. The fee for each Passport is \$5, and for each renewal \$2. Applications for renewal must be made in the form to be obtained upon application to the Federal Secretariat.

7. Passports cannot be sent out of the Colony or Malay Peninsula by post.

8. Two unmounted copies of the photograph of the applicant must accompany the application.

9. Only one Passport is required by a married man accompanied by his wife and children but the names and photograph of wife, and names, sex and ages of children must be furnished.

10. Under the heading "National Status," in the Passport the holder of the Passport will be described as follows:

(1) If a British-born subject,
 "British subject."

(2) If naturalized in the United Kingdom under the provisions of the Naturalization Act, 1870, or if naturalized in any part of His Majesty's Dominions under or by virtue of the provisions of the British Nationality and Status of Aliens Act, 1914,

"A naturalized British subject" [followed by the date of the certificate and the words *"of (.....) origin"*].

(3) If naturalized in a Dominion or Colony or in British India under the provisions of Dominion, Colonial, or Indian laws conferring limited naturalization only,

"A person of (.....) origin naturalized in (here insert name of Possession) by certificate dated (here insert date)."

11. Any person who

(a) forges, alters or tampers with any Passport or endorsement thereon or without lawful authority uses or has in his possession any such forged, altered or irregular Passport or any Passport with any such forged, altered or irregular endorsement; or

(b) personates, or falsely represents himself to be or not to be a person to whom such a Passport or such a Passport with such an endorsement has been duly issued, or, with intent to obtain any such Passport or such endorsement thereon, knowingly makes any false statement; or

(c) allows any other person to have possession of any such Passport issued for his use alone, or without lawful authority has in his possession any such Passport issued for the use of some person other than himself,

is guilty of an offence punishable with imprisonment for a term which may extend to six months or to a fine not exceeding eight hundred and fifty dollars or to both.

SCHEDULE.

APPLICATION FORM.

DECLARATION TO BE MADE BY APPLICANT FOR PASSPORT.

- (a) Insert name of place and date.
 (b) Christian names and surname of the applicant in full and present address.
 (c) In the case of a married woman or widow, the particulars of birth required are those of her husband or late husband—not of the applicant herself.
 (d) State whether a British-born subject or a naturalized British subject. In the case of a naturalized British subject see rule 5 at back.
 (e) Wife ^{and} _{or} children should only be included if they do not possess separate Passports. Strike out the sentence in other cases.
 Persons travelling in Asia must state the routes to be followed.
 (f) The words in brackets to be struck out and initialled in cases where the applicant has no previous Passport in his possession.
 (g) Signature.
 The applicant must also write a specimen of his signature in the space below marked *.
 The whole of the declaration and marginal particulars should be in the applicant's own handwriting.
 (h) Name and qualification of person verifying the declaration (see rule 4 at back), viz.:
 Magistrate, Justice of the Peace, Minister of Religion, Registered Medical Practitioner, Advocate and Solicitor of the Supreme Court, or person approved by the Chief Secretary, giving professional or business address.
 Recommendations from members or officials of *Banking Firms* should bear the printed stamp of the Bank here below.

* Specimen signature of applicant which will be detached and affixed to the Passport when issued.

In the case of children under the age of 16 years requiring a separate Passport, the Declaration must be made by the child's parent or guardian in a form to be obtained upon application to the Chief Secretary's Office.
