FEDERAL REVENUE.

10. The actual Federal revenue collected in 1913 was \$12,855,953.53 showing an excess of \$2,170,586.53 over the estimated amount and as it compared with 1912 it shows an increase of \$1,651,681.11 of which railway revenue contributes \$1,036,798.15.

EXPENDITURE.

11. The expenditure for the year amounted to \$47,287,580.64 showing a net excess of \$780,952.64 over the amount estimated and is thus detailed :
