“THE QUARANTINE AND PREVENTION OF DISEASE ENACTMENT, 1903.”

ORDER UNDER RULES 89 AND 90.

No. 4838.—Whereas rabies has appeared in the district of Sungei Besi the Resident of Selangor orders that, until further notice, all dogs out of doors within a radius of five miles of the Sungei Besi Police Station, shall be muzzled, or tied up or led on a chain.

Any dog found out of doors unmuzzled, or not tied up or led on a chain, is liable to be destroyed, and the owner or person in charge of such dog is liable on conviction to a fine not exceeding \$100.

Exportation of dogs from the above-mentioned area, except under written permit from the Government Veterinary Surgeon, is prohibited until further notice. [Sel. 1346/25.]

ORDER UNDER RULE 90 (i) OF THE RULES UNDER.

No. 4839.—Information having been received that rabies exists in Siam it is hereby ordered by the Resident of Perak that the importation of dogs into the State of Perak from Siam is prohibited until further notice. [Pk. 3600/25.]

No. 4840.—The Resident of Negri Sembilan hereby rescinds Notification No. 7736, published in the Supplement to the *Federated Malay States Government Gazette* of the 28th November, 1923, prohibiting the importation of dogs from the Settlement of Malacca into the State of Negri Sembilan.
