“THE RUBBER (RESTRICTION) ENACTMENT, 1924.”

No. 5148.—IN exercise of the powers vested in him by section 28 (i) of “The Rubber (Restriction) Enactment, 1924,” and of all other powers him thereto enabling, the Chief Secretary to Government makes the following amendments to the rules published in *Gazette* Notification No. 2841 of 29th April, 1924, to come into operation on the 1st day of August, 1925:

Rule 11 is amended by deleting the figure “400” in line 2 thereof and substituting therefor the figure 500.

Rule 15 is amended by deleting the figure “17” in line 4 thereof and substituting therefor the figure 18.

Rule 20 is amended by the addition thereto of the following sub-section:

20 (i) (*f*) On variation of the maximum standard production prescribed by rule 11.

No. 5149.—IN exercise of the powers vested in him by rule 14 of the rules published in the *Gazette*, Notification No. 2841 dated 29th April, 1924, the Chief Secretary to Government has been pleased to grant in respect of the quarter 1st August, 1925, to 31st October, 1925, an additional exportable allowance of three katis a month on each of the first five acres of mature rubber on holdings of 25 acres and under.

No. 5150.—All Officers, Petty Officers and men on the active or retired list of the Royal Navy, Royal Marines, Royal Naval Reserve and Royal Naval Volunteer Reserve, who take up their residence in the Federated Malay States, or who have taken up their residence in the Federated Malay States since the 1st January, 1925, are requested to forward to the Under Secretary to Government, Federated Malay States, Kuala Lumpur, their names, rank, seniority and special qualifications, if any, together with their present addresses, and to keep the Government advised of any change of address.
