THE COLONIAL AUXILIARY FORCES OFFICERS' DECORATION.

George the Fifth by the Grace of God of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and of the British Dominions beyond the Seas King Defender of the Faith Emperor of India to all to whom these Presents shall come, Greeting!

WHEREAS by Warrant under Our Royal Sign Manual dated the ninth day of June one thousand nine hundred and twenty-one we were graciously pleased to make ordain and establish Rules and Ordinances for the Government of The Colonial Auxiliary Forces Officers' Decoration reserving to Ourselves Our Heirs and Successors full power of annulling altering abrogating augmenting interpreting or dispensing with those regulations or any part thereof by a notification under Our Royal Sign Manual:

AND WHEREAS We are desirous that those upon whom the said Decoration has been or may be conferred shall be entitled to the addition after their names of the letters V.D.:

NOW THEREFORE We do by these Presents for Us Our Heirs and Successors make ordain and establish the following additional Rule and Ordinance:

It is ordained that the Colonial Auxiliary Forces Officers' Decoration shall not confer any individual precedence but shall entitle the recipient to the addition after his name of the letters V.D.

Given at Our Court at Saint James's this ninth day of May one thousand nine hundred and twenty-five in the sixteenth year of Our Reign.

No. 5438.—The following Enactment, passed at a meeting of the Federal Council held on the 29th June, 1925, is published for general information :

FEDERATED MALAY STATES.

ENACTMENT No. 6 OF 1925.

An Enactment to amend "The Customs Enactment, 1923."

IT is hereby enacted by the Rulers of the Federated Malay States in Council as follows :

1. This Enactment may be cited as "The Customs (Amendment) Enactment, 1925," and shall come into force upon the publication thereof in the *Gazette*. Short title and commencement.

2. Paragraph (f) of section 111 of "The Customs Enactment, 1923," hereinafter called the principal Enactment, is amended by inserting the words "or restricted" immediately after the word "prohibited" in line 2 thereof. Amendment of section 111.

3. Immediately after section 114 of the principal Enactment there is inserted a new section as follows: New section 114A.

114A. (i) If any vessel shall hover within the waters adjacent to any of the Federated Malay States for the purpose of receiving any dutiable goods upon which the export duty has not been paid or any prohibited or restricted goods exported contrary to any prohibition or restriction the master and every member of the crew of such vessel shall be guilty of an offence against this Enactment and the Proper Officer of Customs may board and seize such vessel. Hovering.

(ii) Every vessel hovering within the waters adjacent to any of the Federated Malay States shall be presumed, until the contrary is proved, to be hovering for the purpose of receiving dutiable goods upon which the export duty has not been paid or prohibited or restricted goods exported contrary to a prohibition or restriction.

4. Section 125 of the principal Enactment is amended by inserting after paragraph (o), the following new paragraph: Amendment of section 125.

"(o¹) to prescribe the flag to be flown by vessels employed for the prevention of smuggling;"

ENACTMENT No. 10 OF 1925.

An Enactment to repeal and re-enact with amendments "The Deleterious Drugs Enactment, 1911."

IT is hereby enacted by the Rulers of the Federated Malay States in Council as follows:

Short title
and
commencement.

1. (i) This Enactment may be cited as "The Deleterious Drugs Enactment, 1925," and shall come into force upon the publication thereof in the *Gazette*.

Repeal.

(ii) On the coming into force of this Enactment the Enactments specified in the schedule hereto shall be repealed but such repeal shall not affect the validity of any licence granted under any of the Enactments hereby repealed, and all orders and notifications made under any of these Enactments shall in so far as they are not inconsistent with the provisions of this Enactment be deemed to have been made under this Enactment.

Interpretation.

2. In this Enactment the following words and expressions shall have the meaning hereinafter in this section assigned to them respectively:

"Deleterious drugs" means and includes:

(a) Morphine, cocaine, eucaine, ecgonine, and diamorphine (commonly known as heroine), and their respective salts, and medicinal opium, and any preparation, admixture, extract or other substance containing not less than one-fifth per centum of morphine or one-tenth per centum of cocaine, eucaine, ecgonine or diamorphine. For the purpose of the foregoing provision, the percentage in the case of morphine shall be calculated as in respect of anhydrous morphine.

(b) Any drug which the Chief Secretary to Government, on the recommendation of the Principal Medical Officer, and after consultation with the Residents, shall have declared by notification in the *Gazette*, to be a deleterious drug suitable to be dealt with under the provisions of this Enactment and any salts or solution of any such drug:

but does not include

(c) Any drug or patent or proprietary article which may from time to time be exempted from the operation of this Enactment by the Chief Secretary to Government by notification in the *Gazette*.

"Medical practitioner" means a medical practitioner whose name is on the register of medical practitioners kept by the Medical Council of the Straits Settlements and Federated Malay States or by the Medical Council of Great Britain.

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“Chemist and druggist” means a chemist and druggist holding a certificate of competent skill and knowledge granted under the provisions of any of the Enactments hereby repealed or which has before the commencement of this Enactment been accepted under any of those Enactments as a sufficient certificate and which has not in either of these cases been subsequently cancelled or revoked or any such certificate granted by the Council of the Straits Settlements and Federated Malay States Government Medical School or by such legally constituted Pharmaceutical authorities of any country as may to the Chief Secretary seem fitting: provided always that no certificate shall be deemed sufficient which has been granted to the holder without examination or which he has obtained without first having received a systematic training as a chemist and druggist.

“Dentist” means any person who shall for a period of six months have been engaged in *bona fide* practice of dentistry in the Federated Malay States or in the Colony and whom the Chief Secretary to Government on the recommendation of the Principal Medical Officer permits to be licensed under this Enactment.

“Dentist” shall also mean such person as, on the recommendation of the Principal Medical Officer, the Chief Secretary to Government shall grant a permit to under this Enactment for a period of six months in order to qualify for the issue of a licence.

“Veterinary surgeon” means any person who holds a diploma of membership of the Royal College of Veterinary Surgeons of England and includes a person holding any diploma of a British, British-Colonial, British-Indian, or Japanese School of Veterinary Science which the Chief Secretary to Government may accept as a sufficient diploma for the purposes of this Enactment.

“Licensed” means licensed under this Enactment.

“Syringe” includes serum and other syringes capable of being used for the purpose of injecting deleterious drugs and any parts of such syringes.

“Official dose” means an official dose as laid down in the British Pharmacopœia published in accordance with the provisions of the Act passed in the 21st and 22nd of the reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria Chapter 90, and shortly cited as “The Medical Act, 1858.”

“Corresponding law” means any law stated in a certificate purporting to be issued by or on behalf of the Government of any country outside the Federated Malay States to be a law providing for the control and regulation in that country of the manufacture, sale, use, export and import of drugs in accordance with the provisions of the International Opium Convention signed at the Hague on the 23rd day of January nineteen hundred and twelve, and any statement in any such certificate as to the effect of the law mentioned in the certificate or any statement in any certificate that any facts constitute an offence against that law shall be conclusive.

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"Officers qualified to search" mean the Principal Medical Officer, Federated Malay States, and any licensing officer, and any medical officer authorised in writing by the Principal Medical Officer or by a licensing officer, and every officer of police not below the rank of Inspector, and every senior officer of Customs within the meaning of "The Customs Enactment, 1923."

3. (i) No person not duly licensed in that behalf shall manufacture any morphine or cocaine, or any salts thereof, and no manufacture thereof shall be carried on by a licensed person in any house, factory or place other than a house, factory or place specified therefor in his licence or otherwise than in conformity with all the conditions of such licence.

(ii) Licences for such manufacture may be issued by the Principal Medical Officer, Federated Malay States, who may in his discretion limit any such licence to the manufacture of morphine or of cocaine or of such salts thereof as may be specified in the licence and may subject the licence to such conditions, to be expressed therein, as he may think fit.

(iii) For every such licence a fee shall be payable at such rate as the Chief Secretary to Government shall from time to time either generally or in particular cases prescribe.

(iv) No person not licensed under this section shall knowingly keep or have in his possession any apparatus for manufacturing morphine, cocaine or any salts thereof

(v) Any licence issued under this section may be cancelled at any time by the Principal Medical Officer for breach of any condition to which the same is subject or of any provision of this Enactment or of the rules made thereunder.

4. (i) Subject to this section, the exclusive right of importing and of exporting deleterious drugs and syringes is hereby vested in the Principal Medical Officer.

(ii) Any licensed medical practitioner or licensed chemist and druggist may deliver to the Principal Medical Officer, for transmission to any person or firm outside the Federated Malay States to whom or to which the same is addressed a written order to forward to the Principal Medical Officer at the cost of and for the use of such licensed medical practitioner or licensed chemist and druggist, deleterious drugs and syringes as specified in the said order.

(iii) Every such order shall be delivered to the Principal Medical Officer in duplicate and both the original and duplicate thereof shall be authenticated by the signature of the licensed medical practitioner or licensed chemist and druggist delivering the same.

(iv) The Principal Medical Officer, unless he is of opinion that the quantities specified in any such order are excessive, or that such order otherwise needs revision or alteration, in which case he may return it for such revision or alteration to the licensed medical practitioner or licensed chemist and druggist by whom it was delivered, shall sign both the original and the duplicate of the order, retain the original and, subject to

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prepayment of the cost of transmission by the licensed medical practitioner or licensed chemist and druggist concerned, forward the duplicate to the person to whom it is addressed.

(v) On the receipt by the Principal Medical Officer of any package or consignment appearing to be sent in compliance with an order forwarded under sub-section (iv), the Principal Medical Officer may before delivery thereof to the person, for whose use the same appears to be intended, open such package or consignment and examine the contents thereof and in case the contents include deleterious drugs not covered by any order previously forwarded under sub-section (iv) may request from the licensed medical practitioner or licensed chemist and druggist for whose use the package or consignment appears to be intended such explanation thereof as he is in a position to give.

(vi) Nothing herein shall prevent medical officers of His Majesty's Army and Navy respectively who are resident in the Federated Malay States on full pay from importing and exporting deleterious drugs and syringes in the course of their duty.

5. (i) The Principal Medical Officer, Federated Malay States, and any medical officer appointed by him with the approval of the Resident of any State to be a licensing officer under this Enactment in and for such State or in and for any specified district or districts in such State may issue to any such person as he thinks fit, being either a medical practitioner, a chemist and druggist, a dentist, or a veterinary surgeon, a licence of any of the following kinds:

Issue of
licences.

- (a) to a medical practitioner, veterinary surgeon, or chemist and druggist, a licence to possess, use and sell deleterious drugs and syringes;
- (b) to a dentist a licence to possess and use deleterious drugs and syringes in the course of his profession as a dentist;
- (c) to a *bona fide* dresser employed in a hospital, whether Government or private, who has satisfied the licensing officer of his fitness to possess the same, a licence to possess and use deleterious drugs in the course of his employment.

(ii) Any such licence shall be subject to such limitations and conditions as may be expressed therein and shall be good for the whole of the Federated Malay States, but may be cancelled or revoked at any time in his discretion by the Principal Medical Officer subject to appeal to the Chief Secretary to Government. All licences issued shall, unless previously cancelled or revoked, expire on the 31st day of December of the year in which they are issued.

(iii) A fee of twenty dollars shall be paid for each licence.

6. (i) Every licensing officer shall keep a register of licences issued by him in which every licence shall be numbered consecutively, as of the year in respect of which it is issued, commencing with the number one (1). Such register shall show the particulars of every licence including the particulars of any special conditions or limitations imposed under section 5 of this

DELETERIOUS DRUGS.

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Enactment, and there shall be noted therein in the event of the revocation or cancellation of any licence, the date of such revocation or cancellation.

(ii) Every licensing officer shall as soon as conveniently may be after any entry is made in such register forward to the Principal Medical Officer a true copy of the entry.

(iii) Any office copy or extract from a register kept under this section certified by a licensing officer under his hand to be a true copy or extract shall be prima facie evidence of the facts recorded therein.

7. (i) The Principal Medical Officer shall in or about the month of February in each year and more often if he shall think necessary cause to be printed and published in the *Gazette* correct lists of all persons licensed under this Enactment with the nature of the licence or licences granted to each such person.

(ii) In such lists the names of licensees shall be arranged in alphabetical order according to the surname or seh in the case of persons using a surname or seh and in the case of others according to the personal name, which must in the latter case be followed by the name of the father of the licensee. The list must also shew the place or places of business of the licensee and his residence if different.

(iii) Every list so published over the name of the Principal Medical Officer shall be evidence that the persons therein named are licensed under this Enactment as therein stated and the absence of any name from such list shall be evidence until the contrary is proved that such person is not licensed under this Enactment.

8. (i) Every licensing officer may apply to purchase any article advertised for sale or exposed for sale or on sale, which he knows or has reason to believe to consist of or contain any deleterious drug, and the person in possession or in charge of such article shall supply such article to him and shall not charge more than the advertised or a reasonable price therefor.

(ii) The licensing officer making any such purchase may select the actual case, bottle or package which he requires, or may demand to be served from any receptacle pointed out by him, and the person in possession or charge shall comply with such requirement or demand.

(iii) Any person who without reasonable excuse contravenes any provisions of this section shall be liable to a fine not exceeding five hundred dollars.

(iv) A licensing officer purchasing any article with the intention of submitting the same to analysis shall immediately on completion of the purchase

(a) notify to the seller or his agent selling the article his intention to have the same analysed;

(b) divide the same into three parts;

(c) mark and seal or fasten up each one of the parts in such manner as its nature will permit.

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(d) deliver one of the parts to the seller or his agent and another to the Government Chemist for analysis; and

(e) retain the third part for comparison.

9. (i) Every licensing officer, every Inspector of Weights and Measures and any person authorised in writing by the Principal Medical Officer may at all reasonable times inspect all weights, measures and instruments for weighing used by or in the possession of any person or on any premises for use for weighing deleterious drugs.

(ii) Any person who on demand made by a licensing officer, Inspector of Weights and Measures or person otherwise authorised neglects or refuses to produce for inspection any such weights, measures or instruments for weighing used by him or in his possession, or on his premises, or refuses to permit the licensing officer, Inspector of Weights and Measures or person otherwise authorised to examine or remove for examination the same, shall be liable to a fine not exceeding fifty dollars, and for a second or subsequent offence to a fine not exceeding one hundred dollars.

10. Subject to section 4, every person shall be guilty of an offence who

(a) Imports any deleterious drug or syringe.

(b) Exports any deleterious drug or syringe.

11. (i) Every person shall be guilty of an offence who

Keeping or
using a place

drugs.

(a) being the occupier of any house or place and not being a licensed medical practitioner or a licensed chemist and druggist or a licensed veterinary surgeon keeps or uses such house or place for the purpose of the administration of a deleterious drug to a human being; or

(b) being the owner or occupier of any house or place permits such house or place to be used for the purpose of the administration of a deleterious drug to a human being by any person other than a licensed medical practitioner or a licensed chemist and druggist or a licensed veterinary surgeon or a person acting under the directions of any such licensed person.

(ii) A house or place shall be deemed to be used for the purpose of the administration of a deleterious drug if it is used for that purpose even on one occasion only.

(iii) A person shall be deemed to be the occupier of a house or place if he has the use temporarily or otherwise, or if he has or appears to have the care or management of such house or place.

(iv) If any syringe or deleterious drug suitable for hypodermic injection is found in any house or place, or upon any person therein, it shall be presumed until the contrary is proved that the house or place is used for the purpose of the administration of a deleterious drug to a human being, and that the occupier permits such house or place to be used for such purpose.

12. (i) When any person has been convicted of an offence under section 11, not being the owner of the house or place in respect of which the offence was committed, the Chief Police Officer shall cause notice thereof in the English, Malay, Chinese, and Tamil languages to be served on the owner of such house or place.

(ii) If the owner is not known the said notice shall be served on the person inscribed in the books kept under any Sanitary Board Enactment for the time being in force as the owner of such house or place, and such person shall be deemed to be the owner of such house or place for the purposes of this Enactment.

(iii) Where the name of the owner is not known a notice addressed to the "owner" of the house or place, without further description, shall be deemed to be sufficiently addressed.

(iv) Where the address of the owner is not known, the notice may be served by being affixed to any outer door or window or any conspicuous part of the house or place in respect of which the offence was committed.

(v) If within a period of six months from the date of service of such notice the house or place in respect of which the notice was given is used for the purpose of the administration of a deleterious drug to a human being, it shall be presumed until the contrary is proved that such house or place was used for the said purpose with the permission of the owner thereof.

13. No person other than a licensed person or the servant of a licensed person acting with the knowledge and under the direction and control of such licensed person may have in his possession—

(a) any deleterious drug in quantity exceeding twelve official doses;

(b) any mixture adapted for swallowing or injecting which contains more than twelve official doses of any deleterious drug or which contains one or more deleterious drugs in quantity exceeding in the aggregate twelve official doses.

14. (i) Every person licensed under this Enactment shall at all times keep proper books in the English language showing such particulars of all deleterious drugs purchased, sold, and in stock as are prescribed, and shall forward copies of such books every quarter to the Principal Medical Officer.

(ii) Every person who fails to comply with sub-section (i) shall be liable to a fine not exceeding two thousand five hundred dollars.

(iii) Every person licensed under this Enactment who is found in possession or control of a greater or less quantity of deleterious drugs than he ought to be according to such books shall be liable to a fine not exceeding two thousand five hundred dollars: provided that he shall not be held liable for any deficiency which he proves to have been caused by evaporation or loss in weighing or measuring or by leakage, breakage or other accident.

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15. Every person or licensed dresser other than a licensed medical practitioner or a licensed dentist, or a person acting under the directions of a licensed medical practitioner, shall be guilty of an offence who administers any deleterious drug to any person.

Administration of deleterious drug to others.

16. (i) Every person shall be guilty of an offence who

(a) administers to himself or suffers any other person, not being a medical practitioner or a licensed dentist, or a person acting under the directions of a medical practitioner, to administer to him any deleterious drug; or

Self administration of deleterious drug.

(b) is found in any house or place kept or used for the purpose specified in section 11 (i).

(ii) Any person guilty of an offence under this section shall be liable to a fine not exceeding fifty dollars.

17. Every person other than a licensed medical practitioner, licensed veterinary surgeon, or licensed chemist and druggist shall be guilty of an offence who sells, keeps for sale, exposes or offers for sale, or furnishes to any person any deleterious drug or syringe.

Sale of deleterious drug or syringe.

18. Any person who is guilty of an offence under sections 3, 10, 11, 13, 15 or 17 shall be liable to a fine not exceeding one thousand dollars, or to imprisonment of either description for a term which may extend to six months or to both, and for a second or subsequent offence to a fine not exceeding two thousand dollars or to imprisonment of either description for a term which may extend to twelve months or to both.

Penalty.

19. (i) Any Court before which a person is convicted of an offence under sections 3, 10, 11, 13, 15 or 17 and sentenced to pay a fine may order the finger impressions of such person to be taken in the presence of such officer of the Court as is specified in the order.

Finger impressions of offenders.

(ii) A statement in any certificate purporting to be signed by the officer having the custody of the records of any Court, and sealed with the seal of the Court, that a person named therein has been convicted before such Court of an offence against this Enactment or against any particular provision of this Enactment, and that the finger prints which appear on such certificate are those of the person so convicted shall be evidence of the facts so stated.

20. (i) No person shall sell any deleterious drug or syringe unless

Supply of deleterious drugs and syringes.

(a) the receiver is the holder of a licence under section 5 of this Enactment, or is a ship surgeon: provided that in the latter case the prescription or order is signed by the ship surgeon and is endorsed by the captain or local agent of the ship; or

(b) the deleterious drug or syringe is furnished upon a written prescription or order dated and signed by a registered medical practitioner; and

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- (c) the prescription or order also specifies
 - (i) the name and address of the person for whose use the prescription or order is given;
 - (ii) the name and total amount of the drug or the total number of syringes to be sold; and
 - (iii) if required to be sold more than once, the number of times, not exceeding three, and the intervals at which the drug may be supplied.
- (ii) In the case of a sale under sub-section (i) the following conditions must be fulfilled:
 - (a) the seller must be reasonably satisfied that the signature affixed to the prescription or order is in fact the signature of the person purporting to sign it, and that the person is a registered medical practitioner or a ship surgeon;
 - (b) the seller must make or cause to be made an entry in a book to be kept for that purpose containing the date of the sale, the name and address of the receiver, the name and quantity of the article sold, and, in the case of a sale to a ship surgeon or upon a prescription or order, the signature of the receiver or the words "signed order" followed by the name of the registered medical practitioner and the date upon which the drug or syringe is sold;
 - (c) the seller must retain the prescription or order and preserve it for a period of two years; and
 - (d) the drug or syringe, if sent by post, must be sent by registered post.

Provided that if a seller is reasonably satisfied that a registered medical practitioner desiring to purchase a deleterious drug or syringe urgently requires it for the purpose of his profession, but is by reason of some urgency, unable, before delivery, either to furnish to the seller an order in writing duly signed, or to attend and sign the said book, the seller may send the deleterious drug or syringe to the purchaser to be handed over to him either in exchange for such an order or on an undertaking by the purchaser to furnish such an order to the seller within the twenty-four hours next following:

Provided also that if any purchaser by whom any such undertaking as aforesaid has been given fails to deliver to the seller a signed order in accordance with the undertaking, or if any person for the purpose of obtaining delivery of any deleterious drug or syringe under the foregoing proviso makes a statement which is to his knowledge false, he shall be deemed to have committed an offence against this Enactment.

(iii) No prescription or order which includes any deleterious drug shall be available for use upon more than one occasion, unless the prescription or order shall so specify, in which case it shall be available on not more than three occasions, and at the intervals specified in the prescription or order.

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(iv) Every person dispensing a deleterious drug upon a prescription shall enter on the prescription by stamp or in writing in an indelible manner the name of the holder of the licence under which such deleterious drug is dispensed and the date of the dispensing.

(v) Any person who contravenes this section shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable to a fine not exceeding one thousand dollars or to imprisonment of either description for a term which may extend to six months or to both, and for a second or subsequent offence to a fine not exceeding two thousand dollars or to imprisonment of either description for a term which may extend to twelve months or to both.

(vi) In this section the word "seller" shall include "supplier" and the word "sale" shall include "supply".

21. Any person

- (a) who acts in contravention of or fails to comply with the conditions of any licence issued under this Enactment; or
- (b) who, for the purpose of obtaining whether for himself or for any other person, the issue or renewal of any licence, makes any declaration or statement which is false in any particular, or knowingly makes use of any such declaration or statement or document containing the same; or
- (c) who acts in contravention of or fails to comply with any rule made under this Enactment; or
- (d) who wilfully supplies false information as to any particulars required to be entered in any book kept under this Enactment or under any rule made thereunder; or
- (e) who enters in any book kept under this Enactment or under any rule made thereunder, false information as to any particulars prescribed to be entered therein; or
- (f) who in the Federated Malay States aids or abets within the meaning of the Penal Code the commission in any place outside the Federated Malay States of any offence punishable under the provisions of any corresponding law in force in that place, or does any act preparatory to or in furtherance of any act, which if committed in the Federated Malay States would constitute an offence against this Enactment;

General penalties.

shall be liable on conviction to a fine not exceeding two thousand five hundred dollars or to imprisonment of either description for a term not exceeding two years or to both such fine and imprisonment.

22. (i) Any police officer and any Customs officer may arrest without warrant

Powers of arrest.

- (a) any person found committing or attempting to commit or employing or aiding any person to commit an offence under this Enactment; or

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- (b) any person whom he reasonably suspects to have in his possession any article liable to forfeiture under this Enactment.

(ii) Every person so arrested shall, together with any article as to which an offence may have been committed or attempted to be committed, be taken to a police station.

When search
may be without
warrant.

23. The Principal Medical Officer and any licensing officer and any medical officer authorised in writing by the Principal Medical Officer or a licensing officer and every officer of police not below the rank of Inspector is hereby empowered, by night or by day, without a warrant

- (a) to enter, if need be by force, any premises occupied by a licensed person, and there to search for, take samples of, and examine stocks of deleterious drugs and syringes; and
- (b) to inspect, examine and make copies of entries in books prescribed to be kept by rules under this Enactment; and
- (c) to seize and detain any books or documents directly or indirectly relating to or connected with any transaction or dealing which is, or any intended transaction or dealing which would if carried out be an offence under this Enactment, or in the case of a transaction or dealing carried out or intended to be carried out in any place outside the Federated Malay States to be an offence against the provisions of any corresponding law in force in that place.

Search warrant.

24. Whenever it appears to any Magistrate upon the oath of any person that there is reasonable cause to believe that

- (a) any deleterious drugs or syringes are, in contravention of the provisions of this Enactment or any rules made thereunder, in the possession or under the control, of any person in any premises; or
- (b) that any books or documents directly or indirectly relating to or connected with any transaction or dealing which is, or any intended transaction or dealing which would if carried out be an offence under this Enactment, or in the case of a transaction or dealing carried out or intended to be carried out in any place outside the Federated Malay States an offence against the provisions of any corresponding law in force in that place, are in the possession or under the control of any person in any premises;

he may by his warrant directed to any officer qualified to search, empower such officer by night or by day

- (i) to enter if need be by force, the premises named in the warrant and to search the premises and any persons found therein; and

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- (ii) if there is reasonable ground for suspecting that an offence under this Enactment has been committed in relation to any such drugs or syringes which may be found in the premises or that any books or documents which may be so found are such books or documents as aforesaid, to seize and detain those drugs, books or documents and to arrest any person in such premises whom such officer reasonably suspects to have committed or attempted to commit or abetted the commission of an offence under this Enactment;

- (iii) such officer may, if necessary,

- (a) break open any outer or inner door of such dwelling house, shop or other building or place and enter therein;
- (b) forcibly enter such place and every part thereof;
- (c) remove by force any obstruction to such entry, search, seizure and removal as he is empowered to effect;
- (d) detain every person found in such place until such place has been searched.

25. (i) Any person who

- (a) refuses any officer access to any place or vessel;
- (b) obstructs or hinders him in effecting any entrance which he is entitled to effect under this Enactment, or in making any inspection or search authorised by this Enactment, or in the execution of any duty imposed or power conferred by this Enactment; or
- (c) refuses or neglects to give any information which may reasonably be required of him and which he has in his power to give,

shall be liable to a fine not exceeding five hundred dollars.

- (ii) Any person who furnishes as true information which he knows or has reason to believe to be false shall be guilty of an offence under section 177 of the Penal Code.

26. All deleterious drugs, syringes, books or documents in respect of which any offence under this Enactment or any breach of the restrictions or conditions subject to or upon which any licence has been granted, has been or is being committed, and all deleterious drugs and syringes found without an apparent owner, together with the receptacle and packages in which such deleterious drugs or syringes are found shall, upon conviction of any person of such offence or breach, be forfeited, and in any other case may be forfeited if the Court so directs.

Forfeiture.

27. (i) Every offence under this Enactment may be tried by a Court of a Magistrate of the First Class, and any such Court may, notwithstanding anything in the Courts Enactment 1918 award the full punishment and enforce the forfeitures provided by this Enactment.

(i) Any person licensed under this Enactment who would be liable under this Enactment or any rules made thereunder to any punishment, penalty or forfeiture for any act, omission, neglect or default shall be liable to the same punishment, penalty or forfeiture for every such act, omission, neglect or default, of any agent or servant employed by him in the course of his business as such licensed person if such act, omission, neglect or default is committed by such agent or servant in the course of his employment by such licensed person.

Liability of

(ii) Every agent or servant employed by a person licensed under this Enactment in the course of his business as such licensed person shall also be liable to every punishment, penalty or forfeiture provided by this Enactment or any rules made thereunder for such acts, omissions, neglects or defaults as fully and effectually as if such agent or servant had been the person licensed.

Protection of
informers from
discovery.

29. (i) Except as hereinafter mentioned, no witness in any civil or criminal proceedings shall be obliged or permitted to disclose the name or address of any informer or the substance of the information received from him or to state any matter which may lead to his discovery.

(ii) If any books, documents or papers which are in evidence, or liable to inspection in any civil or criminal proceeding whatsoever contain any entry in which any informer is named or described or which might lead to his discovery, the Court shall cause all such passages to be concealed from view or to be obliterated so far as may be necessary to protect the informer from discovery but no further.

(iii) If on the trial for any offence against this Enactment the Court after full enquiry into the case believes that the informer wilfully made in his complaint a material statement which he knew or believed to be false or did not believe to be true, or if in any other proceeding the Court is of opinion that justice cannot be fully done between the parties thereto without the discovery of the informer, it shall be lawful for the Court to require the production of the original complaint if in writing, and permit enquiry and require full disclosure concerning the informer.

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30. On any trial before any Court of a Magistrate and in any proceeding on appeal in the Supreme Court relating in any of the above cases to the seizure of articles subject to forfeiture under this Enactment it shall be lawful for the said Court, and the said Court is hereby required to proceed to such trials and to the hearing of such appeals, on the merits of the case only, without references to matters of form and without enquiring into the manner or form of making any seizure except in so far as the manner and form of seizure may be evidence on such merits.

Manner of seizure not to be enquired into on trial before Court of Magistrate or on appeal to Supreme Court.

31. It shall be lawful for the Chief Secretary to Government, after consultation with the Principal Medical Officer and the Residents, from time to time to make rules

Rules.

- (a) prescribing the books to be kept by licensed chemists and druggists relating to the sale and purchase by them of deleterious drugs and syringes and the entries to be made therein and the time and manner of making such entries;
- (b) prescribing the periodical returns to be furnished by licensed chemists and druggists of the sale and purchase of deleterious drugs and syringes by them and by all licensed persons of the stock of deleterious drugs and syringes in their possession;
- (c) prescribing forms of licences and permits to be used under this Enactment;
- (d) prescribing the books to be kept by persons importing and exporting deleterious drugs relating to such importation or exportation and by persons manufacturing morphine or cocaine or any salts thereof relating to such manufacture, and the entries to be made therein and the time and manner of making such entries;
- (e) prescribing the periodical returns to be furnished by persons licensed to manufacture morphine or cocaine or any salts thereof relating to the amounts of morphine or of cocaine or of any salts thereof manufactured by them and the manner in which and the persons to whom the same have been disposed of and any other matters which may seem to the Chief Secretary to Government expedient to be included in such return;
- (f) generally to carry out the provisions of this Enactment.

32. (i) The Principal Medical Officer and any licensing officer and any person authorised in writing by one of the said officers may appear and be heard in the prosecution of any offence punishable under this Enactment.

Prosecutions.

(ii) In all prosecutions under this Enactment the onus of proving that any deleterious drug or syringe found in the possession of the accused was not in his possession contrary to the provisions of this Enactment, shall be on the accused.

DELETERIOUS DRUGS.

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Provision as to
action.

33. (i) No action shall be brought against any person for anything done or *bona fide* intended to be done in the exercise or supposed exercise of the powers given by this Enactment or by any rules made hereunder:

(a) without giving such person one month's previous notice in writing of the intended action and the cause thereof;

(b) after the expiration of three months from the date of the accrual of the cause of action;

(c) after tender of sufficient amends.

(ii) In every action so brought it shall be expressly alleged that the defendant acted either maliciously or negligently and without reasonable or probable cause and if at the trial the plaintiff shall fail to prove such allegation judgment shall be given for the defendant.

(iii) Though judgment shall be given for the plaintiff in any such action such plaintiff shall not have costs against the defendant unless the Court before which the action is tried shall certify its approbation of the action.

Whereas there was this day read at the Board a representation from the Judicial Committee of the Privy Council in the words following, viz.:

“The Lords of the Judicial Committee having taken into consideration the Practice and Procedure in accordance with which the general Appellate Jurisdiction of Your Majesty in Council is now exercised and being of opinion that the Rules regulating the said Practice and Procedure ought to be amended Their Lordships do hereby agree humbly to recommend to Your Majesty that with a view to such amendment certain Orders in Council regulating the said Practice and Procedure, viz., the Orders in Council dated respectively the 21st day of December, 1908, (a) the 23rd day of May, 1916, (b) the 25th day of March, 1920, (c) the 9th day of March, 1921, (d) and the 15th day of March, 1922, (e) amending the said Practice and Procedure ought to be revoked as from the 1st day of January, 1926, and that the several Rules hereunto annexed ought to be substituted therefor and ought to come into operation on that date.”

His Majesty having taken the said representation into consideration was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve thereof and to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the said Orders in Council in the said representation mentioned be and the same are hereby revoked as from the 1st day of January, 1926, and that the Rules hereunto annexed be substituted therefor to come into operation on that date.

“Record” means the aggregate of papers relating to an Appeal (including the pleadings, proceedings, evidence and judgments) proper to be laid before His Majesty in Council on the hearing of the Appeal;

“Registrar” means the Registrar or other proper officer having the custody of the records in the Court appealed from;

“Abroad” means the country or place where the Court appealed from is situate;

“Agent” means a person qualified by virtue of Her late Majesty’s Order in Council of the 6th March 1896 to conduct proceedings before His Majesty in Council on behalf of another;

“Party” and all words descriptive of parties to proceedings before His Majesty in Council (such as “Petitioner,” “Appellant,” “Respondent”) mean, in respect of all acts proper to be done by an Agent, the Agent of the party in question where such party is represented by an Agent;

“Respondent” includes Intervener;

“Month” means calendar month;

Words in the singular shall include the plural, and words in the plural shall include the singular.

(2) Where by these Rules any step is required to be taken in England in connection with proceedings before His Majesty in Council, whether in the way of lodging a Petition or other document, entering an Appearance, lodging security, or otherwise, such step shall be taken in the Registry of the Privy Council, Downing Street, London.

LEAVE TO APPEAL.

2. All Appeals shall be brought either in pursuance of leave obtained from the Court appealed from, or, in the absence of such leave, in pursuance of special leave to appeal granted by His Majesty in Council upon a Petition in that behalf presented by the intending Appellant.

Leave to appeal generally.

SPECIAL LEAVE TO APPEAL.

3. A Petition for special leave to appeal to His Majesty in Council shall state succinctly and clearly all such facts as it may be necessary to state in order to enable the Judicial Committee to advise His Majesty whether such leave ought to be granted, and shall be signed by the Counsel who attends at the hearing or by the party himself if he appears in person. The Petition shall deal with the merits of the case only so far as is necessary for the purpose of explaining and supporting the particular grounds upon which special leave to appeal is sought.

4. The Petitioner shall lodge at least five copies of his Petition for special leave to appeal together with the Affidavit in support thereof prescribed by Rule 50 hereinafter contained, and, unless a Caveat as prescribed by Rule 48 has been lodged by the other parties who appeared in the Court below, an Affidavit of service of notice of the intended application upon such parties or their Solicitors or Agents, either abroad or in England.

5. A Petition for special leave to appeal may be lodged at any time after the date of the judgment sought to be appealed from, but the Petitioner shall, in every case, lodge his Petition with the least possible delay.

Security for
costs and
transmission of
Record.

6. Where the Judicial Committee agree to advise His Majesty to grant special leave to appeal, they shall, in their Report, specify the amount of the security for costs (if any) to be lodged by the Petitioner, and shall, unless the circumstances of a particular case render such a course unnecessary, provide for the transmission of the Record by the Registrar to the Registrar of the Privy Council and for such further matters as the justice of the case may require. Unless otherwise ordered the security shall be lodged at any time before the Appellant enters an Appearance.

General
provisions.

7. Save as by the four last preceding Rules otherwise provided, the provisions of Rules 47 to 50 and 52 to 59 (all inclusive) hereinafter contained shall apply *mutatis mutandis* to Petitions for special leave to appeal.

8. Rules 3 to 7 (both inclusive) shall apply *mutatis mutandis* to Petitions for leave to appeal in *forma pauperis*, but in addition to the Affidavits referred to in Rule 4 every such Petition shall be accompanied by an Affidavit from the Petitioner stating that he is not worth £25 in the world excepting his wearing apparel and his interest in the subject-matter of the intended Appeal, and that he is unable to provide sureties, and also by a certificate of Counsel that the Petitioner has reasonable ground of appeal.

9. Where a Petitioner obtains leave to appeal in *forma pauperis*, he shall not be required to lodge security for the costs of the Respondent or to pay any Council Office fees.

10. A Petitioner whose Petition for leave to appeal in *forma pauperis* is dismissed may, notwithstanding such dismissal, be excused from paying the Council Office fees usually chargeable to a Petitioner in respect of a Petition for leave to appeal, if His Majesty in Council, on the advice of the Judicial Committee, shall think fit so to order.

RECORD AND APPEARANCE BY APPELLANT.

Record to be
transmitted
without delay.

11. As soon as the Appeal has been admitted, whether by an Order of the Court appealed from or by an Order of His Majesty in Council granting special leave to appeal, the Appellant shall without delay take all necessary steps to have the Record transmitted to the Registrar of the Privy Council, and the Registrar

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shall, with all convenient speed, certify to the Registrar of the Privy Council that the Respondent has received notice, or is otherwise aware, of the Order of the Court appealed from admitting the Appeal, or of the Order of His Majesty in Council giving the Appellant special leave to appeal, and has also received notice, or is otherwise aware, of the dispatch of the Record to England. Where an Appellant who has obtained special leave to appeal by an Order of His Majesty in Council fails to have the Record transmitted to the Registrar of the Privy Council with due diligence, the Registrar of the Privy Council shall call upon the Appellant to explain his default, and if no explanation is offered, or if the explanation offered is, in the opinion of the said Registrar insufficient, the said Registrar may issue a Summons to the Appellant calling upon him to show cause before the Judicial Committee at a time to be named in the said Summons why the special leave to appeal granted should not be rescinded. The Respondent shall be entitled to be heard before the Judicial Committee in the matter of the said Summons and to ask for his costs and such other relief as he may be advised. The Judicial Committee may, after considering the matter of the said Summons, recommend to His Majesty to rescind the grant of special leave to appeal or give such other directions therein as the justice of the case may require.

12. The Record shall be printed in accordance with the Rules contained in Schedule A hereto. It may be printed either abroad or in England. When printed abroad the parties in England shall, upon perusal, consider whether the order of the documents is in accordance with these Rules, and if it is not, they shall agree upon the proper order. The Appellant shall then rearrange copies of the Record for the use of the Judicial Committee and the other parties. In the event of the parties being unable to agree, the matter shall be referred to the Registrar of the Privy Council who, if he thinks fit, may require the parties to attend before the Judicial Committee for directions.

Printing of
Record.

13. Where the Record is printed abroad, the Registrar shall, at the expense of the Appellant, transmit to the Registrar of the Privy Council 40 copies of such Record, one of which copies he shall certify to be correct by signing his name on, or initialling, every eighth page thereof and by affixing thereto the seal, if any, of the Court appealed from.

14. Where the Record is to be printed in England, the Registrar shall, at the expense of the Appellant, transmit to the Registrar of the Privy Council one certified copy of such Record, together with an index of all the papers and exhibits in the case. No other certified copies of the Record shall be transmitted to the Agents in England by or on behalf of the parties to the Appeal.

15. Where part of the Record is printed abroad and part is to be printed in England, Rules 13 and 14 shall, as far as practicable, apply to such parts as are printed abroad and such as are to be printed in England respectively.

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Reasons for judgments to be included.

16. The reasons given by the judge, or any of the judges, for or against any judgment pronounced in the course of the proceedings out of which the Appeal arises, shall by such judge or judges be communicated in writing to the Registrar and shall be included in the Record.

Exclusion of unnecessary documents from Record.

17. The Registrar, as well as the parties and their Agents, shall endeavour to exclude from the Record all documents (more particularly such as are merely formal) that are not relevant to the subject-matter of the Appeal, and, generally, to reduce the bulk of the Record as far as practicable, taking special care to avoid the duplication of documents and the unnecessary repetition of headings and other merely formal parts of documents; but the documents omitted to be printed or copied shall be enumerated in a typewritten list to be transmitted with the Record.

Documents objected to to be indicated.

18. Where in the course of the preparation of a Record one party objects to the inclusion of a document on the ground that it is unnecessary or irrelevant, and the other party nevertheless insists upon its being included, the Record, as finally printed (whether abroad or in England), shall, with a view to the subsequent adjustment of the costs of and incidental to such document, indicate, in the index of papers, or otherwise, the fact that, and the party by whom, the inclusion of the document was objected to.

Registration and numbering of Records.

19. As soon as the Record is received in the Registry of the Privy Council, it shall be registered in the said Registry, with the date of arrival, the names of the parties, and the description whether "printed" or "written." A Record, or any part of a Record, not printed in accordance with the Rules contained in Schedule A hereto shall be treated as written. Appeals shall be numbered consecutively in each year in the order in which the Records are received in the said Registry.

Inspection of Record by parties.

20. The parties shall be entitled to inspect the Record and to extract all necessary particulars therefrom for the purpose of entering an Appearance.

Appearance by Appellant.

21. The Appellant shall enter an Appearance before taking any step in the prosecution of the Appeal, and after entering such Appearance, shall forthwith give notice thereof to the Respondent, if the latter has entered an Appearance.

Times within which a copy of a written Record shall be bespoken.

22. Where the Record arrives in England either wholly written, or partly written and partly printed, the Appellant shall, within a period of four months from the date of such arrival in the case of Appeals from Courts situate in any of the countries or places named in Schedule B hereto, and within a period of two months from the same date in the case of Appeals from any other Courts, enter an Appearance and bespeak a typewritten copy of the Record, or of such parts thereof as it may be necessary to have copied, and shall engage to pay the cost of preparing such copy at the following rates per folio typed (exclusive of tabular matter)—2*d.* per folio of English matter, 2½*d.* per folio of Indian matter, and 3½*d.* per folio of foreign matter; and shall also engage to pay at such price as shall be fixed by the Registrar of the Privy Council the cost of printing at least 50 copies thereof.

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23. As soon as the Appellant has obtained the typewritten copy of the Record bespoken by him, he shall proceed, with due diligence, to arrange the documents in suitable order, to check the index, to insert marginal notes and check the same with the index, and, generally, to do whatever may be required for the purpose of preparing the copy for the printer, in accordance with the Rules contained in Schedule A hereto, and shall, if the Respondent has entered an Appearance, submit the copy, as prepared for the printer, to the Respondent for his approval. In the event of the parties being unable to agree, the matter shall be referred to the Registrar of the Privy Council who, if he thinks fit, may require the parties to attend before the Judicial Committee for directions.

24. As soon as the typewritten copy of the Record is ready for the printer, the Appellant shall lodge it in the Registry of the Privy Council for printing by a printer selected by the Registrar of the Privy Council, and at the same time shall lodge the amount of the estimated cost of printing the Record.

25. Whenever it shall be found that the decision of a matter on appeal is likely to turn exclusively on a question of law, the parties, with the sanction of the Registrar of the Privy Council, may submit such question of law to the Judicial Committee in the form of a Special Case, and print such parts only of the Record as may be necessary for the discussion of the same. Provided that nothing herein contained shall in any way prevent the Judicial Committee from ordering the full discussion of the whole case, if they shall so think fit, and that, in order to promote such arrangements and simplification of the matter in dispute, the said Registrar may call the parties before him, and having heard them, and examined the Record, may report to the Judicial Committee as to the nature of the proceedings.

Special Case.

26. The Registrar of the Privy Council shall, as soon as the proof prints of the Record are ready, give notice to all parties who have entered an Appearance requesting them to attend at the Registry of the Privy Council at a time to be named in such notice in order to examine the said proof prints and compare the same with the certified Record, and shall, for that purpose, furnish each of the said parties with one proof print. After the examination has been completed, the Appellant shall, without delay, lodge his proof print, duly corrected and (so far as necessary) approved by the Respondent, and the Registrar of the Privy Council shall thereupon cause the copies of the Record to be struck off from such proof print.

27. Each party who has entered an Appearance shall be entitled to receive, for his own use, six copies of the Record.

28. Subject to any special direction from the Judicial Committee to the contrary, the costs of and incidental to the printing of the Record shall form part of the costs of the Appeal, but the costs of and incidental to the printing of any document objected to by one party, in accordance with Rule 18, shall, if such document is found on the taxation of costs to be unnecessary or irrelevant, be disallowed to, or borne by, the party insisting on including the same in the Record.

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PETITION OF APPEAL.

29. The Appellant shall lodge his Petition of Appeal—

- (a) Where the Record arrives in England printed, within a period of four months from the date of such arrival in the case of Appeals from Courts situate in any of the countries or places named in Schedule B hereto, and within a period of two months from the same date in the case of Appeals from any other Courts;
- (b) Where the Record arrives in England written, within a period of one month from, but not before, the date of the completion of the printing thereof:

Provided that nothing in this Rule contained shall preclude the Appellant from lodging his Petition of Appeal prior to the arrival of the Record, or the completion of the printing thereof, if there are special reasons why, in the opinion of the Registrar of the Privy Council, it should be desirable for him to do so.

Form of

30. The Petition of Appeal shall be lodged in the form prescribed by Rule 47 hereinafter contained. It shall recite succinctly and, as far as possible, in chronological order, the principal steps in the proceedings leading up to the Appeal from the commencement thereof down to the admission of the Appeal, but shall not contain argumentative matter or travel into the merits of the case.

31. The Appellant shall, after lodging his Petition of Appeal, serve a copy thereof without delay on the Respondent, as soon as the latter has entered an Appearance, and shall endorse such copy with the date of the lodgment.

WITHDRAWAL OF APPEAL.

32. Where an Appellant, who has not lodged his Petition of Appeal, desires to withdraw his Appeal, he shall give notice in writing to that effect to the Registrar of the Privy Council, and the said Registrar shall, with all convenient speed after the receipt of such notice, by letter notify the Registrar of the Court appealed from that the Appeal has been withdrawn, and the said Appeal shall thereupon stand dismissed as from the date of the said letter without further Order.

33. Where an Appellant, who has lodged his Petition of Appeal, desires to withdraw his Appeal, he shall present a Petition to that effect to His Majesty in Council. On the hearing of any such Petition a Respondent who has entered an Appearance in the Appeal shall, subject to any agreement between him and the Appellant to the contrary, be entitled to apply to the Judicial Committee for his costs, but where the Respondent has not entered an Appearance, or, having entered an Appearance, consents in writing to the prayer of the Petition, the Petition may, if the Judicial Committee think fit, be disposed of in the same way *mutatis mutandis* as a Consent Petition under the provisions of Rule 56 hereinafter contained.

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NON-PROSECUTION OF APPEAL.

34. Where an Appellant takes no step in prosecution of his Appeal within a period of four months from the date of the arrival of the Record in England in the case of an Appeal from a Court situate in any of the countries or places named in Schedule B hereto, or within a period of two months from the same date in the case of an Appeal from any other Court, the Registrar of the Privy Council shall, with all convenient speed, by letter notify the Registrar of the Court appealed from that the Appeal has not been prosecuted, and the Appeal shall thereupon stand dismissed for non-prosecution as from the date of the said letter without further Order, and a copy of the said letter shall be sent by the Registrar of the Privy Council to any Respondent who has entered an Appearance in the Appeal.

35. Where an Appellant who has entered an Appearance—

- (a) fails to bespeak a copy of a written Record, or of part of a written Record, in accordance with, and within the periods prescribed by, Rule 22; or
- (b) having bespoken such copy within the periods prescribed by Rule 22, fails thereafter to proceed with due diligence to take all such further steps as may be necessary for the purpose of completing the printing of the said Record; or
- (c) fails to lodge his Petition of Appeal within the periods respectively prescribed by Rule 29;

the Registrar of the Privy Council shall call upon the Appellant to explain his default, and, if no explanation is offered, or if the explanation offered is, in the opinion of the said Registrar, insufficient, the said Registrar shall, with all convenient speed, by letter notify the Registrar of the Court appealed from that the Appeal has not been effectually prosecuted, and the Appeal shall thereupon stand dismissed for non-prosecution as from the date of the said letter without further Order, and a copy of the said letter shall be sent by the Registrar of the Privy Council to all the parties who have entered an Appearance in the Appeal.

36. Where an Appellant, who has lodged his Petition of Appeal, fails thereafter to prosecute his Appeal with due diligence, the Registrar of the Privy Council shall call upon him to explain his default, and, if no explanation is offered, or if the explanation offered is, in the opinion of the said Registrar, insufficient, the said Registrar shall issue a Summons to the Appellant calling upon him to show cause before the Judicial Committee at a time to be named in the said Summons why the Appeal should not be dismissed for non-prosecution. Provided that no such Summons shall be issued by the said Registrar before the expiration of one year from the date of the arrival of the Record in England. If the Respondent has entered an Appearance in the Appeal, the Registrar of the Privy Council shall send him a copy of the said Summons, and the Respondent shall be entitled to be heard before the Judicial Committee in the

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matter of the said Summons at the time named and to ask for his costs and such other relief as he may be advised. The Judicial Committee may, after considering the matter of the said Summons, recommend to His Majesty the dismissal of the Appeal for non-prosecution, or give such other directions therein as the justice of the case may require.

Restoring an Appeal dismissed for non-prosecution.

37. An Appellant whose Appeal has been dismissed for non-prosecution may present a Petition to His Majesty in Council praying that his Appeal may be restored.

APPEARANCE BY RESPONDENT.

Time within which Respondent may appear.

38. The Respondent may enter an Appearance at any time between the arrival of the Record and the hearing of the Appeal, but if he unduly delays entering an Appearance he shall bear, or be disallowed, the costs occasioned by such delay, unless the Judicial Committee otherwise direct.

Notice of Appearance by Respondent.

39. The Respondent shall forthwith after entering an Appearance give notice thereof to the Appellant, if the latter has entered an Appearance.

Form of Appearance where all the Respondents do not appear.

40. Where there are two or more Respondents, and only one, or some, of them enter an Appearance, the Appearance Form shall set out the names of the appearing Respondents.

Separate Appearances.

41. Two or more Respondents may, at their own risk as to costs, enter separate Appearances in the same Appeal.

Non-appearing Respondent not entitled to receive notices or lodge Case.

42. A Respondent who has not entered an Appearance shall not be entitled to receive any notices relating to the Appeal from the Registrar of the Privy Council, nor be allowed to lodge a Case in the Appeal.

Procedure on non-appearance of Respondent.

43. Where a Respondent fails to enter an Appearance in an Appeal, the following Rules shall, subject to any special Order of the Judicial Committee to the contrary, apply:

- (a) If the non-appearing Respondent was a Respondent at the time when the Appeal was admitted, whether by the Order of the Court appealed from or by an Order of His Majesty in Council giving the Appellant special leave to appeal, and it appears from the terms of the said Order, or Order in Council, or otherwise from the Record, or from a Certificate of the Registrar of the Court appealed from, that the said non-appearing Respondent has received notice, or was otherwise aware, of the Order of the Court appealed from admitting the Appeal, or of the Order of His Majesty in Council giving the Appellant special leave to appeal, and has also received notice, or was otherwise aware, of the dispatch of the Record to England, the appeal may, if all other conditions of its being set down are satisfied, be set down *ex parte* as against the said non-appearing Respondent at any time after the expiration of three months from the date of the lodging of the Petition of Appeal;

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- (b) if the non-appearing Respondent was made a Respondent by an Order of His Majesty in Council subsequently to the admission of the Appeal, and it appears from the Record, or from a Supplementary Record, or from a Certificate of the Registrar of the Court appealed from, that the said non-appearing Respondent has received notice, or was otherwise aware, of any intended application to bring him on the record as a Respondent, the Appeal may, if all other conditions of its being set down are satisfied, be set down *ex parte* as against the said non-appearing Respondent at any time after the expiration of three months from the date on which he shall have been served with a copy of His Majesty's Order in Council bringing him on the Record as a Respondent:

Provided that where it is shown to the satisfaction of the Registrar of the Privy Council, by Affidavit or otherwise, either that an Appellant has made every reasonable endeavour to serve a non-appearing Respondent with the notices mentioned in clause (a) and (b) respectively and has failed to effect such service, or that it is not the intention of the non-appearing Respondent to enter an Appearance to the Appeal, the Appeal may, without further Order in that behalf and at the risk of the Appellant, be proceeded with *ex parte* as against the said non-appearing Respondent.

44. A Respondent who desires to defend an Appeal *in formâ pauperis* may present a Petition to that effect to His Majesty in Council, which Petition shall be accompanied by an Affidavit from the Petitioner stating that he is not worth £25 in the world excepting his wearing apparel and his interest in the subject-matter of the Appeal.

PETITIONS GENERALLY.

45. All Petitions for orders or directions as to matters of practice or procedure arising after the lodging of the Petition of Appeal and not involving any change in the parties to an Appeal shall be addressed to the Judicial Committee. All other Petitions shall be addressed to His Majesty in Council, but a Petition which is properly addressed to His Majesty in Council may include, as incidental to the relief thereby sought, a prayer for orders or directions as to matters of practice or procedure.

46. Where an Order made by the Judicial Committee does not embody any special terms or include any special directions, it shall not be necessary to draw up such Order, unless the Committee otherwise direct, but a Note thereof shall be made by the Registrar of the Privy Council.

47. All Petitions shall consist of paragraphs numbered consecutively and shall be written, typewritten, or lithographed, on brief paper with quarter margin and endorsed with the name of the Court appealed from, the full title and Privy Council

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number of the Appeal to which the Petition relates or the full title of the Petition (as the case may be), and the name and address of the London Agent (if any) of the Petitioner, but need not be signed, except as provided by Rule 3. Unless the Petition is a Consent Petition within the meaning of Rule 56 at least five copies thereof shall be lodged.

Caveat.

48. Where a Petition is expected to be lodged, or has been lodged, which does not relate to any pending Appeal of which the Record has been registered in the Registry of the Privy Council, any person claiming a right to appear before the Judicial Committee on the hearing of such Petition may lodge a Caveat in the matter thereof, and shall thereupon be entitled to receive from the Registrar of the Privy Council notice of the lodging of the Petition, if at the time of the lodging of the Caveat such Petition has not yet been lodged, and, if and when the Petition has been lodged, to require the Petitioner to serve him with a copy of the Petition, and to furnish him, at his own expense, with copies of any papers lodged by the Petitioner in support of his Petition. The Caveator shall forthwith after lodging his Caveat give notice thereof to the Petitioner, if the Petition has been lodged.

49. Where a Petition is lodged in the matter of any pending Appeal of which the Record has been registered in the Registry of the Privy Council, the Petitioner shall serve any party who has entered an Appearance in the Appeal with a copy of such Petition, and the party so served shall thereupon be entitled to require the Petitioner to furnish him, at his own expense, with copies of any papers lodged by the Petitioner in support of his Petition.

50. A Petition not relating to any Appeal of which the Record has been registered in the Registry of the Privy Council, and any other Petition containing allegations of fact which cannot be verified by reference to the registered Record or any certificate or duly authenticated statement of the Court appealed from, shall be supported by Affidavit. Where the Petitioner prosecutes his Petition in person, the said Affidavit shall be sworn by the Petitioner himself and shall state that, to the best of the deponent's knowledge, information, and belief, the allegations contained in the Petition are true. Where the Petitioner is represented by an Agent, the said Affidavit shall be sworn by such Agent and shall, besides stating that, to the best of the deponent's knowledge, information, and belief, the allegations contained in the Petition are true, show how the deponent obtained his instructions and the information enabling him to present the Petition.

51. A Petition for an Order of Revivor or Substitution shall be accompanied by a certificate or duly authenticated statement from the Court appealed from showing who, in the opinion of the said Court, is the proper person to be substituted, or entered, on the Record in place of, or in addition to, a party who has died or undergone a change of status.

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52. The Registrar of the Privy Council may refuse to receive a Petition on the grounds that it discloses no reasonable cause of appeal, or is frivolous, or contains scandalous matter, but the Petitioner may appeal, by way of motion, from such refusal to the Judicial Committee.

Petition disclosing no reasonable cause of appeal or containing scandalous matter to be refused.

53. As soon as a Petition and all necessary documents are lodged the Petition shall thereupon be deemed to be set down.

Setting down Petition.

54. On each day appointed by the Judicial Committee for the hearing of Petitions the Registrar of the Privy Council shall, unless the Committee otherwise direct, put in the paper for hearing all such Petitions as have been set down. Provided that, in the absence of special circumstances of urgency to be shown to the satisfaction of the said Registrar, no Petition, if opposed, shall be put in the paper for hearing before the expiration of ten clear days from the lodging thereof, unless the Opponent consents to the Petition being put in the paper on an earlier day.

Times within which set-down Petitions shall be heard.

55. Subject to the provisions of the next following Rule, the Registrar of the Privy Council shall, as soon as the Judicial Committee have appointed a day for the hearing of a Petition, notify all parties concerned by Summons of the day so appointed.

Notice to parties of day fixed for hearing Petition.

56. Where the prayer of a Petition is consented to in writing by the opposite party, or where a Petition is of a formal and non-contentious character, the Judicial Committee may, if they think fit, make their Report to His Majesty on such Petition, or make their Order thereon, as the case may be, without requiring the attendance of the parties in the Council Chamber, and the Registrar of the Privy Council shall not in any such case issue the Summons provided for by the last-preceding Rule, but shall with all convenient speed after the Committee have made their Report or Order notify the parties that the Report or Order has been made and of the date and nature of such Report or Order.

Procedure where Petition is consented to or is formal.

57. A Petitioner who desires to withdraw his Petition shall give notice in writing to that effect to the Registrar of the Privy Council. Where the Petition is opposed, the Opponent shall, subject to any agreement between the parties to the contrary, be entitled to apply to the Judicial Committee for his costs, but where the Petition is unopposed, or where, in the case of an opposed Petition, the parties have come to an agreement as to the costs of the Petition, the Petition may, if the Judicial Committee think fit, be disposed of in the same way *mutatis mutandis* as a Consent Petition under the provisions of the last-preceding Rule.

Withdrawal of Petition.

58. Where a Petitioner unduly delays bringing a Petition to a hearing, the Registrar of the Privy Council shall call upon him to explain the delay, and if no explanation is offered, or if the explanation offered is, in the opinion of the said Registrar, insufficient, the said Registrar may, after notifying all parties interested by Summons of his intention to do so, put the Petition in the paper for hearing on the next following day appointed by the Judicial Committee for the hearing of Petitions for such directions as the Committee may think fit to give thereon.

Procedure where hearing of Petition unduly delayed.

59. At the hearing of a Petition not more than one Counsel shall be admitted to be heard on a side.

CASE.

Lodging of
Case.

60. No party to an Appeal shall be entitled to be heard by the Judicial Committee unless he has previously lodged his Case in the Appeal. Provided that where a Respondent who has entered an Appearance does not desire to lodge a Case in the Appeal, he may give the Registrar of the Privy Council notice in writing of his intention not to lodge any Case, while reserving his right to address the Judicial Committee on the question of costs.

Printing of
Case.

61. The Case may be printed either abroad or in England, and shall, in either event, be printed in accordance with the Rules I to III contained in Schedule A hereto, every tenth line thereof being numbered in the margin, and shall be signed by at least one of the Counsel who attends at the hearing of the Appeal or by the party himself if he conducts his Appeal in person.

Number of
prints to be
lodged.

62. Each party shall lodge 30 prints of his Case.

Form of Case.

63. The Case shall consist of paragraphs numbered consecutively and shall state, as concisely as possible, the circumstances out of which the Appeal arises, the contentions to be urged by the party lodging the same, and the reasons of appeal. References by page and line to the relevant portions of the Record as printed shall, as far as practicable, be printed in the margin, and care shall be taken to avoid, as far as possible, the reprinting in the Case of long extracts from the Record. The Taxing Officer, in taxing the costs of the Appeal, shall, either of his own motion, or at the instance of the opposite party, inquire into any unnecessary prolixity in the Case, and shall disallow the costs occasioned thereby.

Separate Cases
by two or more
Respondents.

64. Two or more Respondents may, at their own risk as to costs, lodge separate Cases in the same Appeal.

Notice of
lodgment of
Case.

65. Each party shall, after lodging his Case, forthwith give notice thereof to the other party.

Case Notice.

66. Subject as hereinafter provided, the party who lodges his Case first may, at any time after the expiration of three clear days from the day on which he has given the other party the notice prescribed by the last-preceding Rule, serve such other party, if the latter has not in the meantime lodged his Case, with a "Case Notice," requiring him to lodge his Case within one month from the date of the service of the said Case Notice and informing him that, in default of his so doing, the Appeal will be set down for hearing *ex parte* as against him, and if the other party fails to comply with the said Case Notice, the party who has lodged his Case may, at any time after the expiration of the time limited by the said Case Notice for the lodging of the Case, lodge an Affidavit of Service (which shall set out the terms of the said Case Notice), and the Appeal shall thereupon, if all other conditions of its being set down are satisfied, be set down *ex parte* as against the party in default

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Provided that no Case Notice shall be served until after the completion of the printing, or re-arrangement under Rule 12, of the Record, and also that nothing in this Rule contained shall preclude the party in default from lodging his Case, at his own risk as regards costs and otherwise, at any time up to the date of hearing.

67. Subject to the provisions of Rule 43 and of the last-preceding Rule, an Appeal shall be set down *ipso facto* as soon as the Cases on both sides are lodged, and the parties shall thereupon exchange Cases by handing one another, either at the Offices of one of the Agents or in the Registry of the Privy Council, ten copies of their respective Cases.

BINDING RECORDS, &c.

68. As soon as an Appeal is set down, the Appellant shall attend at the Registry of the Privy Council and obtain ten copies of the Record and Cases to be bound for the use of the Judicial Committee at the hearing. The copies shall be bound in cloth or in half leather with paper sides, and six leaves of blank paper shall be inserted before the Appellant's Case. The front cover shall bear a printed label stating the title and Privy Council number of the Appeal, the contents of the volume, and the names and addresses of the London Agents. The several documents, indicated by incuts, shall be arranged in the following order: (1) Appellant's Case; (2) Respondent's Case; (3) Record (if in more than one part, showing the separate parts by incuts, all parts being paged at the top of the page); (4) Supplemental Record (if any); and the short title and Privy Council number of the Appeal shall also be shown on the back.

69. The Appellant shall lodge the bound copies not less than four clear days before the commencement of the Sittings during which the Appeal is to be heard.

HEARING.

70. The Registrar of the Privy Council shall name a day on or before which Appeals must be set down if they are to be entered in the List of Business for the ensuing Sittings. All Appeals set down on or before the day named shall, subject to any directions from the Committee or to any agreement between the parties to the contrary, be entered in such List of Business and shall, subject to any directions from the Committee to the contrary, be heard in the order in which they are set down.

71. The Registrar of the Privy Council shall, subject to the provisions of Rule 42, notify the parties to each Appeal by Summons, at the earliest possible date, of the day appointed by the Judicial Committee for the hearing of the Appeal, and the parties shall be in readiness to be heard on the day so appointed.

72. At the hearing of an Appeal not more than two Counsel shall be admitted to be heard on a side.

73. In Admiralty Appeals the Judicial Committee may, if they think fit, require the attendance of two Nautical Assessors.

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JUDGMENT.

Notice to parties of day fixed for delivery of Judgment.

74. Where the Judicial Committee, after hearing an Appeal, decide to reserve their Judgment thereon, the Registrar of the Privy Council shall in due course notify the parties by Summons of the day appointed by the Committee for the delivery of the Judgment.

COSTS.

Taxation of costs.

75. All Bills of Costs under the Orders of the Judicial Committee on Appeals, Petitions, and other matters, shall be referred to the Registrar of the Privy Council, or such other person as the Judicial Committee may appoint, for taxation, and all such taxations shall be regulated by the Schedule of Fees set forth in Schedule C hereto.

What costs taxed in England.

76. The taxation of costs in England shall be limited to costs incurred in England.

Order to tax.

77. The Registrar of the Privy Council shall, with all convenient speed after the Judicial Committee have given their decision as to the costs of an Appeal, Petition, or other matter, issue to the party to whom costs have been awarded an Order to tax and a Notice specifying the day and hour appointed by him for taxation. The party receiving such Order to tax and Notice shall, not less than 48 hours before the time appointed for taxation, lodge his Bill of Costs (together with all necessary vouchers for disbursements), and serve the opposite party with a copy of his Bill of Costs and of the Order to tax and Notice.

Power of Taxing Officer where taxation delayed through the fault of the party whose costs are to be taxed.

78. The Taxing Officer may, if he think fit, disallow to any party who fails to lodge his Bill of Costs (together with all necessary vouchers for disbursements) within the time prescribed by the last-preceding Rule, or who in any way delays or impedes a taxation, the charges to which such party would otherwise be entitled for drawing his Bill of Costs and attending the taxation.

Appeal from decision of Taxing Officer.

79. Any party aggrieved by a taxation may appeal from the decision of the Taxing Officer to the Judicial Committee. The Appeal shall be heard by way of motion, and the party appealing shall give three clear days' Notice of Motion to the opposite party, and shall also leave a copy of such Notice in the Registry of the Privy Council.

Amount of taxed costs to be inserted in His Majesty's Order in Council.

80. The amount allowed by the Taxing Officer on the taxation shall, subject to any appeal from his taxation to the Judicial Committee and subject to any direction from the Committee to the contrary, be inserted in His Majesty's Order in Council determining the Appeal or Petition.

Taxation on the pauper scale.

81. Where the Judicial Committee directs costs to be taxed on the pauper scale, the Taxing Officer shall not allow any fees of Counsel, and shall only award to the Agents out-of-pocket expenses and a reasonable allowance to cover office expenses, such allowance to be taken at about three-eighths of the usual professional charges in ordinary Appeals. Such pauper scale shall apply to and include the application upon which leave to appeal in *forma pauperis* was granted.

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82. Where the Appellant has lodged security for the Respondent's costs of an Appeal in the Registry of the Privy Council, the Registrar of the Privy Council shall deal with such security in accordance with the directions contained in His Majesty's Order in Council determining the Appeal.

Security to be dealt with as His Majesty's Order in Council determining Appeal directs.

MISCELLANEOUS.

83. The Judicial Committee may, for sufficient cause shown, excuse the parties from compliance with any of the requirements of these Rules, and may give such directions in matters of practice and procedure as they shall consider just and expedient. Applications to be excused from compliance with the requirements of any of these Rules shall be addressed in the first instance to the Registrar of the Privy Council, who shall take the instructions of the Committee thereon and communicate the same to the parties. If, in the opinion of the said Registrar, it is desirable that the application should be dealt with by the Committee in open Court, he may direct the party applying to lodge in the Registry of the Privy Council, and to serve the opposite party with, a Notice of Motion returnable before the Committee.

Power of Judicial Committee to excuse from compliance with Rules.

84. Any document lodged in connection with an Appeal, Petition, or other matter pending before His Majesty in Council or the Judicial Committee, may be amended by leave of the Registrar of the Privy Council, but if the said Registrar is of opinion that an application for leave to amend should be dealt with by the Committee in open Court, he may direct the party applying to lodge in the Registry of the Privy Council, and to serve the opposite party with, a Notice of Motion returnable before the Committee.

Amendment of documents.

85. Affidavits relating to any Appeal, Petition, or other matter pending before His Majesty in Council or the Judicial Committee may be sworn before the Registrar of the Privy Council.

Affidavits may be sworn before the Registrar of the Privy Council.

86. Where a party to an Appeal, Petition, or other matter pending before His Majesty in Council changes his Agent, such party, or the new Agent, shall forthwith give the Registrar of the Privy Council and the outgoing Agent notice in writing of the change, and shall amend the Appearance accordingly. Until such notices are given the former Agent shall be considered the Agent of the party until the final conclusion of the Appeal, Petition, or other matter.

Change of Agent.

87. Subject to the provisions of any Statute or of any Statutory Rule or Order to the contrary, these Rules shall apply to all matters falling within the Appellate Jurisdiction of His Majesty in Council.

Scope of application of Rules.

88. These Rules may be cited as the Judicial Committee Rules, 1925, and they shall come into operation on the 1st day of January, 1926.

Mode of citation and date of operation.

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SCHEDULE A.

RULES AS TO PRINTING.

I. All Records and other proceedings in Appeals or other matters pending before His Majesty in Council or the Judicial Committee which are required by the above Rules to be printed shall be printed in the form known as Demy Quarto.

II. The size of the paper used shall be such that the sheet, when folded and trimmed, will be 11 inches in height and 8½ inches in width.

III. The type to be used in the text shall be Pica type, but Long Primer shall be used in printing accounts, tabular matter, and notes. The number of lines in each page of Pica type shall be 47 or thereabouts, and every tenth line shall be numbered in the margin.

IV. Records shall be arranged in two parts in the same volume, where practicable, viz. :

Part I. The pleadings and proceedings, the transcript of the evidence of the witnesses, the Judgments, Decrees, &c., of the Courts below, down to the Order admitting the Appeal.

Part II. The exhibits and documents.

V. The Index to Part I shall be in chronological order, and shall be placed at the beginning of the volume.

The Index to Part II shall follow the order of the exhibit mark, and shall be placed immediately after the Index to Part I.

VI. Part I shall be arranged strictly in chronological order, i.e., in the same order as the index.

Part II shall be arranged in the most convenient way for the use of the Judicial Committee, as the circumstances of the case require. The documents shall be printed as far as suitable in chronological order, mixing Plaintiff's and Defendant's documents together when necessary. Each document shall show its exhibit mark, and whether it is a Plaintiff's or Defendant's document (unless this is clear from the exhibit mark) and in all cases documents relating to the same matter, such as

(a) a series of correspondence, or

(b) proceedings in a suit other than the one under appeal,

shall be kept together. The order in the Record of the documents in Part II will probably be different from the order of the Index, and the proper page number of each document shall be inserted in the printed Index.

The parties will be responsible for arranging the Record in proper order for the Judicial Committee, and in difficult cases Counsel may be asked to settle it.

VII. The documents in Part I shall be numbered consecutively.

The documents in Part II shall not be numbered, apart from the exhibit mark.

VIII. Each document shall have a heading which shall consist of the number or exhibit mark and the description of the document in the Index, without the date.

IX. Each document shall have a marginal note which shall be repeated on each page over which the document extends, viz. :

PART I.

(a) Where the case has been before more than one Court, the short name of the Court shall first appear. Where the case has been before only one Court, the name of the Court need not appear.

(b) The marginal note of the document shall then appear consisting of the number and the description of the document in the Index, with the date, except in the case of oral evidence.

(c) In the case of oral evidence, "Plaintiff's evidence" or "Defendant's evidence" shall appear beneath the name of the Court, and then the marginal note consisting of the number in the Index and the witness's name, with "examination," "cross-examination," or "re-examination," as the case may be.

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PART II.

The word "Exhibits" shall first appear.

The marginal note of the exhibit shall then appear consisting of the exhibit mark and the description of the document in the Index, with the date.

X. The parties shall agree to the omission of formal and irrelevant documents, but the description of the document may appear (both in the Index and in the Record), if desired, with the words "not printed" against it.

A long series of documents, such as accounts, rent rolls, inventories, &c., shall not be printed in full, unless Counsel so advise, but the parties shall agree to short extracts being printed as specimens.

XI. In cases where maps sent from abroad are of an inconvenient size or unsuitable in character, the Appellant shall, in agreement with the Respondent, prepare in England, from the materials sent from abroad, maps drawn properly to scale and of reasonable size, showing, as far as possible, the claims of the respective parties, in different colours.

- Sixteen plans as per register;
- Four hundred and eighty-six notices, seventy-seven applications for prosecutions and one application for authority under section 11 of the Sanitary Boards Enactment, 1916.

- Appointment of water inspectors: The meeting is informed that the State Engineer has approved of the appointment of two overseers to perform the duty of water inspectors.

5. Market, Tanjong Tualang: The draft of an agreement is read and with a few minor alterations is adopted. It is agreed that the rent to be paid by the lessee shall be the nominal sum of \$5 per annum. On Chin Fatt accepting the proposed terms and conditions the Chairman is to ask for the formal approval of Government.

6. Scheme of work of the Sanitary staff of the Board: In compliance with a General Order issued in March, 1925, the Health Officer submits a scheme of work for the inspecting staff for the approval of the Board. The Chairman states that it has been drawn up by the Chief Sanitary Inspector of the Board and in the opinion of the Health Officer cannot be improved upon. In effect there will be no change in the existing system. The Board approves.

7. Estimates, 1926, Other Charges, Kinta Sanitary Board: Acting on the decision of the Board at the last meeting the Chairman reads the letter he wrote to the Secretary to Resident. Intimation has since been received that the matter has been referred to the Chief Secretary.

8. Revision of building by-laws: The Chairman recommends the adoption of the Kuala Lumpur by-laws relating to thickness of brick walls and height of storeys in substitution for the existing by-law 17 now in force in Kinta. The Board agrees. The amended by-law reads as follows:

- The thickness of all external and party walls of all dwelling-houses, shops, offices and other buildings constructed of brick and used or adapted to be used for human habitation in whole or in part shall be as follows:
 - For a building one storey in height where the wall does not exceed ten feet in height 9 inches
 - For a building one storey in height where the wall is from ten to fifteen feet in height 13½ "
 - For a building two storeys in height:
 - 1st storey 13½ "
 - 2nd " 9 "
 - For a building three storeys in height:
 - 1st storey 18 "
 - 2nd " 13½ "
 - 3rd " 9 "

(e) For a building above three storeys in height the thickness of the walls in the three upper storeys shall be as for a three-storey building and the thickness of the walls of each of the lower storeys shall be four and a half inches thicker than that of the storey immediately above it.

(f) No storey shall exceed fifteen feet in height without the permission of the Board, who may in such case prescribe to what extent the walls shall be increased in thickness or otherwise strengthened.

(g) All bricks used for building purposes shall measure not less than $8\frac{3}{4}'' \times 4\frac{1}{4}'' \times 2\frac{1}{2}''$.

In the matter of open space it is decided not to alter the existing by-law. It is also decided to let other suggested alterations stand over for the present.

9. Applications for reduction of rent of Town Hall, Ipoh: On the proposal of the Hon. Mr. H. T. Jones, seconded by Mr. J. A. S. Jennings, it is decided to remit the rent for the use of the Town Hall, Ipoh, on 12th and 15th August as the proceeds are to be handed to the Ex-Services Association of Malaya.

Application for reduction for a M.S.V.R. dance is not acceded to.

10. Water supplies, Kinta: The Chairman reads a letter from the Secretary to Resident in which it is stated that provision for \$50,000 has been sought in the 1926 Budget to cover expenses of investigation for Kinta water supply and that three alternative sources are being examined.

Mr. J. A. S. Jennings proposes, and Mr. Foo Wha Cheng seconds, the following resolution:

"The Board deplores to learn that the matter of providing the principal towns in Kinta with an adequate water supply is still in the investigation stage. The Board once again urges upon the Government to adopt and carry out with as little further delay as possible a large and comprehensive water scheme as it has reason to believe that such a feasible scheme has already been submitted."

On a show of hands the resolution is carried.

11. New appointments, 1926: The Chairman states that an appointment of Dairy and Market Inspector has been approved for 1926 but it has been suggested that the number of Sanitary Inspectors employed be reduced by one. The Board is of opinion that the sanitary staff cannot be reduced.

12. Measures to mitigate the flooding of Ipoh: Writing on 4th August the Secretary to Resident states that the Director of Public Works has the matter under consideration and that a report has been asked for.

13. Proposed motor-car stand near Ipoh Railway Station: Further correspondence with the Railway Department since the July meeting is read. In view of the reticence of the Railway Administration to state for what railway purposes a portion of the site for the proposed motor-car stand is required, the Chairman is requested to ask that such land be not included in the Railway Reserve.

14. Impending retirement of the Secretary, Mr. W. J. B. Ashby: The Chairman announces that Mr. Ashby's retirement will become due in June, 1926, on his reaching the age limit, and states that it is necessary that his successor should be appointed some months ahead, and given time to master the many details of the appointment. Mr. J. A. S. Jennings suggests that Mr. Ashby's term of service should be extended. On enquiry by the Hon. Mr. H. T. Jones, the Chairman informs the Board that Mr. Ashby is willing to continue until he receives the maximum salary of his post. The Hon. Mr. H. T. Jones then moves, and Mr. Jennings seconds, that Government be asked to extend Mr. Ashby's term of service, and the resolution is carried without a dissentient vote.

15. The Board adjourns *sine die*.

Minutes of an ordinary meeting of the Sanitary Board, Kuala Lumpur, held in the Board room at the Sanitary Board Offices on Wednesday, the 5th of August, 1925, at 9.25 a.m.

PRESENT: The Chairman (Mr. W. M. Millington, M.C.S.), the Health Officer (Dr. E. H. Black), the Executive Engineer, Town (Mr. W. J. Smith), the Chief Police Officer [Mr. H. Langworthy (representative)], the Protector of Chinese (Mr. A. B. Jordan, M.C.S.), the Collector of Land Revenue (Mr. G. A. de C. de Moubray, M.C.S.), Mr. Khoo Keng Hooi, J.P., Mr. Loke Chow Thye, J.P., Mr. Yap Tai Chi, J.P., Mr. H. B. Talalla, Dr. E. T. MacIntyre, J.P., Mr. M. Cumarasamy, Raja Uda.

ABSENT: Mr J. L. Sime.

IN ATTENDANCE: The Acting Secretary (Mr. P. M. Carrier), representatives of the Press.

1. Minutes: The minutes of the previous meeting, having been circulated, are taken as read and confirmed.

2. Proposal to allow certain shop lots with a width of 19 feet in front: The Chairman gives a brief resumé of the proceedings that took place in 1920 in connection with shop-house frontage. The Acting Government Town Planner, on the invitation of the Chairman, addresses the meeting setting forth his views and reasons for the reduced frontage. After discussion the Chairman proposes to report to the British Resident that the Board considers that the sub-divisions now recommended by the Acting Government Town Planner are unobjectionable as well ventilated houses could be built on these in accordance with Sanitary Board by-laws. Seconded by Mr. Khoo Keng Hooi and carried—Mr. Yap Tai Chi alone dissenting.

3. Proposed railway station (or halting station) west of Campbell Road: The Chairman reads correspondence on the subject of the proposed railway station and asks the Board for its opinion as to the necessity or desirability of the proposed station or halt. The Board considers that a halt or station opposite Campbell Road will be desirable in a few years time in order to provide railway conveniences to the northern portion of Kuala Lumpur town. This would tend to encourage the desirable commercial development in this area and so relieve present congestion in the centre of the town. It will, of course, be necessary for all local trains to stop at the station. At this stage Mr. Khoo Keng Hooi proposes a vote of thanks to the Acting Government Town Planner for his presence and advice. The Board fully endorses.

4. Suggested addition of a by-law (to be numbered 9A) to the Sanitary Board by-laws: The Board is in favour of adopting the additional by-law: "The Board may furnish plans of buildings of a simple type to persons desirous of building on payment of such fee not exceeding \$10 as may be approved by the Chairman."

5. Demolition of temporary attap shed at $2\frac{1}{2}$ mile, New Petaling, portion 1,189: On the suggestion of Mr. Talalla it is agreed to prosecute the owner and report to the Board.

6. Letter from Rev. R. D. Whitehorn: The Chairman reads the letter conveying the thanks of the Board of Managers of St. Andrew's Presbyterian Church to the Sanitary Board for the use without charge of the Town Hall for the Church Concert on 11th July, 1925.

7. Further report on outbreak of rabies: The Chairman informs the meeting that a further case of rabies at Batu Road, Kuala Lumpur, has been reported. It was confirmed at the Institute for Medical Research, after the dog had died the following day. No one was bitten by the dog. A contact has been destroyed.

8. The Health Officer's replies to questions asked by Mr. Yap Tai Chi on 1st July, 1925:

9. Reply to question asked by Mr. Yap Tai Chi on 15th July, 1925:

Question: Has the Chairman applied for an accountant?

Answer: No definite request has been made. A copy of the Board's resolution, passed at the meeting held on 16th January, 1924: "That the Board desires that a competent accountant be seconded from any of the public services forthwith to take charge of the Sanitary Board accounts pending the decision of the question of the conversion of the Board into a Municipality", was forwarded to the Secretary to Resident on 8th February, 1924.

In forwarding the resolution the Chairman expressed the opinion that the appointment of a competent accountant is highly desirable, but not immediately necessary.

10. Reply to question asked by Mr. Yap Tai Chi on 1st July, 1925:

Question: Is it a fact according to the issue of the Yik Khuan Press of the 24th instant many country people were arrested on the 24th instant near Foch Avenue, while plying their home products for the Chinese festival. If so, (a) how many were arrested, (b) what is the cause of their arrest since we have agreed at the last Board meeting to allow these people to sell their home products during the Chinese festivals?

Reply: Yes, 17 arrests were made for obstruction and selling without licences.

(2) On the Chief Police Officer's instructions the persons detained were released and not charged in Court.

(3) The minutes of a meeting on 15th April, 1925, record a suggestion that vegetable gardeners be permitted to sell vegetables in Foch Avenue on festival days free of any charge.

(4) No resolution of the Board is recorded.

(5) If further action is desired I suggest that a sub-committee be appointed to consider the suggestion and report to the Board.

The Protector of Chinese observes that the question of selling their products free of licence on Chinese festival day was practically agreed to and there only remains the question of site to be settled upon by the late Chairman. The Chairman promises to discuss the matter with the Protector of Chinese, Chief Police Officer and Mr. Yap Tai Chi.

11. In reply to Mr. Talalla's question on the policy of the Government with regard to cheap dwelling-houses for the poor, the Chairman reads letter No. 6 in Sel. 2310/25, dated 14th July, 1925, from the Secretary to Resident. In the letter it is stated that "the Federated Malay States Government is of opinion that the provision of cheap dwelling-houses for the poor is a matter for private enterprise with practical assistance from the Government."

"The Government is prepared to lease State land (where suitable land is available for the purpose) at a nominal rental of \$1 per acre per annum for a period of years to any person who puts forward a practical scheme approved by the local Sanitary Board and by the British Resident of the State."

"Some years ago a scheme was introduced in Gopeng, which is reported upon by the Chairman of the Kinta Sanitary Board as having been 'extremely successful'; and it is thought that this scheme might, with such modifications as may be necessary, well be adopted in other towns."

Mr. Talalla asks that a copy of the reply may be forwarded to him.

12. Proposed new latrine for Government Offices, Kuala Lumpur: The Board consents to the proposal to provide \$3,500 in the 1926 State Budget for a water carriage system with a septic tank for latrine at the Government Offices.

13. Plan of proposed Chinese Assembly Hall: The Chairman asks the Board to authorise him to sign plans, when amendments already agreed to have been drawn in. The Board authorises.

14. New site for Police Courts, Kuala Lumpur: In view of the absence of a more detailed plan of the new site the Board decides to postpone consideration until the Chairman can obtain more details from the Acting Government Town Planner.

15. Application by S. Ponuswamy on behalf of the temple (Veerama-kali Temple) Committee for the free use of the Town Hall for a Tamil Drama on 15th August, 1925, in aid of the building fund of a Hindu temple in Ceylon: The Chairman remarks that the object is very remote. Dr. MacIntyre states that the fund is managed locally by a Committee comprising of members of the Government Clerical Service. The application is put to the meeting and carried.

16. Application by the Ipoh Amateurs for the remission of the Town Hall rent on the occasion of the two performances of "The Rising Generation" given on the 1st and 3rd of August in aid of the Ex-Services Association of Malaya's Fund:

The Board grants the application.

17. Plans: The following plans are passed:

18. Health Report: The Health Officer's report on the health of Kuala Lumpur for the month of June, 1925, is submitted:

The population for the middle of June is estimated at 94,613.

(2) Births: During the month 243 births were notified, giving an uncorrected birth-rate of 30.82 per mille.

(3) Deaths: The total number of deaths registered as having occurred within the Kuala Lumpur town was 228, giving a crude death-rate of 28.92 per mille. The number of deaths among the resident population was 140, giving a corrected death-rate of 17.76 per mille. The corrected death-rate for the corresponding month of 1924 was 13.13 per mille. There were 36 deaths of infants under the age of one year. The infantile mortality rate (deaths under one year of age per 1,000 births) was 148.15.

(5) Infectious diseases: One case of chicken-pox and one case of typhoid (enteric) fever were reported during the month.

(6) The total rainfall recorded at the Lake Gardens, Kuala Lumpur, for the month was 197.2 mm. The greatest fall for the 24 hours ending 6 p.m. was 43.1 mm. on the 8th. There was no recorded fall on 15 days. The mean temperatures for the month were: 9 a.m., 80.9 degrees; 3 p.m., 83.96 degrees; 9 p.m., 76.5 degrees. The maximum temperature was 93 degrees on the 7th, 24th and 25th, and the lowest was 69 degrees on the 22nd and 24th.

(7) Eight samples of milk were sent to the Government Chemist for analysis during the month, two of which were found to be adulterated.

GENERAL.

1. The Chairman notifies the Board that V. E. M. Gothandapani refused to accept the four stalls offered to him in the Central Market for the sale of mutton.

2. The Chairman informs the meeting that the account of the bath-house contractor for 1924 was \$261.28 and after going through the account with the late lessee he agreed to accept \$230 and to withdraw the claim for the balance of \$31.28. The \$230 has now been paid and he asks the Board to confirm his action. The Board confirms.

3. Mr. Talalla gives notice of the following motion: That the Resident be requested to appoint a Committee of experts to consider the possibility of adopting a sewerage scheme for Kuala Lumpur and advise when, where and how is the first instalment to be started.

The meeting adjourns at 11.45 a.m.

No. 5728.—SANITARY BOARD, KLANG.—

Minutes of a meeting of the Klang Sanitary Board held on Saturday, the 15th August, 1925.

PRESENT: The *Chairman* (Major F. W. Douglas, M.C.S.), the Dato Stia di Rajah (Inche Abdul Razak, M.C.S., J.P., I.S.O.), the Medical Officer (Dr. J. G. Castellain, M.M.S.), the Assistant Commissioner of Police (Mr. J. D. Hussey), Dr. W. Ansley-Young and Messrs. Lim Hin Kiong and Kow Tiam Chuan.

ABSENT: The Executive Engineer (Mr. W. H. Morgan), the Harbour Master (Lt.-Comm. R. C. Hayes, O.B.E., R.N.), the Health Officer (Dr. M. J. Graham, M.M.S.) and Messrs. H. A. Wootton, C. G. Brown, K. A. Vaner.

1. Arising out of the minutes of the previous meeting:

- (i) Enforcement of the ruling to remove all stalls between the hours of 8 a.m. to 9 a.m. The Board approves prosecuting all stall-holders who have not complied with the ruling.
- (ii) Dr. Ansley-Young asks that in addition to a precipitant being tried at the reservoirs that the original proposal, namely, extension of pipes to the middle of the lake and a floating arm be provided for.
- (iii) New Klang and Port Swettenham Sanitary Board areas: The Chairman informs the Board of the decision of the Hon. the British Resident to preserve the identity of each of these two Sanitary Board areas. The contiguous boundary at the 3rd milestone, Port Swettenham Road, is approved by the Board.
- (iv) The Assistant Commissioner of Police reports that trained policemen are now provided for traffic duty at the islands.
- (v) Report of sub-committee for new stands for hired cars is read and approved, viz.:
 - (1) Stand for 12 hired cars, outside the Railway Station in Main Street, subject to approval of Railway Authorities.
 - (2) Stand for 12 cars in Bridge Alley.
 - (3) Stand for cars in Guan Hup Street.
 - (4) Stand for cars in New Road.

2. The minutes are then taken as read and confirmed.

3. It is decided to hold future meetings of the Board on the afternoons of the second Tuesdays of the month.

4. Application to treat rubber in the factory on portion No. 2,485, Kapar Road. The Board has no objection provided that a drain is made to the large outlet drain and the premises and its surroundings are cleaned up thoroughly.

5. Letter from the Secretary to Resident asking for recommendations for the assessment rate to be imposed in 1926. The Chairman reports that a trial balance sheet of receipts and expenditure indicates that this Board would pay its way. Decided to appoint a sub-committee, consisting of the Chairman, Dr. W. Ansley-Young and Mr. Kow Tiam Chuan, to investigate and report.

6. Letter from the Secretary to Resident asking for proposals for water-rate for 1926. The Chairman submits figures as under:

It is impossible to separate the cost of maintenance of the Subang supply which was originally made for an estate supply, but the capital cost of Subang before the 18" main was laid into Klang and before spillway was raised (both works intended to augment the town supply) was \$610,435 and this means that the capital cost of the town supply may be estimated at \$684,860 or \$713,860 (1926).

The gross receipts from the town amount to \$42,800 or $6\frac{1}{4}$ per cent. on \$684,860 or 6 per cent. on \$713,860.

The gross receipts from the estates amount to \$27,755 or $4\frac{1}{2}$ per cent. on \$610,435.

It may therefore be claimed that the water-rate should not be altered.

The Board considers that this is a fair reimbursement-in-aid on capital and that the present water-rate should not be altered.

7. Three private water supplies to small holdings along the Meru Road are approved at a flat rate of \$1.10 per acre provided that each applicant makes proper drains and aprons to the satisfaction of the Health Department.

8. Application from the Manager of Batu Unjor Estate asking that the estate be excluded from the proposed extension of the Klang Sanitary Board area. The Chairman reports that an alternative proposal has been submitted to the British Resident.

9. Corrected death-rate for Klang and Port Swettenham: The Board comments on the large number of deaths which are not certified by a Medical Practitioner and refers to the practice in Ipoh and Kuala Lumpur where no person may be buried unless

- (a) Medical certificate is produced or
- (b) The body is viewed by an officer of the Health Department who usually get a better diagnosis by viewing the body and by enquiries.

The Board agrees that the corrected death-rate is an index to guide their effort at sanitation, otherwise it may be entirely misdirected and result in waste of money and effort. The Board decides to recommend that, if no medical certificate is produced, the body should be viewed by an Assistant Surgeon from the hospital in Klang and by the Deputy Health Officer in Port Swettenham and that a fee of \$1 should be paid to them for each inspection.

10. The Chairman informs the Board that at a meeting of the Chinese held in their Merchant Club on the 8th August it was proposed to start a Maternity Hospital for Chinese in Klang and he had been asked to recommend the institution to Government for financial assistance as had been provided to the one in Kuala Lumpur. The Chinese members and Dr. W. Ansley-Young strongly support the proposal and the Board unanimously agree that the institution, once on a sound footing, would be a large factor in reducing the present high rate of infantile mortality in the district.

11. Branding of cattle: The Chairman draws attention to a proposal in Perak for branding cattle for purposes of identification. The Board asks the Assistant Commissioner of Police to look into the matter and submit a report.

12. Water supply to Telok Pulai and Kampong Java Roads: A further petition from the inhabitants along these roads is read. The Chairman informs the members that the Executive Engineer, Kuala Lumpur, is salving about four miles of 4" pipes and that the State Engineer is willing to let Klang have them at a valuation. The cost of laying and fixing the pipes together with dipper fountain would cost approximately \$3,100. The Board decide to recommend this request for consideration.

13. Mr. Kow Tiam Chuan asks that the public lighting may be extended along the roads in the new area. The Chairman replies that the Electric Light Scheme for Klang is having the immediate attention of Government and that it would be unwise to spend any further money in extending the present system of street lighting unless the Board was definitely informed that the scheme had not been approved.

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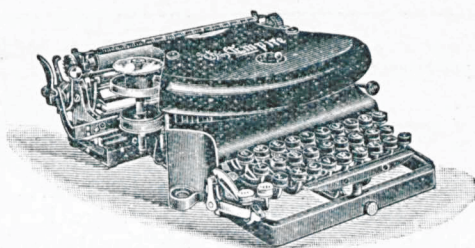
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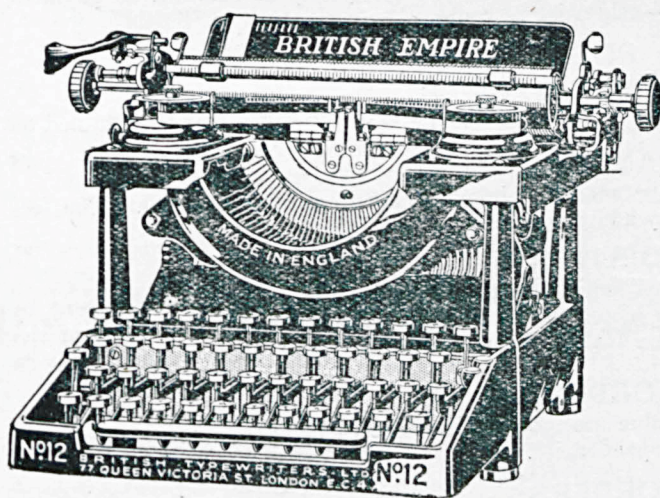
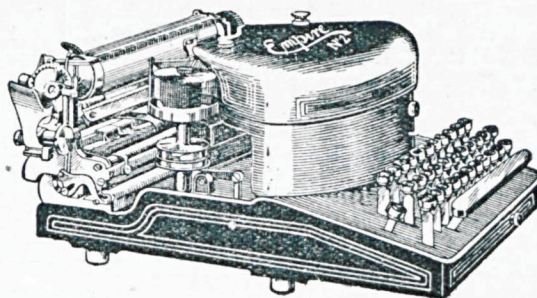

Trunk Lines.—All the exchanges are connected by trunk lines and except between the most distant exchanges a subscriber to any exchange can speak to a subscriber to any other exchange. Subject to similar limitations a subscriber to an exchange in the Federated Malay States can speak to a subscriber to an exchange in Penang, Province Wellesley, Malacca and the Muar district of Johore.

Half rates are charged for **TRUNK CALLS** between 7 p.m. and 7 a.m.

Public call boxes are also maintained at the above-mentioned places and a charge of 10 cents per 3 minutes is made for their use. Trunk calls extra.

Trunk calls may be originated at these public call boxes.

Non-subscribers can make calls from the public call box or telephone at any of the above-named Post Offices. Charge, 10 cents for 3 minutes. Trunk calls according to trunk rates.

PRIVATE LETTER BOXES.

Private Letter Boxes can be rented at **KUALA LUMPUR, SEREMBAN, TAIPING, KLANG, and IPOH** Post Offices. Keys are provided and box-holders can obtain their letters at any hour of the day or night.

Fee \$10 per annum.

WINDOW DELIVERY TICKETS.

At **ALL OFFICES** Window Delivery Tickets may be obtained. These entitle holders to take delivery of their correspondence at the public counter during hours the office is open for public business. Locked bags may be used for the delivery of correspondence (but not for posting) free of extra charge.

Fee \$10 per annum.

LOCKED BAGS (Private Letter Bags).

Members of the public may have their correspondence sent to and collected from the Post Office in Private (locked) bags.

Fees: (i) For persons carrying on any trade or business within the limits of a postman's delivery, each bag \$20 per annum;

(ii) For all other persons, each bag \$10 per annum.

POSTAL OR TAPPAL BOOKS.

Postal or Tappal books may be used for the entry of correspondence sent to the post and for the entry by the postal officials of correspondence sent out for delivery. Locked bags may be used in connection with these books without additional charge.

Fees: (i) For persons carrying on any trade or business within the limits of a postman's delivery, each book \$20 per annum;

(ii) For all other persons, each book \$10 per annum.

The Post Office Guide, price 50 cents, contains full information on all the above and many other services, rates, etc., and may be obtained at all Post Offices.
