“THE MILITARY MANŒUVRES ENACTMENT, 1905.”

No. 5729.—In exercise of the powers conferred upon him by section 12 of “The Military Manœuvres Enactment, 1905,” and with reference to the firing ground declared by proclamation published as Notification No. 1656 in the *Gazette* of 23rd March, 1923, the Officer Commanding the Troops hereby makes the following rule:

Every person not engaged in military exercises shall be excluded during the period of such exercises from the whole of the firing ground.

It is further notified for general information that four red flags will be flown from the corners of the firing ground during the period of any firing exercises and from noon on the day prior to these exercises. [G. 2178/25.]

“THE MINOR OFFENCES ENACTMENT, 1920.”

No. 5730.—Police Order made under section 3 (iii) of “The Minor Offences Enactment, 1920,” for the regulation of traffic on the occasion of the races on the 5th, 9th and 12th September, 1925, at the Race-course situated off Ampang Road, Kuala Lumpur.

All vehicles entering the Race-course by the main Public Entrance on Ampang Road for the purpose of access to the Turf Club grounds should set down passengers at the Main Gate and then circle left and be parked as may be directed by the Police on duty.
