"THE MINOR OFFENCES ENACTMENT, 1920."

No. 7176.—Police Order made under section 3 (iii) of "The Minor Offences Enactment, 1920," for the regulation of traffic on the occasion of the Armistice Celebrations on the 11th November, 1925, at the Cenotaph, Kuala Lumpur:

Damansara Road from the M.S.V.R. Head-quarters to the Railway Offices will be closed to traffic at 7 a.m.

Cars arriving up from Chartered Bank at 7 a.m. will park along Damansara Road, from Bluff Road corner to Hospital Road corner, and on the grass in front of the M.S.V.R. Head-quarters.

Cars approaching from Station Hotel end will park in front of the Railway Offices as directed by Police on duty.

Cars arriving after 7 a.m. will approach down Venning Road and park as directed by the Police in front of the Railway Offices.

From 11 a.m. till 11.2 a.m. all traffic movement will be stopped between the following points:

- (1) Damansara Road from the High Street Railway Bridge to the Chartered Bank corner.
- (2) In the whole of Jalan Raja.
- (3) Batu Road from Gombak Bridge to corner of Java Street.
- (4) Points on Weld Road one hundred yards either side of St. Andrews Church.

No. 7177.—Police Order made under section 3 (iii) of "The Minor Offences Enactment, 1920," for the regulation of traffic on the occasion of the races on the 11th and 14th November, 1925, at the Race Course situated off Ampang Road, Kuala Lumpur.

All vehicles entering the Race Course by the main Public Entrance on Ampang Road for the purpose of access to the Turf Club grounds should set down passengers at the Main Gate and then circle left and be parked as may be directed by the Police on duty.
