No. 49.—THE following Bill about to be introduced in the Legislative Council is published for general information:—

A BILL intituled

AN Ordinance to amend the Straits Settlements Loan Ordinance, 1921.

It is hereby enacted by the Governor of the Straits Settlements with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof as follows:—

Short title. 1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Straits Settlements Loan Ordinance, 1921 (Amendment) Ordinance, 1922.

Amendment of section 2 of the 1921 Loan Ordinance. 2. For the words "twenty million dollars" in section 2 of the Straits Settlements Loan Ordinance, 1921 the words "twenty million two hundred and sixteen thousand three hundred dollars" are substituted.

OBJECTS AND REASONS.

The object of this Bill is to increase the amount of the loan authorised by the Ordinance of 1921.

The reason of the Bill is that the Loan was over-subscribed by the amount of the increase.

No. 50.—THE PENANG FREE SCHOOL ACQUISITION ORDINANCE, 1921.

THE following rules made by the Trustees of the Penang Free School, under Section 12 of the Penang Free School Acquisition Ordinance, 1921 and approved by His Excellency the Governor, are published for general information:—

1. Not less than a week's notice shall be given of every meeting of the Trustees.
2. Not less than one regular meeting of the Trustees shall be held each half-year.
3. Meetings of the Trustees shall be called by the Secretary, on the instructions of the Director of Education, or the Resident Councillor, Penang, or at the request of any two Trustees.
4. Three Trustees shall form a quorum.
5. Cheques on current account shall be signed by the Treasurer and one other Trustee.
6. All bonds, securities, investments and title deeds belonging to the Corporation shall be deposited in a Bank and shall not be removed therefrom except under the joint signatures of the Resident Councillor and the Treasurer of the Trustees. [No. 10334/21.]

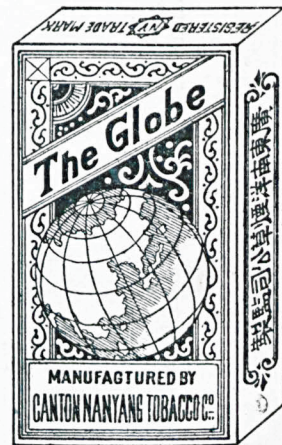

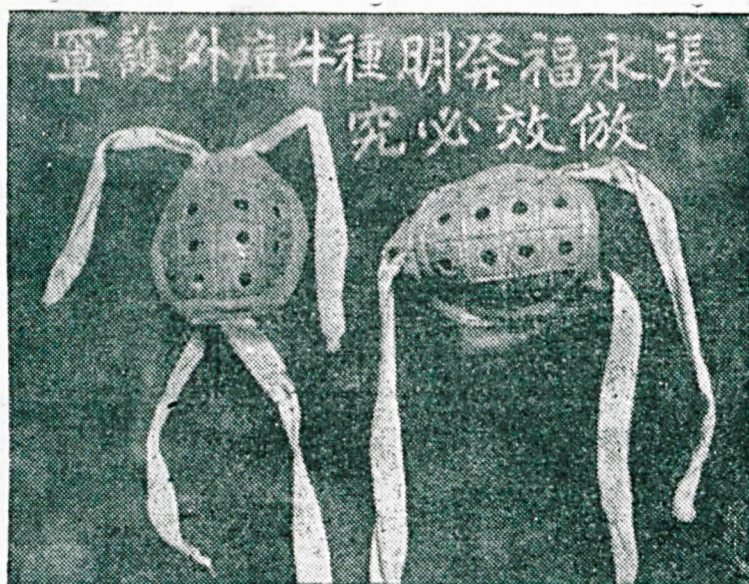

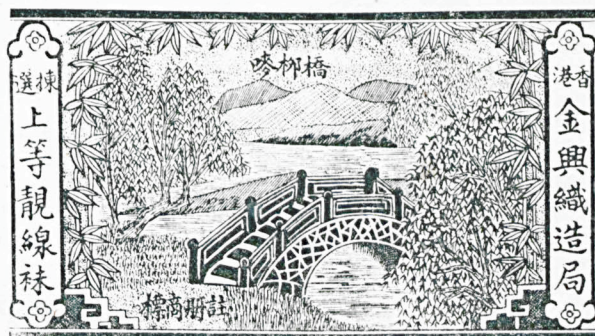
