No. 79.—ORDER BY HIS EXCELLENCY SIR LAURENCE NUNNS GUILLEMARD, K.C.B., GOVERNOR AND COMMANDER IN CHIEF, STRAITS SETTLEMENTS.

THE Volunteer Ordinance, 1921, having now become law, the Volunteer Corps of the Colony as constituted under the previous Ordinance cease to exist, and I desire to express to Officers, Warrant Officers, Non-Commissioned Officers and men of the Volunteer Corps of Singapore, Malacca, Penang and Province Wellesley my sincere appreciation of and thanks for their loyal services in the past, especially during the period of the late war. No. 80.—NOTICE.

PENDING the approval of the War Office, officers on the Regular Army Reserve of Officers may enrol provisionally in the Straits Settlements Volunteers without resigning their commissions on the Reserve of Officers, and without prejudice to their position as Reserve Officers.

Any such officer provisionally joining the Volunteers will be granted his discharge from the Volunteers should his services be required by the War Office, or should the War Office be unable to agree to enrolment in the Straits Settlements Volunteer Force. [No. 10867/21.]
