PROCLAMATION



L. N. GUILLEMARD,

Governor and Commander-in-Chief.

Whereas by Ordinance No. 136 (Arms and Explosives) it is, amongst other things, enacted that the Governor in Council may prohibit by Proclamation for stated periods the exportation from this Colony to any place to be named in such Proclamation of arms, explosives or any specified class of explosives, naval and military stores, and articles which in the opinion of the Governor in Council are capable of being converted into or of being made useful for manufacturing arms, explosives or naval or military stores:

AND WHEREAS it has been brought to the notice of the Governor in Council that it is expedient to prevent the importation into Burma of the articles hereinafter mentioned:

It is hereby proclaimed by the Governor in Council that the exportation of the articles contained in the Schedule hereto from any port or place in this Colony to Burma is prohibited for a further period of five years as from the 1st February, 1922.

GIVEN at Singapore, this 31st day of January, in the year of Our Lord one thousand nine hundred and twenty-two.

Explosives other than explosives required for blasting purposes exported from Penang to Victoria Point:

Arms, naval and military stores; Saltpetre and sulphur.
