No. 205.—ORDINANCE No. 125 (MERCHANT SHIPPING).

ORDER BY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL UNDER.

IN exercise of the powers conferred on him by sections 7 and 8 of Ordinance No. 125 (Merchant Shipping), the Governor in Council alters the limits of the Port of Singapore laid down in Notification No. 1219, published in *Gazette* of 1st November, 1912, and defines the limits of the Port of Singapore as follows:—

From an obelisk built on Tanjong Katong in a straight line to an obelisk built on Peak Island, thence along the Southern shore of that island to its south-west point, thence to the southern point of East St. John's Island thence to the southern point of West St. John's Island, thence to the southern point of Pulo Sabarok, thence along a straight line due west until it meets a straight line drawn north and south through the western beacon on Cyrene Shoal, thence northward along that line till it meets the Island of Singapore, thence eastward along the shores of the Island of Singapore to the said obelisk at Tanjong Katong, including the Singapore River as far as Kim Seng Bridge, the Rochore River as far as Kampong Kerbau Bridge, the Kalang River as far as the iron bridge, and the Gelang River as far as the Police Station, Gelang, and including all piers, jetties, landing-places, wharves, quays, docks, and other similar works within the limits above set out whether within or without the line of high-water mark and (subject to any rights of private property therein) all portions of the shore or bank within fifty yards of high-water mark.

No. 206.—ORDINANCE No. 125 (MERCHANT SHIPPING).

THE Passenger Steamer Rules, 1911, published as Notification No. 1246 in the *Gazette* of the 1st November, 1912, are hereby amended by the addition of the following new rules:—

80.—(a) No deck cargo or fuel of any description shall be carried on board any vessel in such a manner as to prevent free access to any hatch or any bunker opening.

80.—(b) No deck cargo or fuel shall be carried in the vicinity of any opening to the engine-room or stoke-hole which would prevent the immediate closing of such opening.

The above amendments having been approved by resolution of the Legislative Council, on the 23rd day of January, 1922, shall come into operation from that date. [No. 8462/21.]
