No. 578.—ORDINANCE No. 109 (PETROLEUM).

By-LAWS to regulate the storage of dangerous petroleum in quantities not exceeding 50 gallons, made by the Singapore Rural Board under the provisions of section 29 of Ordinance No. 109 (Petroleum).

Storage of Dangerous Petroleum in quantities not exceeding 20 gallons.

- 1. A person may store dangerous petroleum in quantities not exceeding 20 gallons provided that such supply is for private use only and provided that a permit for the storage of the same has been granted by the Rural Board.
- 2. Before the Rural Board will grant a permit for the storage for private use only of dangerous petroleum in quantities not exceeding 20 gallons the applicant shall state for the approval of the Rural Board where the dangerous petroleum is to be kept and for what purpose it is to be used and any other particulars that may be required.
- 3. Before the Rural Board will grant a licence for the storage of dangerous petroleum in quantities not exceeding 20 gallons for the purpose of sale the applicant shall state in writing the position on the premises in which the dangerous petroleum is to be stored and such position shall be approved by the Rural Board and entered on the licence.

Storage of Dangerous Petroleum in Quantities not exceeding 50 gallons.

- 4. Before the Rural Board will grant a licence for the storage of dangerous petroleum in quantities exceeding 20 gallons but not exceeding 50 gallons the applicant shall provide within his premises in such a position as may be approved by the Rural Board one or more storage bins or receptacles constructed of such material and in such a manner as shall be stipulated by the Board.
- 5. The dangerous petroleum shall be stored in the approved position of receptacles only and in no other part of the premises.
- In premises licensed for the storage of 20 gallons or over no fire
 or cooking-place or artificial light shall be used within 15 feet of the storage
 receptacle.

Penalty.

7. Any person committing any breach of these By-laws other than a breach for which a penalty is imposed by Ordinance No. 109 (Petroleum) shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable on conviction by a Police Court to a fine not exceeding \$1,000 or in the case of a continuing offence a fine not exceeding \$50 a day for each day during which the offence is continued.

No. 579.—ORDINANCE No. 55 (TELEGRAPHS).

RULES MADE BY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL UNDER SECTION 6 (2) (a).

- 1. THE fee for the use of a Government Call Office telephone for each period of five minutes or fraction thereof shall be as indicated in the Schedule hereunder.
- 2. No person shall be entitled to use a Government Call Office telephone continuously for more than ten minutes, but he may at the end of this period of 10 minutes secure its use for further periods of five minutes at a time provided no other person wishes to use the line.
 - The fee shall be payable by subscribers as well as others.

4. The fee may be refunded when the Postmaster-General or his Deputy is satisfied that the call has failed owing to a fault of the telephone service.

SPENCER GULF-APPROACH TO PORT AUGUSTA.

REFERRING to Notice to Mariners No. 19 of 1913, Masters of Vessels, Pilots, and others are hereby notified that on or about December 13th, 1921, No. 2 light beacon will be moved to a new position in shallow water about \(\frac{1}{4} \) mile northward.

During the alteration a white light will be exhibited at night from a vessel anchored at the new site.

The new beacon, when erected, will be of similar construction to the present beacons, and will be in about 9ft, of water at L.W.S.T. at a distance of approximately 6 cables N.N.W. from the two-pile red beacon shown on Admiralty chart No. 401.

The character of the light will remain unaltered, except that the arc of visibility will be 211° instead of 215°, the light being obscured over middle bank.

Mariners when approaching this light beacon inward bound, must keep well clear to avoid the shallow water, which extends for a distance of I mile in a S.S.-easterly direction from the beacon, and is within the arc of visibility of the light.

No. 372.—ORDINANCE NO. 135 (MUNICIPAL).

To the occupiers of premises within Conservancy District No. 8 bounded by:-

South Bridge Road, Spring Street, Banda Street, Sago Lane, Sago Street, New Bridge Road, and Boat Quay.

Notice is hereby given that in exercise of the powers vested in the Municipal Commissioners by section 222 of Ordinance No. 135 (Municipal), and with the approval of the Governor in Council, a compulsory system of night-soil removal, by which the soiled pail and its contents will be removed from each latrine, will be applied to that area on and after the first day of May, 1922.*

And that in exercise of the powers vested in them by section 223 (2) & (3) of Ordinance No. 135 (Municipal), and with the approval of the Governor in Council, the following fees will be charged for removal of night-soil and the cleansing of latrine:—

For removal every day, if recommended by the Health Officer, \$4 per latrine per mensem payable quarterly in advance.

For removal every alternate day \$2 per latrine per mensem, payable quarterly in advance.

And that in exercise of the powers vested in them by section 223 (1) of Ordinance No. 135 (Municipal), and with the approval of the Governor in Council, the following regulations have been approved for the purpose of removal of night-soil:—

- I. Every latrine shall be provided with its own pail, which shall be of Standard Municipal pattern.
 - (a) The walls, up to the seat and base of the compartment holding the pail, shall be plastered with cement or other impervious material.
 - (b) The base of every latrine shall be not less than 3 inches above the adjoining floor level, and shall be laid so as to fall towards and into a proper drain, which must be constructed if not already provided. Granite slabs shall be laid to support the pail.
 - (c) No latrine shall be of what is known as the "drop" class, that is, communicating directly by means of a shaft or tube with a latrine below.
 - (d) The doors and walls of all latrines shall be so constructed as to permit of ample circulation of air.
 - (e) The pail must be so placed that its top shall be not more than one inch below the underside of the urine guard. The hole in the seat shall be not more than 9 inches wide or I foot 2 inches long and the base shall be arranged so as to guide the pail into its proper place.
 - (f) Every latrine shall be provided with proper iron pail doors of sufficient size, hanging from the top or side, with a clear space of one inch at the bottom.
 - (g) Every latrine shall be constructed in accordance with the Municipal design.
- 2. The coolies and overseers of the Commissioners shall be allowed free access daily, between the hours of 6 A. M. and 10 A. M., to every latrine within the area aforesaid, for the purpose of removing night-soil.
- 3. The Commissioners will at their expense provide pails to facilitate removal, also pails in place of those worn out, or broken, otherwise than through neglect or misuse by the occupier of the house or his servants.
- 4. The occupier of every house within the aforesaid area shall take steps to ensure the safe custody, preservation, and proper use of all latrine pails used in his house or compound, and in the event of loss he will be charged the cost of replacement.




