QUARANTINE.

No. 607.—MANILA.—It is hereby notified that Notification No. 119, published in the *Gazette* of the 20th January, 1922, by which the port of Manila was declared to be suspected on account of Cholera, is hereby cancelled. [No. 302/22.]

No. 608.—ORDINANCE NO. 157 (QUARANTINE AND PREVENTION OF DISEASE).

PLAGUE.—Information having been received that a dangerous infectious or contagious disease, namely, plague, exists in an epidemic state at Bombay, it is hereby declared by His Excellency the Governor, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 48 of Ordinance No. 157 (Quarantine and Prevention of Disease), that the port of Bombay is an infected place for the purposes of the said Ordinance.
