**Motor Omnibus By-Laws.**

THE following amendment of the By-laws under section 57 (1), (w<sup>1</sup>) and section 302 of the Municipal Ordinance, 1913 (corresponding to section 57 (1) (a<sup>1</sup>) and section 318 of Ordinance No. 135 (Municipal)) and confirmed by the Governor in Council under Notification No. 1129, published in *Government Gazette* of 8th July, 1921, was passed at a Special Meeting of the Municipal Commissioners of Singapore, held on the 24th March, 1922:—

Add 3A—After the first day of April, 1922, no vehicle intended for use as a Motor Omnibus shall be licensed which has not been inspected, tested and approved by the Municipal Superintendent of Machinery, and which does not further comply with the regulations set out in the schedule hereto.

THE SCHEDULE ABOVE REFERRED TO.

*Regulations for Motor Omnibuses.*

*Steering Gear.*—Must not be more than  $\frac{1}{4}$  turn slack.

*Omnibus Bodies.*—For one ton chassis and under the overhang must not be more than  $\frac{1}{4}$  of the wheel base, the overhang to be measured from centre of rear axle to the back of body, neglecting steps.

For chassis over one ton the overhang at rear must not be more than 5 inches per foot of wheel base, the overhang to be measured as above.

*Width.*—The body must not extend more than 6 inches outside the outer rims of rear wheels.

*Height.*—The over-all height of body from ground level must not be more than 8' 9" for one ton chassis or under and not more than 9' 3" for chassis over one ton.

The height from floor of bus to ceiling must not be less than 5' 6".

Top of floor to be not more than 7 $\frac{1}{2}$ " above top of chassis frame.

Floor boards to be not less than  $\frac{1}{8}$ " thick.

*Seating Accommodation.*—The minimum seating space per passenger must not be less than 15 inches, except that a seat for two passengers only may be of a minimum length of 27 inches. The maximum height of seat must not exceed 17 $\frac{1}{2}$  inches measured from floor to top of seat.

*Construction of Body.*—When chassis frame is less than  $\frac{1}{4}$  inch thick, the cross members must rest on fore and aft runners not less than 3" deep  $\times$  2 $\frac{1}{2}$ ".

Each runner to be secured to chassis frame by not less than 3 clips. The clips to be not less than  $\frac{5}{8}$ " iron with a plate of not less than 2"  $\times$   $\frac{1}{2}$ " on the bottom side held in position by nuts. When the clips pass round the frame, a wooden block must be tightly fitted into the frame in such a manner that it is impossible to remove it without taking off the clip.

The body must rest on cross members spaced not more than 3 feet apart.

The cross members to be not less than 3" deep  $\times$  2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " cross section and secured to the fore and aft runners by bolts of not less than  $\frac{1}{2}$ " diameter, washers to be fitted under head of bolt and nut.

The fore and aft frame of the body must not be less than 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " deep  $\times$  3" cross section timber properly secured to the cross members by bolts of not less than  $\frac{1}{2}$ " diameter iron washers to be fitted under head and nut of bolts.

The upright member of the body must be properly secured to cross and longitudinal frame by angle bars or gusset plates.

The top of body must be secured to the sides of body in a like manner.

No omnibus when complete in running order for the road but without passengers, driver or conductor shall weigh more than 4 tons.

Ample clearance must be provided between top of wheels and body, if necessary, by providing buckets in floor.

*N. B.*—Where sizes are given it is assumed that best quality chengie, balan or teak wood are used and other materials are of the best and strongest kinds and if such are not used, sizes must be correspondingly increased. [No. 2854/22.]

To the occupiers of premises within Conservancy District No. 8 bounded by:—

South Bridge Road, Spring Street, Banda Street, Sago Lane, Sago Street, New Bridge Road, and Boat Quay.

Notice is hereby given that in exercise of the powers vested in the Municipal Commissioners by section 222 of Ordinance No. 135 (Municipal), and with the approval of the Governor in Council, a compulsory system of night-soil removal, by which the soiled pail and its contents will be removed from each latrine, will be applied to that area on and after the first day of May, 1922.\*

And that in exercise of the powers vested in them by section 223 (2) & (3) of Ordinance No. 135 (Municipal), and with the approval of the Governor in Council, the following fees will be charged for removal of night-soil and the cleansing of latrine:—

For removal every day, if recommended by the Health Officer, \$4 per latrine per mensem payable quarterly in advance.

For removal every alternate day \$2 per latrine per mensem, payable quarterly in advance.

And that in exercise of the powers vested in them by section 223 (1) of Ordinance No. 135 (Municipal), and with the approval of the Governor in Council, the following regulations have been approved for the purpose of removal of night-soil:—

1. Every latrine shall be provided with its own pail, which shall be of Standard Municipal pattern.
  - (a) The walls, up to the seat and base of the compartment holding the pail, shall be plastered with cement or other impervious material.
  - (b) The base of every latrine shall be not less than 3 inches above the adjoining floor level, and shall be laid so as to fall towards and into a proper drain, which must be constructed if not already provided. Granite slabs shall be laid to support the pail.
  - (c) No latrine shall be of what is known as the "drop" class, that is, communicating directly by means of a shaft or tube with a latrine below.
  - (d) The doors and walls of all latrines shall be so constructed as to permit of ample circulation of air.
  - (e) The pail must be so placed that its top shall be not more than one inch below the underside of the urine guard. The hole in the seat shall be not more than 9 inches wide or 1 foot 2 inches long and the base shall be arranged so as to guide the pail into its proper place.
  - (f) Every latrine shall be provided with proper iron pail doors of sufficient size, hanging from the top or side, with a clear space of one inch at the bottom.
  - (g) Every latrine shall be constructed in accordance with the Municipal design.

2. The coolies and overseers of the Commissioners shall be allowed free access daily, between the hours of 6 A. M. and 10 A. M., to every latrine within the area aforesaid, for the purpose of removing night-soil.

3. The Commissioners will at their expense provide pails to facilitate removal, also pails in place of those worn out, or broken, otherwise than through neglect or misuse by the occupier of the house or his servants.

4. The occupier of every house within the aforesaid area shall take steps to ensure the safe custody, preservation, and proper use of all latrine pails used in his house or compound, and in the event of loss he will be charged the cost of replacement.
