QUARANTINE.

No. 659.—ORDINANCE NO. 157 (QUARANTINE AND PREVENTION OF DISEASE).

SMALL-POX.—Information having been received that a dangerous infectious or contagious disease, namely, small-pox, exists in an epidemic state at Calcutta, it is hereby declared by His Excellency the Governor, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 48 of Ordinance No. 157 (Quarantine and Prevention of Disease), that the port of Calcutta is an infected place for the purposes of the said Ordinance. No. 660.—ORDINANCE NO. 157 (QUARANTINE AND PREVENTION OF DISEASE).

PLAGUE.—Information having been received that a dangerous infectious or contagious disease, namely, plague, exists in an epidemic state at Hongkong, it is hereby declared by His Excellency the Governor, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 48 of Ordinance No. 157 (Quarantine and Prevention of Disease), that the port of Hongkong is an infected place for the purposes of the said Ordinance.
