Dr. D. J. Galloway takes the oaths and assumes his seat as an Unofficial Member of the Council.

Mr. LEE CHOON GUAN takes the oaths and assumes his seat as an Unofficial Member of the Council.

On the motion of the ACTING ATTORNEY-GENERAL, the following papers are laid on the table:-

- Report of the Committee appointed to consider and advise regarding the pay and conditions of service of the Asiatic Members of the Police Forces in the Straits Settlements and the Federated Malay States.
- Report of the Import and Export Office for the year 1921.
- No. 14. Report of the Registry, Supreme Court, for the year 1921.
- Rubber Lands Bill. No. 15.
- Schedule of Additions to Estimates authorised from 1st February No. 16. to 28th February, 1922.

Mr. W. H. Thorne gives notice that at the next meeting of Council he will move:—

"That the emoluments of the Colonial Engineer be reduced by one-half until such time as the alterations and amendments to the Penang General Hospital are put in hand."

The Treasurer addresses the Council and, seconded by the Colonial Engineer, moves:—

"That this Council approves of a special vote of \$20,000 for rebuilding the River Wall North of Kim Seng Bridge, Malacca."

The motion is agreed to.

The Treasurer addresses the Council and, seconded by Mr. Saunders, moves:—

"That this Council approves of an expenditure of \$22,112 for furniture, equipment, staff and running expenses for the current year in connection with the temporary Elementary English School."

The motion is agreed to.

The Treasurer addresses the Council and, seconded by Captain Chancellor, moves:—

"That this Council approves of an extension of \$20,000 to the vote 'Clothing and Equipment \$10,100'. Item 6, Page 94 of the Estimates for the current year."

The motion is agreed to.

The Treasurer addresses the Council and, seconded by Mr. Beatty, moves:—

"That this Council approves of a loan of \$25,000 to the Municipal Commissioners, Malacca, to finance a temporary relief Water Scheme."

Mr. CAMPBELL addresses the Council.

Dr. Galloway addresses the Council.

The Governor's Deputy replies.

The motion is agreed to.

The Treasurer addresses the Council and, seconded by the Colonial Engineer, moves:—

"That this Council approves of the Schedule of Additions made to the Estimates during the month of February, 1922, laid before the Council on the 27th March, 1922, as Council Paper No. 16 of 1922."

The motion is agreed to.

The Acting Attorney-General addresses the Council and, seconded by Mr. Saunders, moves the first reading of a Bill "To amend Ordinance No. 41 (Pensions)."

The Bill is read a first time.

The Acting Attorney-General gives notice that he will move the second reading of the Bill at the next meeting of Council.

The Acting Attorney-General addresses the Council and, seconded by Captain Chancellor, moves the first reading of a Bill "To amend Ordinance No. 39 (Malacca Lands Customary Rights)"

The Bill is read a first time.

The ACTING ATTORNEY-GENERAL gives notice that he will move the second reading of the Bill at the next meeting of Council.

The ACTING ATTORNEY-GENERAL addresses the Council and, seconded by Mr. Beatty, moves the first reading of a Bill "To amend Ordinance No. 135 (Municipal)".

The Bill is read a first time.

The ACTING ATTORNEY-GENERAL gives notice that he will move the second reading of the Bill at the next meeting of Council.

The Acting Attorney-General addresses the Council and, seconded by Mr. Saunders, moves the first reading of a Bill "To amend Ordinance No. 125 (Merchant Shipping)".

The Bill is read a first time.

The ACTING ATTORNEY-GENERAL gives notice that he will move the second reading of the Bill at the next meeting of Council.

The Acting Attorney-General addresses the Council and, seconded by Mr. Beatty, moves the first reading of a Bill "To amend Ordinance No. 44 (Bankruptcy)".

The Bill is read a first time.

The ACTING ATTORNEY-GENERAL gives notice that he will move the second reading of the Bill at the next meeting of Council.

The ACTING ATTORNEY-GENERAL, seconded by Mr. BEATTY; moves that the Raffles Committee Bill be read a second time.

Dr. GALLOWAY addresses the Council.

The motion is agreed to, and the Bill is read a second time.

On the motion of the ACTING ATTORNEY-GENERAL, Council goes into Committee on the Bill.

Clause 2 is amended in line 4 by reading "corporate" for "incorporate",

in line 5 by deleting "acquire and", in line 6 by deleting "to contract".

Clause 2 is passed as amended.

Clauses 3 and 4 are passed without amendment.

Clause 5 is amended by substituting "Colonial Secretary" for "Government" and passed as amended.

Clauses 6, 7 and 8 are passed without amendment.

Clause 9 is amended in (c) line 9 by adding after "Executive Committee" the words "and shall be assented to in writing by the COLONIAL SECRETARY"; in (c) line 10 by inserting after "signed" the words "and assented to".

Clause 9 is passed as amended.

Clause 10 is amended by omitting the word "present" in the marginal note and passed as amended.

Clauses II and I2 are passed without amendment.

Clause 13 is amended—

in sub-clause (a) by deleting the words "inauguration and";

sub-clause (c) line I by adding "in writing" after "Colonial Secretary";

sub-clause (c) line 4 by deleting the words "the inauguration for";

Clause 13 is passed as amended.

Clauses 14, 15 and 16 are passed without amendment.

Clause 17 is amended—

in sub-clause (b line 6 to 9 by deleting the words "including in either case the Principal of Raffles College or the Treasurer of the Straits Settlements";

in sub-clause (b) line 6 to 9 by deleting the words "including in either words "in pursuance of a resolution by that Committee", and in line 4 of the same sub-clause by substituting for the word "who" the words "both of whom".

Clause 17 is passed as amended.

Clause 18 is passed without amendment.

The Preamble is amended by omitting the marginal note and in line 23 by deleting the words "British, Malay, Chinese or other races" and substituting the words "various nationalities inhabiting the Malay Peninsula".

The Preamble is passed as amended.

Clause I is amended by deleting the words "(Financial and Executive)" and adding at the end of the clause "and shall come into operation at such date as shall be fixed by the Governor in Council by notification in the Gazette".

The marginal note is amended by adding the words "and commencement".

.Clause I is passed as amended.

Council resumes. The ACTING ATTORNEY-GENERAL reports that the Bill has been considered in Committee and passed with certain amendments and gives notice that he will move its third reading at the next meeting of Council.

The Treasurer, seconded by Mr. Saunders, moves that Ordinance No. 103 (Stamps) Amendment Bill be read a second time.

The motion is agreed to, and the Bill is read a second time.

On the motion of the Treasurer, Council goes into Committee on the Bill.

Clause 2 is completed by filling in the date as the 27th March, 1922, and passed as completed.

Clause 3 is passed without amendment.

Clause 4 is completed by filling in the date as the 27th March, 1921, and passed as completed.

The Schedule is passed without amendment.

Clause I and the enacting clause are passed without amendment.

Council resumes. The Treasurer reports that the Bill has been considered in Committee and passed with certain amendments and gives notice that he will move its third reading at the next meeting of Council.

Council goes into Committee on the Agricultural Pests (Amendment) Bill.

The following clause is inserted as clause 2 and passed without amendment:—

"2.—(1) The words "'Director' means 'Director of Agriculture, Federated Malay States'" in section 2 of Ordinance No. 166 (Agricultural Pests), hereinafter called the principal Ordinance, are deleted and the following are substituted therefor:

"'Secretary' means 'the Secretary for Agriculture, Straits Settlements and Federated Malay States'."

(2) The word 'Secretary' is substituted for the word 'Director' wherever the latter word occurs in the principal Ordinance.

(3) In section 7 (1) of the principal Ordinance the words 'Secretary for Agriculture' are substituted for the words 'Director of Agriculture in Kuala Lumpur'."

Clause 2, re-numbered clause 3, is amended by omitting the words "Ordinance No. 166 (Agricultural Pests)—hereinafter called the principal Ordinance"—and substituting therefor the words "the principal Ordinance", and is passed as amended.

Clause 3, re-numbered clause 4, is amended by deleting the words "are repealed" and substituting "of the principal Ordinance are deleted", and is passed as amended.

Clause 4, re-numbered clause 5, is passed without further amendment.

Clause 5, re-numbered clause 6, is amended by substituting the word "Secretary" for the word "Director" wherever it occurs, by deleting the word "inserted" in the marginal note, also in 12 B (v) line 3 by deleting the words "in the Resident's judgment" and substituting "in the judgment of the Collector of Land Revenue in Singapore or of the Resident Councillor in Penang or Malacca". It is decided to leave the Bill in Committee for addition of a further sub-clause 12 B (vi).

Clauses 6, 7 and 8, re-numbered clauses 7, 8 and 9 are passed without amendment.

Clause I is amended by substituting the words "Ordinance No. 166 (Agricultural Pests) Amendment Ordinance, 1922" for "The Agricultural Pests Amendment Ordinance, 1922," and is passed as amended.

The Bill is left in Committee.

Council goes into Committee on the Rubber Lands Assessment Bill.

The recommendations of the Select Committee—printed as Council Paper No. 15 of 1922—are adopted en bloc and the amendments proposed are passed accordingly. In addition the following further amendments are made:

Clause 2 is amended by substituting the words "In this Ordinance" for the words "for the purposes of this Ordinance". The marginal note is amended by substituting the word "Interpretation" for "Definitions".

Clause 3 (1) in lines 6 and 7 is amended by deleting the words from "a notification" to "forthwith" and substituting "the rate so prescribed shall be forthwith notified in the Gazette."

Clause 3 (3) is amended by substituting "centum" for "cent" and similarly throughout the Bill. The marginal note is amended by substituting the word "rate" for "assessment."

Clause 3 (4) is amended by adding at the end of sub-clause (4) the words "the rate so prescribed shall be forthwith notified in the Gazette."

Clause 3 (5) in line 6 is amended by deleting the words "thereto, in which event" and substituting the word "thereto. If the application is acceded to;"

in line 7 by substituting the words "sub-sections (1) to (3)" for sub-section (2)."

Clause 3 is passed as further amended.

Clauses 4 and 5 are passed without further amendment.

Clause 6 (2) in line 4 is amended by deleting the words "the rubber has been produced" and substituting "the tappable trees are standing,"

in line 6 by substituting the word "such" for "each," in line 7 by substituting the word "purposes" for "purpose."

Clause 6 is passed as further amended.

Clause 7 (I) in line 6 is amended by inserting the word "of" after the word "control".

Clause 7 (3-4) are amended by deleting sub-clause (3) and re-numbering sub-clause (4) as (3).

Clause 7 is passed as further amended.

Clause 8 is amended in line 4 by substituting "an" for "in" and is passed as further amended.

Clause 9—the marginal note is amended by adding the words "or for making incorrect return".

Clause 9 is passed as further amended.

Clause 10 is passed without further amendment.

Clause II is amended in line 9 by substituting the word "estimated" for the word "capital", and is passed as further amended.

Clause I and the enacting clause are passed without further amendment.

Council resumes. The ACTING ATTORNEY-GENERAL reports that the Bill has been considered in Committee and passed with certain amendments and, seconded by Mr. Saunders, moves that the Standing Orders relating to passage of Bills be suspended to permit the Bill to be read a third time and passed.

The motion is agreed to.

The ACTING ATTORNEY-GENERAL, seconded by Mr. BEATTY, moves that the Bill be read a third time.

The motion is agreed to, and the Bill is read a third time and passed.

The ACTING ATTORNEY-GENERAL addresses the Council and moves that the Merchant Shipping (Amendment) Bill be returned to Committee for further amendment.

The motion is agreed to.

Council goes into Committee on the Bill.

Clause 2 in line 3 is further amended by substituting "deleting all words" for "deleting the words".

Clause 2 is passed as further amended.

Clause 3 in lines 1 and 2 is amended by substituting the words "the principal Ordinance" for "Ordinance No. 125 (Merchant Shipping)".

The Bill is left in Committee pending consideration of further amendment to Clause 3.

On the motion of the GOVERNOR'S DEPUTY, Council adjourns until Monday, April 24th.

An Ordinance to provide for the assessment of Rubber Land in Rural Board Areas for the purposes of Ordinances No. 135 (Municipal) and No. 114 (Education Board).

[28th April, 1922.]

It is hereby enacted by the Governor of the Straits Settlements with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof as follows:-

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Rubber Lands Short title-Assessment Ordinance, 1922.

2. In this Ordinance—

Interpreta-

"Rubber Land" means any land mainly or substantially planted with rubber trees within a Rural Board area under one control or management in one or more separate blocks.

3.—(I) Where the rubber land to be assessed comprises Rate of 100 acres or more in area each Rural Board shall prescribe assessment on rubber lands in the first fourteen days of each quarter of every year (or of 100 acres as soon thereafter as possible) a rate to be paid in respect and over. of each pound of rubber produced from such rubber land during the preceding quarter and the rate so prescribed shall be forthwith notified in the Gazette.

(2) The rate referred to in sub-section (1) shall be How rate to assessed upon the average selling price of No. 1 latex be fixed. rubber at the Singapore auctions for the preceding quarter.

Amount of

- (3) When the price of rubber as notified for the time being in the Gazette is 35 cents per pound or over but is under 50 cents per pound the rate shall be
- 2 per centum of the value of rubber calculated at the price notified for the time being in the Gazette.
- When the price of rubber as notified for the time being in the Gazette is 50 cents per pound or over but is under \$1.50 per pound the rate shall be
- 21 per centum of the value of rubber calculated at the price notified for the time being in the Gazette.

When the price of rubber as notified for the time being in the Gazette is \$1.50 per pound or over the rate shall be 3 per centum of the value of rubber calculated at the price notified for the time being in the Gazette.

When the average selling price is less than 35 cents per pound no rate shall be prescribed.

(4) Where the rubber land to be assessed comprises less assessment on than 100 acres in area each Rural Board shall prescribe in the first fourteen days of every year (or as soon thereafter as possible) a rate to be paid in respect of each tappable tree standing on such land not exceeding 15 cents per tree which rate shall be the rate payable in respect of such land for that year and the rate so prescribed shall be forthwith notified in the Gazette.

Alternative rate of assessment on lands under 100 acres.

(5) Notwithstanding the provisions of the preceding subsection any owner of rubber land of less than 100 acres in area may apply to the Rural Board to be assessed under the provisions of sub-sections (1) to (3) hereof, and the Rural Board may in its discretion either refuse the application or accede thereto. If the application is acceded to the rate to be paid in respect of such rubber land shall be that prescribed by sub-sections (1) to (3) hereof. The Rural Board may of its own motion assess any area under 100 acres in according with the provisions of sub-sections (1) to (3) hereof.

Returns required from owner or manager

4. In the first fourteen days of each quarter of every year the owner or manager of any rubber land of 100 acres or more in area shall make a return to the Rural Board in which the land is situate, of the amount of rubber produced during the preceding quarter from all rubber land in his possession or under his control within the Rural Board area.

Returns in respect of small areas.

5. In cases where the rubber land is less than 100 acres in area the number of tappable rubber trees standing on such land shall be ascertained by such means as the Rural Board shall determine.

6.-(1) As soon as possible after the receipt of the return Amount of referred to in section 4 the Rural Board shall determine payable the amount payable in respect of the rubber comprised in the return. - 7.-(1) A notice stating the amount of the assessment Service of mentioned in section 6 for the purposes of Ordinance No. 135 (Municipal) and Ordinance No. 114 (Education Board) shall be served without delay on the owner or manager submitting the return, or in the case of lands less than 100 acres in area on the person in control of or managing the land.

- (2) Any notice required or authorised by this Ordinance to be served on any person may be served by delivering the same to such person, or by forwarding the same by post in a prepaid letter addressed to such person at his usual place of abode or business, or by leaving it at his usual abode or place of business.
- (3) A notice required or authorised by this Ordinance to be served on the owner or manager of any land shall be deemed to be properly addressed if addressed by the description of the "owner" or "manager" or "person in control" of such land without further name or description.
- **8.** If any sum payable as assessment under section 6 Recovery of is not paid within one month from the date of service of arrears. the notice referred to in section 7, such sum shall be deemed to be an arrear and the Rural Board may proceed to recover it in the manner prescribed for the recovery of assessment under Ordinance No. 135 (Municipal).

9. Any person who without reasonable excuse shall fail Penalty for to send in the return prescribed by section 4 or who shall not making send in a return containing any incorrect or incomplete making statement, unless he shall satisfy the Court that such state-incorrect ment was not made with the intent to evade payment of money return.

11. Nothing in this Ordinance contained shall be deemed to prevent any Rural Board from assessing any buildings erected on land subject to this Ordinance or any portion of such land used for any purpose other than the cultivation of rubber under Ordinance No. 135 (Municipal) and Ordinance No. 114 (Education Board), or to prevent a Rural Board assessing any rubber land suitable for building purposes within areas approved by the Governor in Council on the estimated value of such land in accordance with the provisions of Ordinance No. 135 (Municipal) and Ordinance No. 114 (Education Board).

Rules.

12. The Governor may make rules generally for the purposes of carrying out the provisions of this Ordinance.

An Ordinance to incorporate a Financial Committee and an Executive Committee of Raffles College and to regulate their procedure.

WHEREAS a Committee was appointed by the Governor to prepare and report upon a scheme for the purpose of celebrating the Centenary in the year 1919 of the foundation of the city of Singapore and of perpetuating the memory of Sir Thomas Stamford Raffles its founder,

AND WHEREAS the said Committee reported to the Governor on the 1st day of August, 1919, that they unanimously favoured a scheme providing for the advancement of education in the Colony and laying a secure foundation upon which a University might in the course of time be established,

AND WHEREAS the Government of the Straits Settlements declared itself to be in favour of the establishment of a College to be known as Raffles College as such centenary memorial and as the nucleus of a future university and offered certain lands as a site for such a College,

AND WHEREAS it is intended that the said College shall be established for the promotion of arts, science and learning and the provision of higher education for students without distinction of race, nationality or religion,

AND WHEREAS the Government of the Straits Settlements and the Federated Malay States and the States of Johore, Kedah and Kelantan and many corporations and firms and persons of various nationalities inhabiting the Malay Peninsula have subscribed funds for the equipment and endowment of such a College,

AND WHEREAS it is thought desirable to constitute and incorporate a Financial Committee to which the moneys subscribed and any investments made thereout may be transferred and to which any further subscriptions and donations may be paid and in which any immovable property hereafter granted or acquired for the purposes of the said College may be vested,

AND WHEREAS it is also desirable to constitute and incorporate an Executive Committee for the purpose of determining what steps are necessary or desirable to be taken towards the establishment of the said College and with the concurrence of the Governor of taking such steps and doing such acts as may be determined upon,

BE IT THEREFORE ENACTED by the Governor of the Straits Settlements by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof as follows:—

Short title and commencement 1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Raffles College (Committees Incorporation) Ordinance, 1922, and shall come into operation at such date as shall be fixed by the Governor in Council by notification in the *Gazette*.

Incorporation of "the Financial Committee of Raffles College." 2. There shall be established a body with the name and style of "The Financial Committee of Raffles College" (hereafter called "the Financial Committee") which body shall be a body corporate having perpetual succession and a common seal with power to hold property movable or immovable, to transfer the same, and to do all things necessary for or incidental to the purpose of its constitution.

Transfer of moneys and securities to the Financial Committee. 3. It shall be lawful for the Treasurer of the Straits Settlements or other the person or persons in whom the moneys subscribed for the aforesaid purpose or the securities in which such moneys or any part thereof have been and are now invested to pay and transfer the same to the Financial Committee.

Constitution of the Financial Committee.

- 4. The following persons shall be members of the Financial Committee:—
 - (a) The person for the time being discharging the duties of Principal of Raffles College.
 - (b) The person for the time being discharging the duties of the Treasurer of the Straits Settlements.
 - (c) Such other person or persons as the Governor may from time to time appoint for a period not exceeding one year to be a member or members thereof.

Treasurer of the Financial Committee. 5. The Financial Committee shall, with the sanction of the Colonial Secretary, elect one of its members to be treasurer of the Committee.

6. The Financial Committee shall cause proper books of Duties of account to be kept and within two months of the close of each Financial Committee year the Financial Committee shall cause to be prepared Accounts. a statement of their receipts and disbursements during the previous year and the same shall be subject to such audit and be published in such manner as the Colonial Secretary may direct.

- (c) To expend out of moneys in its hands (with power to realise any investments for the purpose) such moneys as they may be directed from time to time to expend by the Executive Committee of Raffles College hereinafter constituted, provided that every such direction shall be in writing and signed for and on behalf of the Executive Committee by the Principal of Raffles College or in his absence by the Chairman of the Executive Committee and shall be assented to in writing by the Colonial Secretary and any direction in writing so signed and assented to shall be conclusive evidence in favour of the Financial Committee that the direction therein contained is the direction of the Executive Committee.

 - (b) To direct the Financial Committee to expend such sums of money as the Executive Committee may from time to time decide to expend either for the acquisition of any property movable or immovable or otherwise for the purposes of the intended College. The assent of the Colonial Secretary in writing to all such expenditure shall first be obtained by the Executive Committee.
 - (c) With the assent of the Colonial Secretary in writing to enter into such contracts and to do such acts and things as may be deemed necessary for the purposes of the erection of college buildings, the preparation of grounds and the acquisition of movable or immovable property and the engagement of staff.

 - (e) On the inability to act, resignation or absence from the Settlement of Singapore for more than three months of any member of a Committee appointed by the Governor hereunder such member shall ipso facto cease to be a member of such Committee.
 - (f) A Notification appearing in the Government Gazette of the appointment of any person as Principal of Raffles College or as Treasurer of the Straits Settlements or as Director of Education of the Straits Settlements and the Federated Malay States or as a member of either Committee or of the fact that any such member has ceased to be a member shall be conclusive evidence of such fact.
 - (g) No act or proceeding of either Committee shall be invalidated by reason of any irregularity in the

convening of the meeting at which such act or proceeding was determined upon or held or by reason of the absence of any member from the Settlement or by reason of any vacancy in such Committee.

(h) The minutes of every meeting of a Committee shall be conclusive evidence of all resolutions adopted and acts done at such meeting provided that such minutes shall have been signed by the Chairman as having been confirmed at a subsequent meeting of the same Committee.

To invest the Resident Councillor, Penang (and in his absence, the District Officer, Dindings), the Senior Health Officer, Penang, and the Executive Engineer, Penang, respectively with the duties, powers, discretions and authorities which are by the Ordinance imposed on, conferred upon and exercisable by the President of the Municipal Commissioners, the Municipal Health Officer and the Municipal Engineer, respectively.
- 5. To direct that the expressions "Municipality," "Municipal Office," "Municipal Engineer," and "Municipal Health Officer" in the Ordinance shall with reference to this Order be construed as though the expression "Territory of the Dindings," "District Office, Dindings," "Executive Engineer, Penang," and "Senior Health Officer, Penang," were respectively substituted therefor, and that the provisions of the Ordinance shall be so construed as to give effect to this Order.

- 6. To direct that all By-laws now in force in the Territory shall continue in force within the areas for which they were made in the same manner as if they had been made by the said Rural Board under this Notification unless and until the same shall be cancelled by new By-laws made by the said Rural Board and confirmed by the Governor in Gouncil.

To the occupiers of premises within Conservancy District No. 8 bounded by:-

South Bridge Road, Spring Street, Banda Street, Sago Lane, Sago Street, New Bridge Road, and Boat Quay.

Notice is hereby given that in exercise of the powers vested in the Municipal Commissioners by section 222 of Ordinance No. 135 (Municipal), and with the approval of the Governor in Council, a compulsory system of night-soil removal, by which the soiled pail and its contents will be removed from each latrine, will be applied to that area on and after the first day of May, 1922.*

And that in exercise of the powers vested in them by section 223 (2) & (3) of Ordinance No. 135 (Municipal), and with the approval of the Governor in Council, the following fees will be charged for removal of night-soil and the cleansing of latrine:—

For removal every day, if recommended by the Health Officer, \$4 per latrine per mensem payable quarterly in advance.

For removal every alternate day \$2 per latrine per mensem, payable quarterly in advance.

And that in exercise of the powers vested in them by section 223 (1) of Ordinance No. 135 (Municipal), and with the approval of the Governor in Council, the following regulations have been approved for the purpose of removal of night-soil:—

- I. Every latrine shall be provided with its own pail, which shall be of Standard Municipal pattern.
 - (a) The walls, up to the seat and base of the compartment holding the pail, shall be plastered with cement or other impervious material.
 - (b) The base of every latrine shall be not less than 3 inches above the adjoining floor level, and shall be laid so as to fall towards and into a proper drain, which must be constructed if not already provided. Granite slabs shall be laid to support the pail.
 - (c) No latrine shall be of what is known as the "drop" class, that is, communicating directly by means of a shaft or tube with a latrine below.
 - (d) The doors and walls of all latrines shall be so constructed as to permit of ample circulation of air.
 - (e) The pail must be so placed that its top shall be not more than one inch below the underside of the urine guard. The hole in the seat shall be not more than 9 inches wide or 1 foot 2 inches long and the base shall be arranged so as to guide the pail into its proper place.
 - (f) Every latrine shall be provided with proper iron pail doors of sufficient size, hanging from the top or side, with a clear space of one inch at the bottom.
 - (g) Every latrine shall be constructed in accordance with the Municipal design.
- 2. The coolies and overseers of the Commissioners shall be allowed free access daily, between the hours of 6 A. M. and 10 A. M., to every latrine within the area aforesaid, for the purpose of removing night-soil.
- 3. The Commissioners will at their expense provide pails to facilitate removal, also pails in place of those worn out, or broken, otherwise than through neglect or misuse by the occupier of the house or his servants.
- 4. The occupier of every house within the aforesaid area shall take steps to ensure the safe custody, preservation, and proper use of all latrine pails used in his house or compound, and in the event of loss he will be charged the cost of replacement.
