WHEREAS by subsection (1) of Section 4 of the Air Navigation Act, 1920, it is provided that His Majesty may, by Order in Council, extend, with any necessary modifications and exceptions, any of the provisions of the said Act to any British possessions other than those mentioned in the Schedule to the said Act and (save as therein provided) to any territory under His Majesty's protection:

AND WHEREAS it is expedient to extend certain provisions of the said Act to certain British Colonies and Protectorates:

NOW, THEREFORE, His Majesty, by virtue of and in exercise of the powers on this behalf by the Air Navigation Act, 1920, or otherwise in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as "The Air Navigation (Colonies and Protectorates) Order in Council, 1922."
2. In this Order and its schedules:
"Colony" means one of the British possessions or protectorates mentioned in the second schedule hereto;
"Governor" means the officer for the time being administering the Government of the Colony;
"The Act" means the Air Navigation Act, 1920.
3. The provisions of Sections 7, 8 (1), 9, 10, 11, 12 and 18 of the Act with the necessary modifications as set forth in the first schedule hereto shall be and hereby are extended to the Colonies mentioned in the second schedule hereto.
4. This Order shall come into operation on the 1st day of April, 1922.

FIRST SCHEDULE.

1. Section 7—(1) In time of war, whether actual or imminent, or of great national emergency the Governor may, by order, regulate or prohibit, either absolutely or subject to such conditions as may be contained in the order, the navigation of all or any descriptions of aircraft over the Colony or any portion thereof, or the territorial waters adjacent thereto; and, without prejudice to the generality of this provision

any such order may provide for taking possession of and using for the purposes of His Majesty's naval, military or air forces any aerodrome or landing ground, or any aircraft, machinery, plant, material or things found therein or thereon, and for regulating or prohibiting the use, erection, building, maintenance or establishment of any aerodrome, flying school, or landing ground, or any class or description thereof.

(2) The order may provide for the imposition of penalties to secure compliance with the order, not exceeding imprisonment for a term of six months and a fine of two hundred pounds and may authorise such steps to be taken in order to secure such compliance as appear to the Governor to be necessary.

(3) Any person who suffers direct injury or loss, owing to the operation of an order of the Governor under this section, shall be entitled to receive compensation from the Governor from such public funds as he may lawfully apply for the purpose, the amount thereof to be fixed, in default of agreement, by an arbitrator to be agreed upon or failing agreement to be appointed by the Chief Justice or other Chief Judicial Officer of the Colony.

Provided that no compensation shall be payable by reason of the operation of a general order under this section prohibiting flying in the Colony or any part thereof.

(4) An order under this section may be revoked or varied by a subsequent order made by the Governor.

2. Section 8—(1) The Governor shall have power to establish and maintain aerodromes (including power to provide and maintain roads and approaches, buildings and other accommodation and apparatus and equipment for such aerodromes) and to acquire land for that purpose by agreement or in accordance with the provisions of the law in force in the Colony relating to the acquisition of land for public purposes.

3. Section 9—(1) No action shall lie in respect of trespass or in respect of nuisance, by reason only of the flight of aircraft over any property at a height above the ground, which, having regard to wind, weather, and all the circumstances of the case is reasonable, or the ordinary incidents of such flight, so long as the provisions of this Order and any other Order made under the Act and extended to the Colony are duly complied with; but where material damage or loss is caused by an aircraft in flight, taking off, or landing, or by any person in any such aircraft, or by any article falling from any such aircraft, to any person or property on land or water, damages shall be recoverable from the owner of the aircraft in respect of such damage or loss, without proof of negligence or intention or other cause of action, as though the same had been caused by his wilful act, neglect or default, except where the damage or loss was caused by or contributed to by the negligence of the person by whom the same was suffered.

Provided that, where any damages recovered from or paid by the owner of an aircraft under this section arose from damage or loss caused solely by the wrongful or negligent action or omission of any person other than the owner or some person in his employment, the owner shall be entitled to recover from that person the amount of such damages, and in any such proceedings against the owner the owner may, on making such application to the court and on giving such undertaking in costs as may be prescribed by rules of court, join any such person as aforesaid as a defendant, but where such person is not so joined he shall not in any subsequent proceedings taken against him by the owner be precluded from disputing the reasonableness of any damages recovered from or paid by the owner.

(2) Where any aircraft has been *bonâ fide* demised, let, or hired out for a period exceeding fourteen days to any other person by the owner thereof, and no pilot, commander, navigator, or operative member of the crew of the aircraft is in the employment of the owner, this section shall have effect as though for references to the owner there were substituted references to the person to whom the aircraft has been so demised, let, or hired out.

4. Section 10—(1) Where an aircraft is flown in such a manner as to be the cause of unnecessary danger to any person or property on land or water, the pilot or the person in charge of the aircraft, and also the owner thereof, unless he proves to the satisfaction of the court that the aircraft was so flown without his actual fault or privity, shall be liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding two hundred pounds, or to imprisonment with or without hard labour for a term not exceeding six months, or to both such imprisonment and fine.

For the purposes of this section, the expression "owner" in relation to an aircraft includes any person by whom the aircraft is hired at the time of the offence.

(2) The provisions of this section shall be in addition to and not in derogation of any general safety or other regulations prescribed by Order in Council made under Part I of the Act, and extended to the Colony.

5. Section 11—The law of the Colony relating to wreck and to salvage of life or property, and to the duty of rendering assistance to vessels in distress shall apply to aircraft on or over the sea or tidal waters as it applies to vessels, and the owner of an aircraft shall be entitled to a reasonable reward for salvage services rendered by the aircraft to any property or persons in any case where the owner of a ship would be so entitled.

Provided that provision may be made by Order by the Governor with the approval of a Secretary of State for making modifications of and exemptions from the provisions of such law as aforesaid in their application to aircraft to such extent and in such manner as appears necessary or expedient.

6. Section 12—(1) The Governor may make regulations providing for the investigation in the Colony of any accident arising out of or in the course of air navigation and occurring in or over the Colony or the territorial waters adjacent thereto, or to British aircraft occurring elsewhere and likely in the absence of such provision to remain uninvestigated.

(2) Without prejudice to the generality of the foregoing provision, regulations under this section may contain provisions:—

(a) requiring notice to be given of any such accident as aforesaid in such manner and by such persons as may be specified in the Order;

(b) applying, with or without modification for the purpose of investigations held with respect to any such accidents any of the provisions of any law in force in the Colony relating to the investigation of deaths or accidents;

- (c) prohibiting, pending investigation, access to or interference with aircraft to which an accident has occurred, and authorising any person, so far as may be necessary for the purposes of an investigation, to have access to, examine, remove, take measures for the preservation of, or otherwise deal with any such aircraft;
- (d) authorising the Governor, in regard to cases where it appears to the authority conducting an investigation that a licence or certificate granted under the Act or any Order made thereunder ought to be cancelled, suspended, endorsed or surrendered, to transmit any recommendation to that effect made by the said authority for such action thereon as the Secretary of State for Air may consider just, and also authorising the Governor pending the decision of the Secretary of State in any such cases provisionally to suspend the licence or certificate and providing for the production of any such licence or certificate for the purpose of being so dealt with.

Provided that nothing in the section shall limit the powers of any authority under sections five hundred and thirty to five hundred and thirty-seven inclusive of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, or any enactment (including the Act) amending those sections.

(3) If any person contravenes or fails to comply with any regulations under this section, he shall be liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding fifty pounds or to imprisonment with or without hard labour for a term not exceeding three months.

7. Section 18—(1) This Order shall not apply to aircraft belonging to or exclusively employed in the service of His Majesty.

Provided that His Majesty may, by Order in Council, apply to any such aircraft, with or without modification, any of the provisions of this Order or of any Orders or regulations made under the Act and extended to the Colony.

(2) Nothing in this Order or in any regulations thereunder shall prejudice or affect the rights, powers, or privileges of any general or local lighthouse authority.

NOW, THEREFORE, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers by the above recited Act in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows :—

Part II of the Administration of Justice Act, 1920, shall extend to the parts of His Majesty's Dominions outside the United Kingdom hereunder mentioned :—

The Colony of Nigeria.
The Straits Settlements.

It is hereby enacted by the Governor of the Straits Settlements with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof as follows :—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as Ordinance No. 15 (Inventions) Amendment Ordinance, 1922, and shall be read and construed as one with Ordinance No. 15 (Inventions), hereinafter called the principal Ordinance. Short title and construction.

2. Section 12 of the principal Ordinance is amended— Amendment of section 12.

(a) by substituting the word "sixteen" for the word "fourteen" occurring in the ninth and twelfth lines;

(b) by substituting the word "ten" for the word "fourteen" occurring in the eleventh line; and

(c) by substituting the figure "16" for the figure "14" in the marginal note.

3. Any exclusive privilege granted under the principal Ordinance, the original term of which had not expired at the commencement of this Ordinance, shall have effect as if the term mentioned therein was sixteen years instead of fourteen years. Extension of term.

OBJECTS AND REASONS.

This Bill, following a recent alteration in the English Law, increases the term of future and unexpired grants of exclusive privilege (patents) from 14 to 16 years and reduces the term of extension from 14 to 10 years.

Police Orders framed under Section 6 (4) of Ordinance No. 96 (Minor Offences) for the Regulation of Traffic on the occasion of the arrival of His Royal Highness the Prince of Wales at Penang on the 23rd May, 1922.

1. After 9-45 A.M. all pedestrian traffic shall keep in rear of the Police on duty on the line of route till after the passage of the procession of His Royal Highness the Prince of Wales and his Staff to Government House and Residency.

2. After 9-45 A.M. all traffic, vehicular and otherwise, except the cars of His Royal Highness and cars provided with special passes, will be stopped along the line of route and all other vehicles will be diverted into the nearest street. All cross traffic, or debouching traffic on to the route will be stopped at the same hour 50 yards short of the line of route and will not be resumed till permitted by the Police Officer on duty.

4. The car of His Royal Highness will park at the corner of Weld Quay and Downing Street by the Town Club, those of His Royal Highness' Staff shall park behind. 1. The President, Health Officer, Food Inspector, any ^{Inspection.} Sanitary Inspector or any other person duly authorised in that behalf by the President shall at all reasonable times have free access for the purpose of inspection to every part of the premises.
2. Every licensee shall keep fixed in a conspicuous ^{Signboard.} place at the entrance to the premises a signboard to be supplied by the Commissioners bearing words signifying the trade for which the premises are licensed.
3. Every person desiring to obtain a licence for ^{Application.} places in which human food and drink are sold or prepared or stored for sale shall give notice in writing to the Health Officer and shall lodge a plan of the premises if so required by him. The Health Officer after inspection of the premises may at his discretion issue a licence for such premises.
4. All licences shall ordinarily expire on the 31st ^{Expiry.} December in every year unless previously revoked, but the Health Officer may grant licences for shorter periods which shall be stated on the licence.
5. Every licence shall state the name of the licensee, ^{Name, etc., on licence.} the situation of the premises and the purpose for which the licence is granted, and the date of issue and expiry.
6. The Health Officer may direct that any licence ^{Photograph.} issued under these By-laws shall bear photograph of the licensee and that a duplicate be supplied for inserting in the Register of Licences kept at the Municipal Health Office.
7. No licence shall be transferred without the sanc- ^{Transfer of licence.} tion of the Health Officer.
8. The walls of licensed premises shall be well finished ^{Walls.} with a smooth surface capable of being easily and quickly cleaned without projections or recesses or angles that are likely to collect dust.
9. The floors shall be made of strong, impervious ^{Floors.} material smoothly finished and graded so that all fluids may readily gain access to the drains.
10. The drains shall be constructed of brick lined ^{Drains.} with good cement with a semi-circular bottom or of glazed earthenware half-pipes and shall be of a diameter of not less than six inches and shall be sufficient in number and gradient so as to carry off all water and other fluids. Such drains except where they cross the five-foot way shall be covered only with a movable plank and shall not be covered by fixtures or heavy furniture. No drains or pipes for carrying off storm water or bath water or faecal or sewage matter shall be laid through the premises.
11. No living room, sleeping place, partitions, cubicles ^{No living room.} or mezzanine floors shall be allowed on the licensed premises unless specially sanctioned by the Health Officer and shown on the plan of the premises.

- Water closets, etc. 12. Water closets, latrines, urinals and bathrooms shall be in a convenient situation and maintained in a clean and wholesome condition.
- Municipal water. 13. There shall be on the premises a plentiful supply of Municipal water.
- Refuse receptacles. 14. The licensee shall cause all refuse to be collected and placed in covered receptacles provided for that purpose, and shall cause such receptacles to be emptied and cleaned as frequently as may be necessary to keep the premises at all times clean and wholesome, but in no case less than once in 24 hours.
- Cleaning. 15. At such time as the Health Officer may direct all portable articles shall be removed from the premises, the walls, floors, ceilings, roofs, shall be swept and all filth and rubbish removed and the whole premises thoroughly cleansed, painted or limewashed, and all necessary repairs shall be made to the premises.
- Protection of food. 16. All food shall be stored or kept in a clean manner and duly protected from flies and dust.
- One trade. 17. Only one trade or business (except as mentioned below) may be carried on in the licensed premises.
- Clean utensils. 18. All utensils used on the premises shall be kept in a clean condition and free from any noxious deposit.
- Self-contained. 19. In every building of more than one storey an access separate from any access to the licensed premises shall be provided from the street to such storey or storeys as are not used for the licensed premises.
- Floors. 20. The floors of the upper storeys shall be properly constructed with close floor boards tongued and grooved or otherwise jointed so as to be water-tight.
21. No articles of bedding or clothing shall be hung or stored or deposited in any licensed premises and no articles other than those in use shall be stored in the premises.

PART II.

Special By-laws relating to Bakeries and places for the manufacture and sale of bread, fancy bread and confectionery.

22. Bakeries shall include:—
- (i) Bread and biscuit bakeries, plain and fancy.
 - (ii) Places used for making any form of cake or other confectionery.
 - (iii) Places used for the preparation of bread or cakes made from any kind of flour whether baked, boiled or steamed.
23. The Bake-house shall consist of a ground floor only, situated at such level with relation to neighbouring land, drains or streams as not to be liable to be invaded by storm or flood water. The roofs and walls shall not be constructed of inflammable materials and the highest portion of the roof for a width of at least two feet six inches on either side of the ridge and extending along the whole length of such roof shall be raised not less than one foot above the lower portion, the sides of this raised portion being left open.
24. The side walls of any Bake-house shall not be nearer than three feet to the external walls of any adjoining premises and shall contain a window or windows, the area of which shall be not less than one-tenth of the area of the Bake-house floor. Such window or windows shall be kept open during the hours in which the operations of baking are being carried on and shall not be obstructed in any way. No window or other opening shall exist or be made in any external wall of a Bake-house which is nearer than three feet to, or faces any opening in, the external walls of any adjoining premises.
25. The fireplaces in connection with the ovens shall be so constructed as to allow the smoke to escape from the premises freely and in such a manner as not to occasion annoyance to persons in the neighbourhood.

26. Separate rooms shall be provided for mixing and kneading the dough, for baking, for storing the bread and for storing the ingredients.

27. The mixing of ingredients shall be done by hand or by machinery, and such ingredients when prepared for baking or cooking shall be kept on tables or benches in such a manner as not to be contaminated by dust or other filth and shall not be put on floors or passages.

28. The dough troughs and kneading tables shall be movable so as to admit of ready cleansing with water. If made of wood the surface shall be smooth and free from cracks.

29. The sale or show-room if under the same roof shall be distinct and separate from the Bake-house and shall have only one door of communication between it and the Bake-house.

30. The walls of the sale-room for a distance of six feet from the floor shall be faced with white glazed tiles, glazed bricks or other impervious material as may be approved by the Health Officer.

31. The tables and show-cases shall be covered with such smooth, impermeable material as may be approved by the Health Officer, e.g., white tiles, or glass or marble.

32. All tables and utensils shall be washed daily with soap and water and be kept scrupulously clean.

33. *Butchers' Shops and Fish Shops.*—

(a) The walls for a distance of six feet from the floor shall be faced with white glazed tiles, glazed bricks or such other impervious material as may be approved by the Health Officer.

(b) The tables, counters or benches used for the display of the articles for sale shall be covered with marble, glazed white tiles or glass and shall be washed with soda and water at least once daily.

(c) The hooks for hanging the flesh or fish displayed shall be set back at least $3\frac{1}{2}$ feet from the verandah-way and shall be of galvanised iron and shall be changed whenever the Health Officer directs.

(d) Beef, mutton goat, pork and fish may all be sold in the same shop or any one or more of them and also fruit and fresh vegetables.

(e) Fresh milk in sealed bottles may also be sold.

(f) Ice boxes if used must be of a pattern approved by the Health Officer.

34. *Fruit and Vegetable Shops.*—

(a) All tables and show cases shall be thoroughly washed with soap and water daily.

(b) Fruit and vegetables may be sold in the same premises.

35. *Eating Houses, Coffee shops, Tea rooms, Restaurants and places where food is prepared or supplied for consumption on the premises (excluding Public Houses, Spirit Shops and Lodging Houses).*—

(a) No woman shall be employed in any Refreshment room without the sanction of the Health Officer.

The name of every woman so employed shall be endorsed on the licence. Any change of female employees must be at once communicated to the Health Officer.

(b) Tables shall be provided for the refreshment rooms and shall be marble or glass topped or of wood covered with zinc on its upper surface or of such other material as may be approved by the Health Officer.

(c) No firewood or charcoal shall be used for the cooking or heating of food in the Refreshment Room proper, but gas and electric heaters may be used.

(d) A separate place shall be provided for the washing and cleansing of the dishes and cups used in the Refreshment Room.

- (e) Should a water tank or cistern be necessary it shall be fixed in a definite position approved by the Health Officer and shall have a proper cover.

36. *Aerated Water Factories.*—

- (a) The water tanks or cisterns shall be so located as to admit of their being readily cleaned.
- (b) The brushes used for scrubbing the interior of bottles shall themselves be cleaned and disinfected periodically, the washing and cleaning of the bottles shall be carried out in running water or by means of a jet of water at high pressure.

37. *Control and Supervision of the sale of Fresh Milk and for the securing of cleanliness of places where Milk is kept for sale and of all Milk vessels and utensils and for prescribing precautions to protect Milk against contamination and infection:*—

- (a) All dealers, importers, sellers or hawkers of milk in public places must have their names and addresses marked upon the vehicles and cans.
- (b) All milk exposed for sale must be declared as pure fresh buffalo or cow milk.
- (c) No dealer, importer, seller or hawker of milk shall cause or suffer any cow or buffalo belonging to him or under his care or control to be milked for the purpose of obtaining milk for sale—
- (i) unless, at the time of milking, the udder and teats of such cow or buffalo are thoroughly clean;
- (ii) unless the hands of the persons milking such are thoroughly clean and free from all infection and contamination; and
- (iii) unless the milk-receiving vessel is thoroughly clean and rinsed with clean boiling water.
- (d) Every dealer, importer, seller or hawker of milk shall take all reasonable and proper precautions in connection with the collection, storage and distribution of the milk, and otherwise to prevent the exposure of the milk to any infection or contamination.
- (e) No milk shall be retailed by the dipping of hands into the vessels or receptacles.
- (f) Every vessel, receptacle or utensil used for containing milk for sale shall be thoroughly cleansed with steam or clean boiling water after it shall have been used, and shall be maintained in a constant state of cleanliness.
- (g) No milk shall be conveyed for sale or distribution in open vessels, but the latter shall be provided with proper close-fitting covers under lock and key and a tap at the lower end and through which the milk shall be retailed to the customers. If the milk is distributed in cans or bottles, they shall also be provided with properly fixed covers.
- (h) No milk of any cow or buffalo suffering from any disease or illness shall be sold or used for human food.
- (i) A dairyman or milk seller shall not permit any person suffering from any dangerous or infectious disease to sell or assist in the sale or distribution of milk, and shall at once report to the Health Officer the occurrence of such disease.
- (j) No milk intended for sale shall be kept in any room or place where it would be liable to become infected or contaminated by impure air, or by any offensive, noxious or deleterious gas or substance, or by noxious or injurious emanation, exhalation or effluvium.
- (k) No milk intended for sale shall be kept in any room used as a kitchen or as a living room or in any room where any other trade is carried on, or in any room or building, or part of a building communicating directly by doors, window or otherwise with any room used as a sleeping room, or in which there may be any person

suffering from any infectious or contagious disease, or which may have been used by any person suffering from any such disease and may not have been properly disinfected.

Notice is hereby given that in exercise of the powers vested in the Municipal Commissioners by section 222 of Ordinance No. 135 (Municipal), and with the approval of the Governor in Council, a compulsory system of night-soil removal, by which the soiled pail and its contents will be removed from each latrine, will be applied to that area on and after the first day of May, 1922.*

And that in exercise of the powers vested in them by section 223 (2) & (3) of Ordinance No. 135 (Municipal), and with the approval of the Governor in Council, the following fees will be charged for removal of night-soil and the cleansing of latrine:—

For removal every day, if recommended by the Health Officer, \$4 per latrine per mensem payable quarterly in advance.

For removal every alternate day \$2 per latrine per mensem, payable quarterly in advance.

And that in exercise of the powers vested in them by section 223 (1) of Ordinance No. 135 (Municipal), and with the approval of the Governor in Council, the following regulations have been approved for the purpose of removal of night-soil:—

1. Every latrine shall be provided with its own pail, which shall be of Standard Municipal pattern.
 - (a) The walls, up to the seat and base of the compartment holding the pail, shall be plastered with cement or other impervious material.
 - (b) The base of every latrine shall be not less than 3 inches above the adjoining floor level, and shall be laid so as to fall towards and into a proper drain, which must be constructed if not already provided. Granite slabs shall be laid to support the pail.
 - (c) No latrine shall be of what is known as the "drop" class, that is, communicating directly by means of a shaft or tube with a latrine below.
 - (d) The doors and walls of all latrines shall be so constructed as to permit of ample circulation of air.
 - (e) The pail must be so placed that its top shall be not more than one inch below the underside of the urine guard. The hole in the seat shall be not more than 9 inches wide or 1 foot 2 inches long and the base shall be arranged so as to guide the pail into its proper place.
 - (f) Every latrine shall be provided with proper iron pail doors of sufficient size, hanging from the top or side, with a clear space of one inch at the bottom.
 - (g) Every latrine shall be constructed in accordance with the Municipal design.

2. The coolies and overseers of the Commissioners shall be allowed free access daily, between the hours of 6 A. M. and 10 A. M., to every latrine within the area aforesaid, for the purpose of removing night-soil.

3. The Commissioners will at their expense provide pails to facilitate removal, also pails in place of those worn out, or broken, otherwise than through neglect or misuse by the occupier of the house or his servants.

4. The occupier of every house within the aforesaid area shall take steps to ensure the safe custody, preservation, and proper use of all latrine pails used in his house or compound, and in the event of loss he will be charged the cost of replacement.

AN Ordinance to amend the Maintenance Orders (Facilities for Enforcement) Ordinance, 1921.

It is hereby enacted by the Governor of the Straits Settlements with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof as follows:—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Maintenance Orders (Facilities for Enforcement) Amendment Ordinance, 1922. Short title.

2. The following section numbered 11 is inserted after section 10 of the Maintenance Orders (Facilities for Enforcement) Ordinance, 1921. New section 11.

11. Where the Governor is satisfied that reciprocal provisions have been made by the Legislature of any British possession or any territory under His Majesty's protection for the enforcement within such possession or territory of maintenance orders made by Courts in the Straits Settlements the Governor may, by notification published in the *Gazette*, declare that this Ordinance shall extend to maintenance orders made by Courts within such possession or territory and thereupon this Ordinance shall apply to such maintenance orders as if they had been made in England or Ireland. Extension of the Ordinance.

OBJECTS AND REASONS.

This Bill amends the Maintenance Orders (Facilities for Enforcement) Ordinance, 1921 by giving the Governor power to extend its provisions to any British possession or protected territory if he is satisfied that reciprocal provisions have been made.

It is hereby enacted by the Governor of the Straits Settlements with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof as follows:—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Labour (Amendment) Ordinance, 1922.

2. After section 47 of the Labour Ordinance, 1920, hereinafter called the principal Ordinance, the following section shall be inserted:—

“ 47A.—(1) The Controller may at any time by order in writing require any employer on any estate, factory or place in which more than fifty female labourers are employed to construct within a reasonable time to be stated in such order, and thereafter to maintain at his own expense, a nursery properly equipped to the satisfaction of the Controller on or in the immediate neighbourhood of such estate, factory or place on a site to be approved by the Controller, with accommodation for such number of infants under the age of three as may be stated in such order, and may further require him to employ such number of nurses as may be stated in the order to have charge of such nursery.

(2) Such nursery shall be open for the accommodation of infants during all hours in which the mothers or guardians of such infants are at work.

(3) The employer shall at his own expense supply milk and rice to each infant accommodated in such nursery.

(4) The Controller may at any time by order in writing prescribe the quantity and description of milk and rice to be supplied to each infant under the preceding subsection”.

Section 144 of the principal Ordinance is amended by inserting at the end of the interpretation "Labourer" the words "and except in sections 160, 187 and 202 includes his dependants" and by inserting immediately after the interpretation "Labourer" a new interpretation as follows— "'Dependant' of a labourer includes such of the members of the labourer's family, namely wife, father, mother and children and adopted children under the age of fourteen, as are living with and dependant on him."

OBJECTS AND REASONS.

This Bill amends the Labour Ordinance as follows:—

(1) It empowers the Controller to require an employer to provide a crèche for the care of infants while their mothers are at work.

(2) It applies to the dependants of labourers the various provisions of Part X for safeguarding the health of labourers.

(3) It abolishes the punishment of imprisonment for offences by labourers.

All these amendments have already been effected in the Federated Malay States Labour Code.

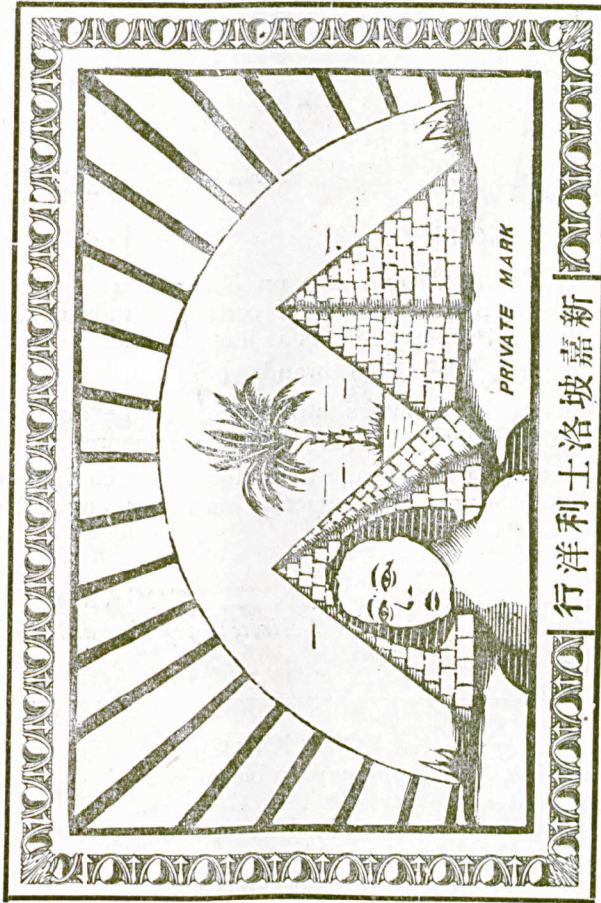
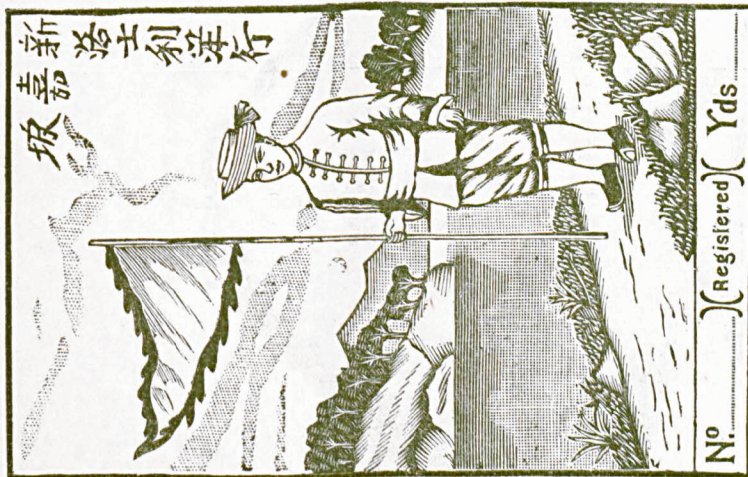
