**No. 897.—ORDINANCE NO. 96 (MINOR OFFENCES).**

Police Orders made under Section 6 (4) of Ordinance No. 96 (Minor Offences), for the regulation of traffic on the occasion of Race Meetings, on the 30th May, 1st and 3rd June, 1922, at the Race Course, Singapore.

1. All vehicles except 'rikishas will enter the Singapore Sporting Club grounds by Buffalo Road from Kampong Java Road Bridge, and, if after setting down their passengers they are required to wait in the grounds, will be parked as directed by the Police.

2. All vehicles, other than 'rikishas, not required to wait after setting down their passengers, will leave the grounds by Buffalo Road. They will not be allowed to cross the bridge into Kampong Java Road.

3. 'Rikishas will, instead of crossing the bridge at Kampong Java Road and Buffalo Road junction, proceed along Kampong Java Road to the bridge opposite the entrance to the Grand Stand. They will set down their passengers in Kampong Java Road and will not enter the grounds. If it is raining 'rikishas may be permitted to enter the grounds. Waiting 'rikishas will be parked at the side of Kampong Java Road and at the finish of races they may be allowed to enter the grounds by the bridge opposite the Grand Stand but only after most of the other vehicles have left. When so permitted they will wait on the grass plot opposite the entrance to the Grand Stand.

4. Vehicles will take up passengers at the entrance gate of the members' stand and leave the grounds by Buffalo Road bridge.

5. Passengers will wait at the entrance to the Grand Stand for their conveyances which will be called as required by the Police on duty at the Grand Stand entrance.

6. Vehicles whose passengers are not ready when they come out of the parking enclosures will pass down the road and re-enter the parking enclosures at a point shown by the Police.

7. None of these orders are to be held to apply to the car of His Excellency the Officer Administering the Government.

**No. 898.—ORDINANCE NO. 96 (MINOR OFFENCES).**

Police Notice regarding Traffic Regulations at the Esplanade on the occasion of the King's Birthday Parade on 3rd June, 1922.

1. All vehicles will approach the Esplanade by Stamford Road and Coleman Street and will then proceed along St. Andrew's Road round the Esplanade, as far as necessary. Vehicles may also approach the Esplanade by Anderson Bridge and Connaught Drive.

2. Waiting motor cars will be lined up in single rank on the South side of St. Andrew's Road (facing North-west) and on the North side of Connaught Drive (facing South-east) also in Empress Place as directed by the Police on duty.

3. Horse-drawn vehicles will be lined up in single rank on either side of the approaches to Anderson Bridge and Fullerton Road; but not on the Bridge itself.

4. Jinrikishas will remain drawn up round Raffles Place and in front of the Obelisk as directed by the Police and Jinrikisha Peons. No vehicles will be allowed to remain drawn up at the entrance to the Cricket Club Building or from a point 20 yards distant from the sea side entrance to a point immediately in front of the main entrance to the Europe Hotel in St. Andrew's Road, and no vehicles will be allowed to remain drawn up at the entrance to the S.R.C. Buildings or within 10 yards on either side of the entrance.

5. A space of 20 yards will be kept clear of all vehicles in St. Andrew's Road, at the junction of Coleman Street.

6. No vehicles will be allowed to leave the Esplanade by Stamford Road or Coleman Street from 6-45 A.M. until all the Troops have left the ground.

7. None of these orders are to be held to apply to the car of His Excellency the Officer Administering the Government.

And that in exercise of the powers vested in them by section 223 (2) & (3) of Ordinance No. 135 (Municipal), and with the approval of the Governor in Council, the following fees will be charged for removal of night-soil and the cleansing of latrine:—

For removal every day, if recommended by the Health Officer, \$4 per latrine per mensem payable quarterly in advance.

For removal every alternate day \$2 per latrine per mensem, payable quarterly in advance.

And that in exercise of the powers vested in them by section 223 (1) of Ordinance No. 135 (Municipal), and with the approval of the Governor in Council, the following regulations have been approved for the purpose of removal of night-soil:—

1. Every latrine shall be provided with its own pail, which shall be of Standard Municipal pattern.
  - (a) The walls, up to the seat and base of the compartment holding the pail, shall be plastered with cement or other impervious material.
  - (b) The base of every latrine shall be not less than 3 inches above the adjoining floor level, and shall be laid so as to fall towards and into a proper drain, which must be constructed if not already provided. Granite slabs shall be laid to support the pail.
  - (c) No latrine shall be of what is known as the "drop" class, that is, communicating directly by means of a shaft or tube with a latrine below.
  - (d) The doors and walls of all latrines shall be so constructed as to permit of ample circulation of air.
  - (e) The pail must be so placed that its top shall be not more than one inch below the underside of the urine guard. The hole in the seat shall be not more than 9 inches wide or 1 foot 2 inches long and the base shall be arranged so as to guide the pail into its proper place.
  - (f) Every latrine shall be provided with proper iron pail doors of sufficient size, hanging from the top or side, with a clear space of one inch at the bottom.
  - (g) Every latrine shall be constructed in accordance with the Municipal design.
2. The coolies and overseers of the Commissioners shall be allowed free access daily, between the hours of 6 A. M. and 10 A. M., to every latrine within the area aforesaid, for the purpose of removing night-soil.
3. The Commissioners will at their expense provide pails to facilitate removal, also pails in place of those worn out, or broken, otherwise than through neglect or misuse by the occupier of the house or his servants.
4. The occupier of every house within the aforesaid area shall take steps to ensure the safe custody, preservation, and proper use of all latrine pails used in his house or compound, and in the event of loss he will be charged the cost of replacement.

2. Section 12 of the principal Ordinance is amended— Amendment of section 12.

(a) by substituting the word "sixteen" for the word "fourteen" occurring in the ninth and twelfth lines;

(b) by substituting the word "ten" for the word "fourteen" occurring in the eleventh line; and

(c) by substituting the figure "16" for the figure "14" in the marginal note.

3. Any exclusive privilege granted under the principal Ordinance, the original term of which had not expired at the commencement of this Ordinance, shall have effect as if the term mentioned therein was sixteen years instead of fourteen years. Extension of term.

## OBJECTS AND REASONS.

This Bill, following a recent alteration in the English Law, increases the term of future and unexpired grants of exclusive privilege (patents) from 14 to 16 years and reduces the term of extension from 14 to 10 years.

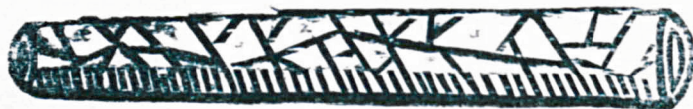
