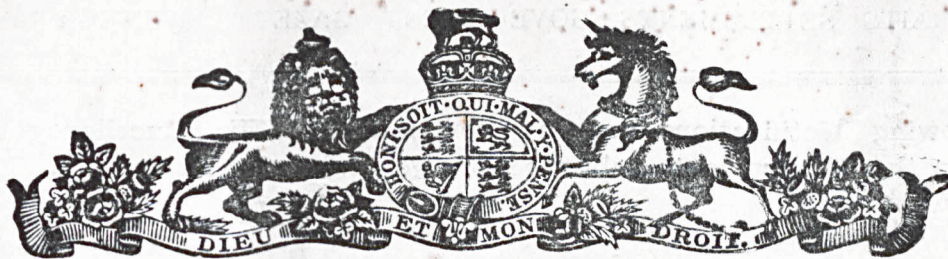

**No. 914.**—THE Right Hon'ble the Secretary of State for the Colonies has notified His Excellency the Officer Administering the Government that HIS MAJESTY THE KING will not be advised to exercise his power of disallowance with respect to the following Ordinances:—

No. 5 of 1922.—An Ordinance to prevent the unauthorised use of or wearing of certain orders, decorations, medals, emblems and uniforms and for purposes connected therewith. [No. 4193/22.]

No. 6 of 1922.—An Ordinance to amend Ordinance No. 113 (Native States Prisoners).

**No. 915.**—THE following Bill about to be introduced in the Legislative Council is published for general information:—

A BILL

*intituled*

AN Ordinance to amend Ordinance No. 64 (Defence Contribution).

It is hereby enacted by the Governor of the Straits Settlements with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof as follows:—

Short title.                   1. This Ordinance may be cited as Ordinance No. 64 (Defence Contribution) Amendment Ordinance, 1922.

Amendment of section 4.           2. Section 4 of Ordinance No. 64 (Defence Contribution), hereinafter called the principal Ordinance, is repealed and the following section is substituted therefor:—

Payment on account of defence contribution.           4.—(1) In the first instance the Colony shall pay into the Imperial Treasury Chest in the Colony on account of His Majesty's Government either a sum equal to twenty per centum of its estimated revenue or a sum equal to the estimated cost of the garrison for the year, whichever of these two sums is the less.

Adjustment of account.           (2) If the payment made under sub-section (1) is greater than the amount payable under this Ordinance, the excess shall be refunded to the Colony by His Majesty's Government, but if the payment made under sub-section (1) is less than the amount payable under this Ordinance, the deficiency shall be paid by the Colony into the Imperial Treasury Chest in the Colony on account of His Majesty's Government.

Amendment of section 6.           3. Section 6 of the principal Ordinance is amended by deleting the words "The said percentage" and substituting therefor the words "One-twelfth of the amount payable under section 4 (1)".

OBJECTS AND REASONS.

Under the existing law the Colony has in the first instance to pay as Defence Contribution 20 per cent of its estimated assessable revenue. It then has to pay 20 per cent of the difference between its estimated and actual revenue. It is, however, provided that the sums so paid by the Colony shall not exceed the actual cost of the garrison. Should there be such an excess payment, the Colony may have to wait a very considerable time before a refund of this excess is made. This Bill is introduced to reduce such delay to a minimum.

IN exercise of the powers vested in him by section 57 of Ordinance No. 90 (Railways) and with the approval of His Excellency the Governor in Council, the General Manager, Federated Malay States Railways, amends the Tariff of Charges as under to take effect from 1st June, 1922.

Rule 44 (b) is cancelled and the following substituted therefor:—

“44 (b). The charges for a berth in a sleeping saloon will be \$4 in addition to the ordinary first class fare. A charge of \$2 will be made for a sleeping-berth made up in a first class carriage and \$1 for the sleeping accommodation and bedding provided in a second class carriage.” [No. 3889/22.]

2. All vehicles, other than 'rikishas, not required to wait after setting down their passengers, will leave the grounds by Buffalo Road. They will not be allowed to cross the bridge into Kampong Java Road.

3. 'Rikishas will, instead of crossing the bridge at Kampong Java Road and Buffalo Road junction, proceed along Kampong Java Road to the bridge opposite the entrance to the Grand Stand. They will set down their passengers in Kampong Java Road and will not enter the grounds. If it is raining 'rikishas may be permitted to enter the grounds. Waiting 'rikishas will be parked at the side of Kampong Java Road and at the finish of races they may be allowed to enter the grounds by the bridge opposite the Grand Stand but only after most of the other vehicles have left. When so permitted they will wait on the grass plot opposite the entrance to the Grand Stand.

4. Vehicles will take up passengers at the entrance gate of the members' stand and leave the grounds by Buffalo Road bridge.

5. Passengers will wait at the entrance to the Grand Stand for their conveyances which will be called as required by the Police on duty at the Grand Stand entrance.

6. Vehicles whose passengers are not ready when they come out of the parking enclosures will pass down the road and re-enter the parking enclosures at a point shown by the Police.

7. None of these orders are to be held to apply to the car of His Excellency the Officer Administering the Government.

2. Waiting motor cars will be lined up in single rank on the South side of St. Andrew's Road (facing North-west) and on the North side of Connaught Drive (facing South-east) also in Empress Place as directed by the Police on duty.

3. Horse-drawn vehicles will be lined up in single rank on either side of the approaches to Anderson Bridge and Fullerton Road; but not on the Bridge itself.

4. Jinrikishas will remain drawn up round Raffles Place and in front of the Obelisk as directed by the Police and Jinrikisha Peons. No vehicles will be allowed to remain drawn up at the entrance to the Cricket Club Building or from a point 20 yards distant from the sea side entrance to a point immediately in front of the main entrance to the Europe Hotel in St. Andrew's Road, and no vehicles will be allowed to remain drawn up at the entrance to the S.R.C. Buildings or within 10 yards on either side of the entrance.

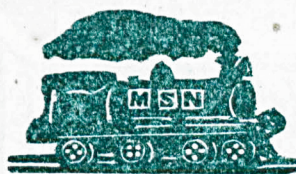

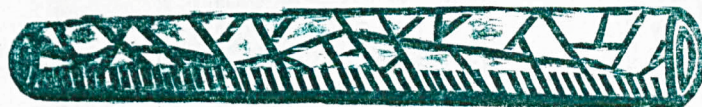
