No. 986.—His Excellency the Officer Administering the Government of the Straits Settlements and High Commissioner for the Malay States having left Singapore on the 15th June, 1922, for Kuala Lumpur, the following instrument, passed under the Public Seal of the Colony, constituting and appointing the Honourable Mr. Frank Morrish Baddeley to be from and including the 15th June, 1922, his Deputy during his absence from the Settlement, is published for general information:—

FREDERICK SETON JAMES, COMPANION OF THE MOST DISTINGUISHED ORDER OF SAINT MICHAEL AND SAINT GEORGE, OFFICER ADMINISTERING THE GOVERNMENT OF THE STRAITS SETTLEMENTS AND THEIR DEPENDENCIES, TO THE HONOURABLE FRANK MORRISH BADDELEY.

GREETING:-

WHEREAS I am about to proceed to Kuala Lumpur on the 15th June, 1922:

Now know you that I do by these presents, under and by virtue of the powers and authorities in that behalf given to me by certain Letters Patent under the Great Seal of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, bearing date the 17th February, 1911, constitute and appoint you, the said Frank Morrish Baddeley, to be my Deputy within the Straits Settlements during my absence from Singapore and in that capacity to exercise, perform and execute for me and on my behalf, during such absence, all such of the powers and authorities by the said Letters Patent or otherwise vested in me, as I have powers to delegate and assign to a Deputy including the right to preside at all Meetings of the Executive and Legislative Councils, but excepting the powers under the Extradition Act, 1870.

• PROVIDED always that these presents shall not affect the exercise by myself of any of the powers or authorities now vested in me and that you shall in the discharge of the office of Officer Administering the Government's Deputy conform to and observe all such instructions as I have already or shall hereafter address to you for your guidance.

This Instrument does not confer upon you precedence over any other officer.

GIVEN at Singapore, this 15th day of June, 1922, under the hand of His Excellency the Officer Administering the Government and the Public Seal of the Colony.
