### PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by section 4 of Ordinance No. 136 (Arms and Explosives), it is enacted that the Governor in Council may prohibit by Proclamation for a period in such Proclamation to be mentioned the exportation from the Colony either absolutely or to any country, territory or place without the Colony in such Proclamation to be specified of arms, guns, explosives or any specified class of explosives or naval or military stores:

NOW IT IS HEREBY PROCLAIMED by the Governor in Council in virtue and exercise of the powers aforesaid as follows:—

For a period of three years from 1st day of July, 1922, no person, company, corporation or partnership shall, either on his or its own behalf or on behalf of any other person, company, corporation or partnership of whatever nationality, export to China or any Concession, Settlement, or Leased Territory in China any arms, guns or explosives of any description, exclusive of sporting weapons and ammunition therefor.

*Note:—*For the purposes of the above Proclamation—

“Arms” includes a firearm, air-guns, air-pistols, automatic guns, automatic pistols and guns, or any other kind of gun from which any shot, bullet or other missile can be discharged or noxious fumes can be emitted, and bayonets, swords, daggers, spears and spear-heads.

“Gun” includes howitzers, mortars, quick-firing and machine-guns and other guns of a similar nature.

“Explosive”

(i) means gunpowder, nitro-glycerine, dynamite, gun-cotton, blasting powders, fulminate of mercury or of other metals, coloured fires and every other substance whether similar to those above mentioned or not used or manufactured with a view to produce a practical effect by explosion or a pyrotechnic effect; and

(ii) includes fog-signals, fireworks, fuzes, rockets, percussion caps, detonators, cartridges, ammunition of all descriptions, and every adaptation or preparation of an explosive as above defined; and

(iii) includes any substance declared to be deemed an explosive by a Notification under section 6 (a) of this Ordinance.

**No. 1027.**—THE following Bill about to be introduced in the Legislative Council is published for general information:—

A BILL

*intituled*

AN Ordinance to continue the operation of the Rent Restriction Ordinance, 1921, for a further period of six months.

It is hereby enacted by the Governor of the Straits Settlements with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof as follows:—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Rent Restriction Continuation Ordinance, 1922, and shall have effect from the 1st day of July, 1922.

**No. 1028.—THE INCOME TAX ORDINANCE, 1922.**

THE Rules made by the Governor in Council under section 63 of the Income Tax Ordinance, 1922, and published as Notification No. 476 in the *Gazette* of the 24th March, 1922, are amended by the addition of the following new Rule:—

13A. Where, owing to the fact that the total income of any company, association or person reaches or exceeds a certain limit, it or he is liable to pay income tax at a higher rate, the amount of income tax payable by it or him shall, where necessary, be reduced so as not to exceed the sum of the following amounts, that is to say:—

the amount which would have been payable on its or his income if its or his total income had just failed to reach that limit; and

the amount by which its or his total income exceeds that limit.
