No. 1824.—APPOINTMENTS UNDER “THE DECREPIT VAGRANTS ENACTMENT, 1902.”—In exercise of the powers conferred on him by section 3 of “The Decrepit Vagrants Enactment, 1902,” the Resident of Perak hereby appoints the Superintendent of the Convict Establishment, Taiping, to be Superintendent and Dr. C. B. Pasley to be Medical Officer of the Vagrant Ward, Taiping, with effect from the 1st May, 1914.

No. 1825.—“THE DECREPIT VAGRANTS ENACTMENT, 1902.”—In exercise of the powers conferred on him by section 2 of “The Decrepit Vagrants Enactment, 1902,” the Resident of Perak, with the approval of the Chief Secretary to Government, hereby declares the building situated on Tupai Road, Taiping, known as the New Vagrant Ward, Taiping, to be a Vagrant Ward for the purposes of the said Enactment.

No. 1826.—EXAMINATION IN LAW.—It is hereby notified, for the information of the officers concerned, that an examination in Law will be held in Kuala Lumpur and Ipoh on the 29th and 30th June and 1st July, 1914.

Officers, whether on the Federal or State Establishments, who desire to present themselves for examination, should send in their names through the Heads of their Departments to the Secretary to Resident (in Pahang, to the Resident) not later than the 17th June, 1914.

No. 1827.—TAMIL EXAMINATION.—It is hereby notified, for the information of those concerned, that an examination in Tamil will be held in Kuala Lumpur on the 6th, 7th and 8th July, 1914.

Officers, whether on the Federal or State Establishments, desirous of presenting themselves for examination, should send in their names through the Heads of their Departments to the Secretary to Resident (in Pahang, to the Resident) not later than the 26th June, 1914.

“THE DECREPIT VAGRANTS ENACTMENT, 1902.”

RULES made by the Resident of Perak, with the approval of the Chief Secretary to Government, for the management of the Vagrant Ward, Taiping, and the control and discipline of the inmates thereof, under section 4 of “The Decrepit Vagrants Enactment, 1902.”

The rules made under the said Enactment and published in the *Perak Government Gazette* of the 20th December, 1902, and 29th July, 1904, respectively, Notification Nos. 1309 and 924, are hereby rescinded and the following rules are substituted therefor :

1. The Superintendent of the Ward shall be responsible for the proper management thereof and shall take care that the inmates are humanely treated, that discipline is strictly enforced and that economy is duly promoted.

2. Warders and other subordinate officers shall be appointed and may be promoted by the Superintendent, with the approval of the Resident, and may be reduced or dismissed with the like approval.

3. The Superintendent shall have control of all Warders and other subordinate officers employed on the Establishment of the Vagrant Ward, and shall in case of misconduct or neglect of duty have power to suspend from duty any Warder or other subordinate officer, reporting the suspension to the Resident without delay. Any Warder or other subordinate officer may also be punished by the Superintendent for any of the following offences, with a fine not exceeding \$10 for each offence :

- (a) Disobedience of orders ;
- (b) Untidiness in person or dress ;
- (c) Neglect of duty ;
- (d) Absence from duty without good cause ;
- (e) Using unnecessary violence to any inmate, except in self defence or in defence of any other officer or inmate.

4. The Superintendent shall visit the Ward every day and shall occasionally visit it at night at uncertain intervals.

5. He shall keep a Journal in which he shall record the hours at which he visits the Ward and any occurrences which he may think proper to be so recorded.

6. He shall take care that all inmates desiring to make complaints or applications are allowed to make them and that the instructions of the Medical Officer are carried into effect.

7. He shall keep and be responsible for the safe custody of the following records and accounts :

- (1) A Journal ;
- (2) A nominal record of inmates, with the sentence, date of commitment, and the date at which such sentence will expire, and the name, age, height, weight, particular marks, general appearance, rewards, fines and punishments ;
- (3) Visitors' Book ;
- (4) An account of the estimated value of the work of each inmate ;
- (5) An inventory of all furniture and movable property belonging to the Ward ;
- (6) A Cash Book ;
- (7) An Expenditure Journal ;
- (8) Daily return of employment of inmates.

8. He shall furnish to the Resident each year by the 15th of February a general report upon the administration of the Ward during the preceding year.

9. He shall give to the nearest Magistrate immediate notice of the death of any inmate in the Ward and shall also report the death to the Resident.

10. He may admit persons, whether friends of vagrants or others, to visit the Ward at convenient hours according to his discretion or upon a written order from the Secretary to Resident.

11. Warders and other subordinate officers shall be responsible for the safe custody of inmates under their charge, and in this view they shall count the inmates under their charge at least once every half-hour, and always :

- (1) On receiving charge of a party ;
- (2) On giving over charge ;
- (3) On leaving any building or work.

They shall not sit down or lounge during their term of duty, but shall always be alert and watchful, keeping their faces towards the inmates under their charge.

12. They shall keep records of the work given out and the work performed by the inmates under their charge.

13. They shall not be absent from the Vagrant Ward during hours of duty without leave from the Warder on duty, and before leaving the Ward at any time they shall leave their keys, arms and books in the Warders' office.

14. They shall not receive visitors in the Vagrant Ward without permission of the Warder on duty and no such visitor shall be admitted beyond the quarters occupied by the subordinate officers.

15. No Warder or other subordinate officer is to punish an inmate except when ordered to do so by the Superintendent.

16. If a Warder or subordinate officer shall strike any inmate except in self defence or in defence of any officer or inmate, such conduct shall be at once brought to the notice of the Resident.

17. No Warder or other subordinate officer shall on any account enter at night any room or cell in which an inmate is undergoing solitary confinement, without being accompanied by another officer except in cases of imperative necessity.

18. No Warder or other subordinate officer shall on any pretence whatever fail to make an immediate report to his superior officer of any misconduct or wilful disobedience of these rules.

19. No Warder or other subordinate officer shall unnecessarily converse with an inmate, or by word, gesture or demeanour do anything which may tend to irritate an inmate. He shall not allow any familiarity on the part of inmates towards himself or any other officer.

20. No Warder or other subordinate officer shall correspond with or hold any intercourse with the friends or relatives of any inmate, unless expressly authorized by the Superintendent.

21. All Warders and other subordinate officers shall live in such quarters as the Government may assign to them. They shall not sleep out of such quarters without the permission of the Superintendent.

22. No Warder or other subordinate officer shall permit any person, not being a regular member of his family, to remain for the night in his quarters without the permission of the Superintendent.

23. Any Warder or other subordinate officer disabled from the regular performance of his duties by illness shall report the same to his superior officer and remain in his quarters until seen by the Medical Officer, who may, if necessary, order his removal to the General Hospital.

24. On the admission of a vagrant, his clothes shall be burnt and on his discharge he shall be provided with a new suit.

25. The hours of labour for inmates, within or without the walls of the Vagrant Ward, shall be from 6.30 a.m. to 10.30 a.m., and from 2 p.m. to 5 p.m. or such other hours as the Resident may direct.

Inmates shall be locked up for the night by 7 p.m. and shall have risen and be dressed and have their bedding rolled up by 6 a.m.

No inmate shall be required to do any labour, except such as may be necessary for keeping the Ward clean, on any day which has been duly appointed a public holiday by notification in the *Government Gazette*, or any day specially appointed for public thanksgiving.

26. The inmates shall be employed on useful light labour at the discretion of the Superintendent provided that it is such as in the opinion of the Medical Officer they are able to perform.

27. A vagrant shall be credited daily with marks, not exceeding 4, for his labour and on his discharge shall be paid 5 cents for each mark earned by him.

## OFFENCES.

28. The following acts are forbidden, and every inmate who wilfully commits any of the following acts shall be deemed to have wilfully disobeyed the rules of the Ward and to have committed an offence punishable under these rules :

- (1) Quarrelling with any other inmate ;
- (2) Showing disrespect to any officer or official visitor ;
- (3) Making groundless complaints ;
- (4) Abetting the commission of any offence enumerated in this rule ;
- (5) Wilfully destroying food or throwing it away without orders ;
- (6) Eating or appropriating any food not assigned to him or taking from or adding to the portions assigned to other inmates ;
- (7) Omitting or refusing to wear the clothing given to him, or exchanging any portion of it for the clothing of other inmates, or losing, discarding, damaging or altering any part of it ;
- (8) Omitting or refusing to keep the person clean ;
- (9) Omitting or refusing to keep clothing, blankets, bedding, fetters, cups or platters clean, or disobeying any order as to the arrangement or disposition of such articles ;
- (10) Tampering with locks, lamps or lights or other property with which he has no concern ;
- (11) Stealing the clothing or any part of the kit of any other inmate ;
- (12) Committing a nuisance in any part of the Ward ;
- (13) Spitting on or otherwise soiling any floor, door, wall or other part of the Ward building or any article in the Ward ;
- (14) Wilfully befouling the wells, latrines, washing or bathing places ;
- (15) Damaging the trees or any form of cultivation carried on within the enclosure of the Ward ;
- (16) Omitting or refusing to take due care of, or injuring, destroying or misappropriating any prison property entrusted to him ;
- (17) Wilfully causing to himself any illness, injury or disability ;
- (18) Causing or omitting to assist in suppressing violence or insubordination of any kind ;
- (19) Taking part in any attack upon any inmate or officer of the Ward ;
- (20) Omitting or refusing to help any officer of the Ward in case of an attempted escape or of an attack upon such officer or upon another inmate ;
- (21) Disobeying any lawful order of an officer of the Ward ;
- (22) Idling or showing negligence in the performance of his allotted task.

29. For any of the offences enumerated in rule 28 the Superintendent may order an inmate to be punished by any one or more of the following punishments :

- (1) Close confinement in a punishment cell on a diet of rice and water or bread and water for a period not exceeding in all seven days, provided that if the period of confinement exceeds three days the inmate shall receive the ordinary diet on the fourth day.
- (2) Forfeiture of marks earned under rule 27, provided that loss of marks shall not exceed the total earned by any inmate at the time of his punishment.

30. When an inmate is persistently refractory or dirty in his habits or persistently refuses to work, the Superintendent may in addition to or in lieu of the foregoing punishments keep such inmate locked up in a separate cell during non-working hours and confine him to the yard of the Ward during working hours, but without any reduction in diet beyond that which he is empowered to inflict under rule 29.

31 The diet of patients not placed on punishment diet or admitted to hospital shall be the same as the ordinary diet prescribed for prisoners under "The Prisons Enactment, 1907."

32. On receipt of a written application from the Protector of Chinese, the Chief Police Officer, or the Registrar of Criminals, the Superintendent shall cause a photograph and finger impressions of any inmate to be taken, and shall in like manner attach thereto a description of the inmate, together with any other available information as to the personal identity of such inmate.
